
MR. LAXTON: It gives me a great deal of pleasure to introduce to you the President of the Association, Chief Harry W. Schneider.

CHIEF MOISE: Thank you, Mr. President. It is a pleasure for me to welcome each and every one of you to our Sixtieth Annual Banquet. MR. LAXTON: Governor J. Joseph Garrahy could not be here to welcome you people this evening, but it gives me a great deal of pleasure to present to you a good friend, Dennis J. Roberts, the Attorney General of Rhode Island.

MR. ROBERTS: Thank you very much, Glenn, Father Foley, Chief Schneider. My good friend, our host Chief Mike Moise who I have known literally all my life.

One of my — I must say one of my proudest possessions is a picture of my son, who is now 12, when he was two, with my father who is a Past Fire Commissioner of the City of Providence, and my son wearing Mike Moise's Chief's hat on a fire truck, and that's one of the things we hold very proud in my house.

Distinguished guests at the head table, and ladies and gentlemen. MR. LAXTON: Never have so many people said they have had so great a time in the last four or five days. Providence is the capital of the greatest state. One of the reasons it is one of the greatest little cities is because of the fellow I am going to introduce to bring you greetings from the capital city of the State of Rhode Island, Mayor Buddy Cianci.

MAYOR CIANCI: Thank you very much, Glenn. Glenn is a news reporter for one of our local television stations, and I only wish he would say that every night at six o'clock when he goes on the air.

Now, the fire fighters in Providence anyway really have been like the nuns. They have been doing their job. 

JUDGE WEISBERGER: Mr. Toastmaster, distinguished President and President Elect, distinguished Fire Chiefs of New England, our Commissioner of Public Safety, ladies and gentlemen.

It is certainly with a great deal of pride that I come here to speak to you on this occasion of the Sixtieth Anniversary of the founding of the New England Fire Chiefs Association. I guess that fire fighters and their administrative chiefs are perhaps among the most universally admired of all public servants. There is no one so far as I know who holds a brief for fire and, as a consequence, you who protect the communities in which you reside against the devastating effects of fire, are looked upon with respect, admiration and genuine affection.

Now I, on the other hand, belong to a profession that people don't always view from that same vantage of admiration and respect. Lawyers as you know by virtue perhaps of the adversary system have always been rather controversial. I believe that in the days of Shakespeare one of the conspirators in one of Shakespeare's famous plays says: The first thing we do at the end of the revolution is kill all the lawyers.

Well, things have not changed. They have not changed. People are still talking in that same vein, and there is a story that goes around of a Pope who died, and upon the death of the Pope he went, as he probably expected, immediately to the gates of heaven. And he stood there. St. Peter said: Just a moment, your Holiness. We have another person who has to be processed first. And up walked, in fairly jaunty fashion, a lawyer. And the lawyer was processed and admitted; and afterward St. Peter said: All right, your Holiness, we'll take care of you now.

And the Pope said: Why is it that that lawyer was admitted ahead of me? And St. Peter said: Well, you know, your Holiness, Heaven is full of Popes, but this is the first lawyer that has come here in five hundred years. This is the kind of thing that happens.

Well, I noticed when they played "When Irish Eyes Are Smiling," a lot of you got up and danced, and therefore I am assuming there are a lot of you of Irish derivation.

Now, there is something that the Irish have had to say that is sort of analogous to this little story about lawyers. The Irish, as you know, are a very patriotic people, and on occasion they become very upset about perceived oppressors, particularly oppressors of the British derivation. And during the time of the troubles in Ireland, there was an organization called the Black and Tans who really were sent over to suppress the rebellion. They did a fine job from their point of view, but in so doing, they incurred the undying hatred of every patriotic Irish person, and the lady who is the heroine of my story was such a person.

She hated the Black and Tan with every fiber of her being. However, one day as she was crossing a wide street in Dublin, she stumbled on the cobblestone and fell. One of the ubiquitous members of the Black and Tan organization seeing her plight, rushed out, helped her to her feet and conducted her back once more to the safety of the sidewalk. She didn't know quite how to respond. She looked at him for a

moment and was speechless; but then she said this to him: Tis a fine gentleman you are and twas a very fine and noble thing that you just did for me, and do you know, sir, should there be a cool spot in hell, I hope you get it.

That's about the way we look at it.

Of course one thing about lawyers is their savoir faire, their ability to meet any situation regardless of its difficulty, regardless of its hopelessness, and to carry it out with extreme aplomb.

Now, have you ever thought about what savoir faire really means? It defies translation or description. And on one occasion there were three men sitting around in an international bar in the city of Hong Kong who were talking about the French phrase savoir faire and what its meaning truly was. One was an American, one was an Englishman and the third was a Frenchman.

The American, being somewhat brash as Americans tend to be, said: I know what savoir faire really means. Perhaps it is best to define it by way of illustration. If a man were to walk into his living room and find his wife in the arms of another man and he said, I beg your pardon, that would be savoir faire.

The Englishman looked at him with a bit of condescension and said: Well, of course you realize, you Americans are all somewhat barbaric, and I suppose that's your idea of what savoir faire really is; but to an Englishman, a cultured Englishman, if he were to arrive home suddenly from his office, unexpectedly, and were to walk into his living room and find his wife in the arms of another man, and he were to say, I beg your pardon. Go right ahead. That would be savoir faire.

The Frenchman looked at both and with an elaborate gallic shrug of the shoulders, he said: Messieurs, no one knows the meaning of savoir faire save a member of the French nation. To use the same illustration that you have, if a man were to come home from his office and he were suddenly to encounter his wife in the living room in the arms of another man and he were to say, I beg your pardon, go right ahead, and that man were to go right ahead, messieurs, that is savoir faire.

(Applause)

JUDGE WEISBERGER: Ladies and gentlemen, I don't want to prolong our discussion, otherwise I might run into the problem that was encountered by a member of the British bar who was addressing the Lord Justices of Appeal, and after speaking for the first hour on a very involved estate problem, and having gone over all of the elements of the estate, the intangible personal property, the real estate, all of the assets, he finally said: And me Lords, I now address myself to the furniture; and the Lord Chief Justice said: Sir, you have been addressing yourself to the furniture for the last half hour.

But my thought tonight was to talk to you about a fairly serious subject, and I know that you are very serious people indeed, because the work that you do is of such a serious life and death nature.

For three days last week I attended a meeting at the United States Naval War College in Newport called the Current Strategy Forum; and at that meeting we were

(603) 889-5181 told by the Chief of Naval Operations, by many high ranking officers of the Naval and Marine Service, by many individuals from the State Department, from the Department of Defense, just how critical our situation is, just how much the Russian Naval Forces have increased their potential in terms of a blue water navy, how they have outstripped us in the numbers of submarines, how they have begun to catch up in major capital ships, how they have begun to enable under their Chief of Naval Operations and Admiral Gorchkov to project power into remote portions of the globe.

Now, one thing that wasn't mentioned at the Current Strategy Forum, and I think perhaps it wasn't mentioned because it wasn't known to anyone who was there, was the fact that our Secretary of State was about to resign. I didn't hear about that until the day after this forum had ended, and even though we had any number of people from the State Department and the Department of Defense, there was not even a whisper of this rather unique and significant occurrence.

But indeed, ladies and gentlemen, we have lived during the past two decades in extremely perilous times. We have constantly been on the precipice where the unthinkable nuclear war was always in the background, always a possibility. Always something that we hoped and prayed would not happen; but always something that just might be there.

And in the year of grace 1982 as we see the Middle East erupt, as we see a battle in the Falkland Islands that no one would have thought could possibly occur, we sort of wonder on what a precarious balance world peace, our nation, and the civilized world depends.

And one of the problems of course is the fact that we have a crisis of confidence. We are not so sure as we once were that those in charge of government are worthy of our trust. I can recall, as many of you can, the situation just prior to World War II. Those were dismal days. Those were challenging days. But we had something then that I fear we don't have now.

We believed wholeheartedly and fully that the United States of America could not be beaten. We believed wholeheartedly and fully that our government and those who are in charge of our destiny were trustworthy and that they probably had our best interests at heart.

Now, this gave us a degree of confidence that pulled us through those dismal, challenging days; and now just as we look at this terrible international series of crises, what do the media show to us in order perhaps to make us feel good? They have an anniversary of Watergate. An anniversary of Watergate in which we are again treated to all of the terrible occasions that led to the resignation of a President of the United States. And what was the message of Watergate?

The message of Watergate of course was there was a President who could not be trusted, a President who lied to us, a President who covered up a rather tawdry minor criminal offense. But was there included in this anniversary message in such fashion as perhaps would allow us to perceive the deeper message of Watergate?

Just think of it for a moment. President Nixon, who was certainly the exponent of an imperial presidency, was ordered by a Federal District Judge to turn over certain tapes that he knew would lead inevitably to his political ruin.

President Nixon was the Commander in Chief of the Armed Forces of the United States. The Supreme Court of the United States was called upon to review the determination of the Federal District Judge in the Court of Appeals. Now, how do you think the Supreme Court of the United States or any Court enforces its decrees or judgments? Well, the United States system, they enforce them through Federal Marshals; and who do you think appoints the Federal Marshals? In each state the Federal Marshal is appointed by the President, and then the Federal Marshal appoints the Deputy Marshals. So here you had an individual who was in charge of all of the enforcement processes that could implement a judgment.

He knew that this judgment was a disaster to him, and yet he obeyed. He turned over the tapes that led inevitably to his disgrace and resignation. Where in the history of the civilized world has this ever occurred before? What would have happened had a similar judgment been rendered in Argentina? Oh, my! What would have happened in Chile or Venezuela or for that matter in India?

In India where Indira Gandhi will not swat a fly nor would she eat meat; but nevertheless when the Supreme Court of India decided something that Indira Gandhi found unpalatable — and I don't speak in the appetitive sense — but when she found it to be adverse to her interests as she perceived them, she suspended civil liberties.


So, we found that the advocate of an imperial presidency, a person who was not known for his altruism, a person who was not known for his, let us say, tendency toward self-abnegation, nevertheless had such respect for the supremacy of law, that he accepted ruin rather than to reject a decision of the Supreme Court of the United States.

I suggest to you, ladies and gentlemen, that that constituted a triumph of our legal and constitutional system; and rather than its being a crisis of confidence, it perhaps shows that our system, our liberties, our respect for the supremacy of law has developed such significant strength that it is able to go through the fires of the test and come out tempered, flexible and more durable than ever before.

And my message to you tonight in these perilous times in which we live is a simple one: That the United States of America, a magnificent experiment in freedom, personal dignity and liberty, is as vigorous, as strong, and as unassailable as ever it was. And I suggest to you that for all of our difficulties, for all of our shortcomings, for all of the mistakes that those in government have made, do make and will make, that we indeed are a fortunate people.

We are a fortunate people because though we are not under man, we are under God and under law, and so long as this continues to be our heritage, our future is



CHIEF BRENNAN: Brennan from Salem, Massachusetts. I would like to second that. I really, with inflation involved, I think it is only fair and just that he get this salary increase.

CHIEF CAPPELLI: Anyone else? The vote is on the Secretary's salary. Anybody make a motion?

FROM THE FLOOR: Chief Carle made the motion and Chief Brennan seconded the motion.

CHIEF CAPPELLI: All those in favor?

(Chorus of ayes)

CHIEF CAPPELLI: Opposed? Arthur, you have your raise, which he deserves. He was the unsung hero last night. Everybody was announced. He should have been announced because he does all the work. Believe me, I know he is going to do a lot for me.

CHIEF CARLE: Chief Terry Carle from Dracut. I move that the Treasurer's salary be set at \$1,750.

CHIEF BRENNAN: Brennan from Salem. The same reasoning and rationale goes into my seconding the increase for this position as it did for the previous motion.

CHIEF CAPPELLI: All those in favor say aye.

(Chorus of ayes)

CHIEF CAPPELLI: Opposed? The ayes have it. So voted.

Announcement of the 1985 Conference Site.

CHIEF GAUDET: Site selection for 1985. On the first ballot, Dunfey's, Hyannis, Massachusetts received 43 votes. Marriott, Providence, Rhode Island received 33 votes. The Village at Smuggler's Notch, Jefferson, Vermont, received 16 votes. Mount Washington Hotel at Bretton Woods received two votes. The Wentworth-by-the-Sea at Portsmouth, New Hampshire, received three votes and Raddison Ferncroft in Danvers, Massachusetts received one vote.

Ballots cast were 107. Needed for selection was 55. No site received the required number of votes, so a second ballot was needed.

The second ballot: Dunfey's, Hyannis, received 67 votes. The Marriott, Providence, Rhode Island, received 58 votes. Ballots cast, 125.

So therefore, Dunfey's received the required number of votes for the 1985 Conference.

CHIEF PALUMBO: Charles Palumbo, Chief of Needham Fire Department. Through the closeness of the vote, I am speaking for myself right now, I was just wondering if the Board of Directors will look into Hyannis after our next meeting there, which will be our first one after this one, if we would look into it. If it doesn't meet our expectations, report back to us and see if we can come back to Providence, because I think Mike Moise and his department did one hell of a job. I think he deserves it, if possible, and the membership agrees to this.

CHIEF GAUDET: I appreciate what you just said, Chief, but I think we have to understand that once I announce to those who made proposals for our 1985 contract, I have to sign a contract. That commitment has to be made.

Now, if the people here, I don't know what the process would be because the vote was taken under the way the Bylaws are written, but within two weeks from the time that I leave here, I will be signing an official contract with Dunfey's; so I don't know what to say at this point in time; but I just want to make that point very, very clear. It isn't that easy to just say let's look it over and see what happens. They will send me a contract, and once I initial that contract, we have a commitment. For whatever it is worth.

CHIEF PALUMBO: Mr. Secretary, I say you go ahead and sign the contract unless some of the other members would like to follow this through.

CHIEF CAPPELLI: Jim.

CHIEF GROTE: I would like to say just a few words. I believe the reception and that welcome feeling — I have no particular axe to grind — You know I am your old great granddad and for what this man sitting right here in front has done, if this vote was taken this morning, Mr. President, I think we would find a different result.

I don't believe there is an individual that is going to leave this convention, and I was one of them this morning. I got a little upset. They were charging me \$70 more, but old Jim Grote was in there fighting, so he didn't pay the extra \$70. He paid what was due; but I am leaving here with the greatest feeling because our neighbors of Rhode Island have given us the best; and if there is anyone can dare — and don't you go up in the cemetery and dig up somebody — because you know I have given you 60 years out of 70 years that I have been in the game, and I have been all over the country, Canada, I did sneak into Mexico, down into San Antonio to see how they live there, but I would like to say again, Mr. President, that I believe if we took the vote this morning, it would be a little different.

But with all due respect, I am a law abiding citizen. That's the rules and regulations. We must live in and abide by them by all means. That's my feeling.

CHIEF LAMSON: Lamson from Hamilton. Along the same line, I think that this system of picking the site for these conferences has not proved to be the best as it was expected, and some thought should be given to a change in the Bylaws where the decision for the site should be left to the Board of Directors.

We elect Directors to the Board of Directors. We have confidence in those men, and I think they should have the authority and the prerogative to pick the site and the membership should live by it, whether they like it or not.

If the Board of Directors say in 1984-85, we are going to meet at a certain place, they have looked into it. They are men of character. They know what they want. We elect them. If we don't like their decision, throw it out; but I think they should have the decision-making process. If there is some way the Bylaws can be amended or changed, if it is in the Bylaws this way now, I still feel that it should be their prerogative to pick the site, and we would be happy to live by it; and I am sure they would have made a wise decision.

CHIEF CAPPELLI: Jack.

CHIEF MANCHESTER: John Manchester, Tiverton. I appreciate what everybody here is saying. I think we can all understand. We know there is at least 58 disappointed people here right now or at least voted yesterday. This is understandable; but 67 wanted to go to Hyannis. Whether we like it or dislike it, this is the democratic way. This body has spoken. Period.

CHIEF CAPPELLI: Probably so, if they voted this morning, we would probably be different. I worked with Mike and I know the work he did himself; but the body voted on it, and I guess that's the way it has got to be.

FROM THE FLOOR: Mr. President, might I suggest when we go to Dunfey's next year we'll have now a comparison to make, and probably the vote next year, I am sure Hyannis, I mean Marriott will be making a proposal for 1986, and I think the valuation that we make will be next year as to what Dunfey's gives us next year and what Marriott gave us this year, and decide just where we want to go in 1986.

CHIEF CAPPELLI: We can consider that.

CHIEF CARLE: Mr. President, I think possibly before we vote in the future, maybe a recommendation by the board such as Chief Panerton spoke, that you people in the background, you know what is going on. You know the facilities. You know what to do, the committees and all; and if the Board of Directors could make a recommendation to the membership before they vote, some people don't know which way is what, this might help the organization for the future.

CHIEF BRENNAN: Mr. President, Chief Brennan from Salem. I whole-heartedly agree with all the speakers in their rationale and having walked the road that Arthur is about to travel, I think I can say with some expertise, I was Secretary-Treasurer when we first went to Hyannis and the cooperation was nil there. We had to find our own way and do our own thing.

The hospitality that we have received at the Marriott here in Providence has been outstanding. He is going to meet with the people in Hyannis and find out just what they are offering. The first year that we were designated to go there, they wanted us to rent the exhibit space from them for more money than we were renting it to the exhibitors. That was the only time that that was ever done. We finally convinced them that we couldn't do it that way. If they wanted to rent the space, we would have to get released from our commitment.

Arthur will undoubtedly find out what they are going to give us before he signs that contract for that third year. I think we made a mistake. I know I made a

mistake. I didn't have enough time to think. If I had gone back and discussed the problem, I wouldn't have voted the way I did yesterday. I voted for Hyannis. I think it is wrong to lock ourselves in for three years; and if I had to vote today, I certainly would vote for the Marriott.

Arthur has got some work to do. There is a possibility that they won't meet our requirements; and if not, I think it should be up to the Board of Directors to make a decision in that regard.

CHIEF MOISE: Mr. President, I think in view of the alleged problem here, if you want to consider that, that we should leave it in the democratic process the way it was. If in the event that as Chief Brennan has said, it does not meet our requirements, then if it is in accordance with the Bylaws, the Board of Directors should select the site. If not, we should have a motion here that would permit them to go to whichever place they would like to go. I don't know how it is set up in the Bylaws.

CHIEF BRENNAN: Mr. President, it is already in there. If unforeseen circumstances exist, the Directors can choose a site.

CHIEF GAUDET: That's how we got to come here this year, because we were committed to the Wentworth until they decided to close the hotel, and that's when we made the change, the Board of Directors made a change at the last Annual Meeting.

CHIEF MOISE: I would just like to add one other thing, and it is in behalf of the fellows, please, not me, I may not even be here; but I think the extension of this hotel, and they outdid themselves. I have never been, and Jim Grote can probably attest to this, I don't think he has ever been to a conference where at breakfast in the morning you had a choice of an omelet, sunnyside, over light, medium, any way you want it. I have never seen that. Just a small little thing, but it was that extra thing, and I know working with the personnel and the management of the hotel has been just super; but at any rate, I am just going to leave it at that because I think if it is possible to do that, whatever vote is necessary, a motion should be in order.

CHIEF GAUDET: If I could, I would like to make a couple of comments because probably a lot of people don't realize just what happens in preparing one of these conferences.

Last year when Wentworth out of the blue decided that under new management that the dates were not going to be available, you can understand the situation that we were in. Here we were having, supposedly going to have our Sixtieth Annual Conference with no site. And through the efforts of Mike and some other people, we were fortunate enough to have these dates available at the Marriott in Providence.

And let me say this, that it was a new experience for them, and as my first official full year as Secretary to come down to a new hotel and work with them very, very closely, let me say this right from the start: their cooperation and help has been outstanding. I made about eight trips to this hotel since our last Annual Conference in preparing this conference. I have probably talked to them on the phone 25 to 40

times during that year. And let me say this, that anything that I brought up, anything that was discussed, everything, the itinerary from day to day was everything that we wanted or we asked for was considered; and I think that realistically we got one of the best deals we ever got and probably we'll never get another deal like we got at the Marriott Hotel.

The cost per day here, you will probably never see again. I don't think anybody here can complain about the food that they got here. Sure, like everything else, when you have a large group, there are problems. I'm not saying that there weren't; but I think overall everybody here has to appreciate what Providence, the city of Providence, has done, and what the Marriott has done for us, and that is my own personal opinion working with these people throughout the year. CHIEF CAPPELLI: We can't do anything about that. Yes, John.

FROM THE FLOOR: If I could mention just one thing, possibly food for thought, I am sorry, Mike, when you got up before, I meant to congratulate you and your department for what you have done. It has really been fantastic.

minutes would have been valuable to anybody when they had voted for our next date. If the Board of Directors could meet prior to the voting and let the individual State Directors make these factors known to the individual states about the cooperation they have received, charged extra, so forth and so on, this is all good information for all of us to know before we vote for a site.

CHIEF HUGHES: You can ask Jim Brennan probably easier than Arthur, but is there a minimum number of rooms that we have to use at Dunfey's in order to get to use space like this without any charges? So there is no one in this whole service that has completed his 91st birthday and has completed 70 years in the fire service, and I average about 50 hours a week. I know I put some of my own family at shame when they say: Hey, Dad, I put in 36-40 hours. I put in a week. They are just scratching the surface; but I love it. I love to do it.

No one in this whole world, and I mean that, man or woman, could ask and receive what old Chief Jim Grote has received. And I give it all back to each and every one of you. I come here in Rhode Island, warm, close. You thought I was running as President of the United States. I don't want to take his place. He has his hands full. I can take care of things back in Connecticut. But nevertheless that's why I feel Chief Mike, for all that you have done for me now, and I hope for many more. As you know, they put a new motor in the old Chief back in November in St. Mary's Hospital in Waterbury, and well, Grote, you are good for another 50 years; but fortunately the fire service was at my side with all that.

I have a record of 21 priests and a Bishop come in to see me, three Congregational ministers and a Baptist. And when the head nun says to me: Who are you? I said, my good Sister, my name is James L. Grote. My initials are J. L. G. Just a little guy.

So I must tell you, this is the gospel truth, the fire service night and day was at my side. What can we do for you? That meant something to me. So the next morning I


