

CHIEF CAPPELLI: Thank you, Chief. One more welcome, Chief Michael Moise from the Providence Fire Department.

ADDRESS OF WELCOME

CHIEF MOISE: Thank you, Chief Cappelli. Reverend clergy, distinguished officers of the New England Association, ladies and gentlemen. On behalf of Chief Cappelli who asked me back at Anthony's Pier 4 to do the welcoming address, and of which I completely forgot until I was sitting in the establishment on the lower level and former Captain Bob Farrell of the New York City Fire Department and Engine 82 looked at the program and said: Oh, you're speaking. I said: I am? Yes, you are. So here I am.

But on behalf of Chief Cappelli who, as you know, is a man of very few words, so I will emulate him and also be of very few words. Seriously, the conferences, of which this is the 61st, and of which our good friend Chief Jim Grote has attended every single one since they began and is with us for the 61st this evening and can tell you many stories I'm sure, but on the conference note, I can say from my own personal experience, and I believe that many of you can, many of you Chiefs can relate the same information that we have gained. We have been able to bring new ideas into our departments, and most particularly during these challenging times of budgetary constraints, of union problems, of consolidation, of contractual services and all of those challenges — and I say challenges very advisedly — because that's what they are, but the most important challenge we have is to protect the communities in which we live and to which we are responsible for their safety.

And it is on that note that we gain from these conferences those important things to help us better do our job. The innovations I speak about, for example, in my own department, jaws of life. I never heard of that thing. Went to a conference, found out that we could get federal monies. We were the first in the state to acquire the jaws of life. At another conference I spoke with a good friend chief, found out that the city of New York had some spare fire apparatus, surplus fire apparatus, and immediately ventured to obtain that apparatus which many of you have seen.

The refurbishing of equipment, I thought back in the old days in the service when I used to see World War II vintage airplanes fly, I said: Now, how can this be? And that comes from refurbishing the aircraft, rebuilding. I know this is not good news to vendors, but we have to be innovative in our own cities to attempt to curtail and cut down yet still do the job, and that's where it becomes most important.

So with that, with the program that we have in store for you which I believe is of an extremely informative nature, you will have the superintendent of the National Fire Academy in the morning followed by some notions and ideas and experiences with the contractual fire service, followed by security measures and various establishments, followed by a very important topic, the computerization of the fire service.

I was separated from him. Separation gives concern to us all through life, and when we die, when we are separated physically from this life, we cry because we feel deeply that separation; but the Apostle Paul tells us that we are never really separated from one another in God. He said: "Who shall separate us from the love of God? Shall tribulation or distress or persecution or famine or nakedness or peril or sword?"

MR. PETROSINELLI: Thank you very much, Ellen. We all know the purpose and know the fire fighters are always in there helping, and we thank you very much.

MS. TUTTLE: Thank you.

MR. PETROSINELLI: Thank you, Ellen.

Ladies and gentlemen, at this time I would like to call on our guest speaker. First I'd like to say a few things about him. Talk a little louder the chap says. Chief, if I get any closer to this mike, I'll be eating it.

First thing before I talk about the guest speaker, I want to say one thing. I'm looking at all the faces out here this evening, and after the party last night, I am surprised to see this many here. I heard it was a heck of a time. I was there for a little while, but I couldn't last too long. I had to get back, but some of the faces I see around here, I don't know if you are here in body or spirit or just what it is. You stood up pretty good anyway. I can say that.

Our speaker, guest speaker for this evening, is Chief William P. Tocco, Junior, Chief of the town of Johnston in the capacity as Chief of Police. Chief Tocco entered the realm of police in 1952 where he served as the assistant detective commander. He is a graduate of the FBI Academy, was President of the Rhode Island Police Chiefs and a member and coordinator of many, many committees. I really have so much to say about him I could be up here a while too. He is quite a guy. We all get along good, very good in our town. We work very close. He works very close with my Chief and my department and my division, and we really work close.


At this time, ladies and gentlemen, it gives me great pleasure to introduce to you Chief William P. Tocco, Junior.

(Applause)

CHIEF TOCCO: Thank you very much, Captain Petrosinelli. Chief Cappelli, his lovely wife Ann, our incoming chief, the new President Chief Foss, Father Foley, Reverend Hood, other distinguished guests at the head table, ladies and gentlemen. It's got to be the strangest thing in the world to have a Police Chief talking to several hundred Fire Chiefs. You probably wonder why I'm here. Is there anybody else that can put up with Chief Cappelli other than myself?

You know, I was in the VIP room and I met Chief Grote, and he said: Chief, do you have any idea how old I am? I said: You're about 62. He turned out to be 92. I don't know of a chief in all of New England or the United States, a Police Chief who is alive at 92. There has got to be something good about being a Fire Chief, so I decided that after this conference here, I am going back to see Mayor Russo, and I plan on switching jobs with Ace Cappelli. I want to live to be 92.

With all seriousness, I had thought what I'd speak to you people about this evening and I thought about talking about the death penalty. I said: No, they won't be interested in that. I thought about talking about standards and goals which many



of your agencies are looking towards now with your fire science academy. I said: They're not going to be interested in that. I thought about talking about what's coming down the road or may come down the road, that's the coordination of fire and police services. It is being talked about. I understand you people had a workshop yesterday. It happens to be that I chair the Commission on Police Officer Standards and Training in Rhode Island, and we supervise the training of all police officers in the state of Rhode Island outside of the Providence Police Department and the State Police, and it has been an issue for discussion whether it is going to happen. I really don't know.

I really believe at this time that most of the Fire Chiefs would feel that they want the autonomy of being a Fire Chief, training their personnel the way they want to train them, handle them the way they want to handle them, and be a Fire Chief and not a Police and a Fire Chief; and I think to be honest with you, I'm under the same impression. I believe that although we are all dedicated to public safety, I believe that we should be specialists in our fields, and I think that it will be talked about, but I really don't see it coming down the road where it is coming to be a reality.

Another thing I wanted to talk to you about is something that some of the chiefs noticed in the VIP room, and we talked about it, and it is the fact that Chief Cappelli and I work very closely. I don't think there is any greater degree of strength in a community than when a Police and a Fire Chief can work together, respect one another, and be good friends, because I think the basis of any community, the foundation of any good community today is public safety, and that's police and fire and that's what a community is judged upon.

You drive through a community and you go by a police officer standing there and you look at that individual and that's how you judge the town. And when you go by the fire station, you see personnel there and equipment, and that's how you judge a fire department; and I think as Chiefs we are very critical of what we see. We are not too constructive. We kind of say, you know, our department doesn't do that. Our department does it this way. We have got a good department and then if you like what you see, you say: This has got to be a good city or a good town.

I have had the fortune of being a friend of Chief Cappelli for the last 12 years. There was a political change in our town and we both came to our positions. We're part of a political process, the American democracy, and together we established a bond, and we said that we would try to make Johnston the best town in the United States. I think as chiefs we all dedicate ourselves to that. That's something that we hope that we'll see before we leave our positions.

Well, I want to tell you something. We have had war in Johnston. We have had war with the unions, and I'm proud to report that Chief Cappelli's batting average is zero for winning any arbitration or any Superior Court action, and I want you to know that Chief Tocco, who is talking to you, his average is zero. We have not won between the both of us one arbitration or we have not won an appeal to a Superior Court on any case that we have brought against our personnel, and the cases the personnel have brought against us, they have been very successful.

Well, how do you survive? I call Chief Cappelli and I say: Ace, have you got a few minutes? I'll be down to talk to you. Or he will call me and say: Bill, you got a few minutes? I want to come up and talk to you. And we talk about where we are and where we're going in the area of public safety. We know that unions are strong. We know that unions are not always in the best interests of our communities. We know there are individuals who are at the leadership of the unions and their whole attempt is to erode the integrity of our departments. It is also to put them on the same level as the Chief of Police or a Fire Chief.

Well, Ace and I have had a bond that no matter what happens, we are committed to the people in our town. We share our equipment. I have been very generous. I have given him about six automobiles.

(Laughter)

They are secondhand cars, but I finally got a new one a couple of years ago, but Captain Petrosinelli comes up and looks at the fleet, sees what we have, and then he goes to his Chief and I get a call. Gee, you know you have that car hanging around. It hasn't been used in two days. Can we have it?

Well, Ace and the Captain could always have whatever we have. We go down and we pick up surplus equipment and we have exchanged it. We have shared our printing press for the printing of some equipment, some paraphernalia. We have pooled our resources. We have a plan like all of you people in case of a catastrophy, and this is important because I realize that the Fire Department is the greatest asset the Police Department has. When you can develop a personal relationship and a professional relationship with the Fire Chief as I have, then I consider myself a very successful Chief. That's very important to me. I think that what it becomes is a partnership, a partnership and a reality that we must work together.

(Applause)

Well, what I really want to say is this. First of all I'd like to thank you very much, Chief Cappelli. I thank you very much for being invited here to speak for you and to speak to this very distinguished organization. I notice that you people are like us. We can't call them conventions any more. We have to call them conferences. But it is really a sincere blessing that God has bestowed upon us when we can all be here with one another, we can celebrate our friendship, we can celebrate the fact that we are professional people, that we are dedicated to the communities, the cities and the towns for which we represent, and I think the cities and towns are very fortunate to have you people as their Fire Chiefs.

To those Fire Chiefs who have been retired, I salute you. You stand as very proud individuals, gentlemen of great integrity. To the incoming officers, I wish you the best of luck this year. To the outgoing officers and especially to my good friend Chief Ace Cappelli, you did a super job. Your peers speak highly of you and there is no greater respect, there is no greater compliment that one can receive than to be admired and to be respected by his peers.



MR. PETROSINELLI: Thank you, Chief Tocco.

Ladies and gentlemen, this afternoon my Chief Cappelli said to me. He said: Come on, Al, we're going up to room 436, he said, Freddy and Tony are there, and we are just going to go up for a few minutes; and he said: tonight I'm going to speak very little, very short. I don't want to speak. That's it. Thirty second speech. Well, believe me, if you were up at that room this afternoon, he talked for five hours. My God, we never got out of there. So I hope he talks a little longer than thirty seconds. At this time, ladies and gentlemen, I would like to call on my boss and my close friend Chief Angelo Cappelli.





Once again it is a privilege for me to serve as Chairman of the Reservations Committee and hereby respectfully submit the report for the 61st Annual Conference at Dunfey's Hyannis Hotel, Hyannis, Massachusetts.

On March 14, 1983 over 1400 reservation forms were mailed to members and exhibitors by our Secretary-Treasurer. The deadline for room reservations was June 3rd, however, at my request, the management extended the deadline to June 11, because reservation forms were slow in coming in. The management reserved a block of 150 rooms and 7 parlors for our Conference.

On May 16, 55 double rooms and 7 parlors were reserved. On June 6, 90 rooms and 7 parlors were reserved. On June 17, 120 rooms and 7 parlors were reserved.

With only the seven parlors (hospitality rooms) in the hotel, the management consented to rearrange the furniture in some adjoining rooms into suites and thereby accommodating these people.

On Sunday, June 26, 230 persons were checked into the hotel. On Monday, June 27th, 233 persons were checked into the hotel. On Tuesday, June 28, 199 persons were checked into the hotel.

CHIEF FOSS: Declare it a vote.

Announcement of 1986 Conference Site. Voted on, I think we are going to Providence.

CHIEF GAUDET: I think everybody is aware by now that the 1986 conference will be held at the Providence Marriott Inn. That is the same hotel in which the 1982 conference was held. The first vote that was taken, a 51 percent majority was not received when different hotels were presented for consideration. On the second vote the runoff between Dunfey's Hyannis and the Marriott, the Marriott I believe received 80 votes, and I think Dunfey's Hyannis received 51 votes, so that's where the 1986 conference will be held.

CHIEF FOSS: Any old business?

No old business. If not, we go on to new business.

NEW BUSINESS

CHIEF GAUDET: Gentlemen, I have got a suggestion that I brought up to the Board of Directors at our May meeting, and I would like to bring it up this morning for your thoughts and consideration; and in order to do this, talking to our parliamentarian Mert Dyer, it would take a Bylaw change.

As you well know, each and every year through the Bylaw setup that the conference is voted on by the membership, which I think is a democratic way to go; but as we negotiate with these hotels, once they hear our decision that the membership has decided to go here or there, the negotiating process is kind of lost, and I'll tell you the simple reason why. That once this is established, nobody on the Board of Directors, the Secretary or anybody else really can sit down to be hard nosed with them, and that's what it is all about, to sit down with these people and say: What can you give us and what our needs are and what is the best deal we can make for the Association.

And just for an example was that when I received from corporate headquarters a call probably four weeks ago from the Parker House in Boston from Marie Stack, who is head of sales for the Dunfey Corporation, she said that she was putting together the 1986 proposal, and I related to her that I was very, very disappointed on the number of rooms that had been reserved at Dunfey's this year, and I felt that for a successful conference, it is important that the membership stay in the hotel in which the conference is held. I think that is what makes a successful conference. And from the information I had at that particular time, I was really disturbed because I felt that I had known a lot of other chiefs had made arrangements, simply economics, in other facilities which Hyannis has to offer. But I think that this leads to kind of separation of really what the conference is for. It is for everybody to get together and to participate not only in the events of every day but the social part of it and everything else.

I think that's what makes a successful conference, and I said to her that the membership was very disappointed on the rate we had for 1983. I said I was disappointed. I said: I have talked with some professional people who do this

nationwide, they feel that the rate could have been a much better rate, that they weren't really being competitive. She was somewhat disturbed. In fact she was so disturbed, she said: I will get back to you shortly; and I felt shortly, within a couple of days. I received a call within ten minutes from the time I talked to her originally back to my office. And she says: We have re-evaluated what you had told me previously, a few minutes ago on the phone, and we are going to reduce the 1984 rates by \$4.50 per day double occupancy and \$6 per day for a single.

I know it is not considerable, but right then and there it showed to me that they could have done better for 1983 and they didn't; and I think that now they become complacent that the membership has voted, which I think I have no problems with that, but I think my own personal opinion is that a Bylaw, consideration of a Bylaw change, and that the responsibility be given to the Board of Directors and that we now become a negotiating team for whoever it may be to go in and say for 1986 or whatever, what can you do for us? What is the best deal? What is the most advantageous place for the Association to hold its conference where we can get exhibit space and all the particulars in which we need to serve in the best interests of the Association; and I'm only putting this out there, this is my own personal feelings after dealing with these hotels for the last three years that I think that we have to definitely look at making a change and see if we can do something better for the Association. This is my thoughts on that, gentlemen, and I am only putting it out for discussion.

CHIEF FOSS: We have discussion on this?

CHIEF TWEED: Chief John Tweed, Branford, Connecticut, gentlemen, at our caucus meeting this was brought up and it was the unanimous opinion of the Connecticut group that a step be made as Arthur has presented it to give it to the Board of Directors. Now, there is a good many of us here that would have liked to have stayed here, but they don't want to be tied into a package. They bring their family because they want to travel, want to go see different things. They are willling to eat breakfast here, but they want their lunch and dinner free and would be willing to doing a package deal like a banquet ticket, and I think we have outgrown picking a site, and then they have the site. I think we have to reverse it. You people elect us. It is your choice to put us in, and I think you have to have the confidence in the Board of Directors and the Presidents to let them make a decision and pick this site.

I think it will be better for all of us. We are in a money pinch and these people aren't doing what they did in business a few years ago, and I know from experience that there are professionals in this business that put these things together, and they get some terrific packages, and I think this ought to be returned to the Board of Directors and your President to handle this type of a situation. Thank you.

CHIEF FOSS: Mert, could you give a little information on whether a vote could be taken this morning or whether it is going to be delayed a year or two years down the road?

CHIEF DYER: Merton Dyer, Peterboro. I think that the appropriate thing now is to have some motion before the floor before the discussion goes on too much

further. Arthur has presented an idea. A Bylaw change would be required. It cannot be taken this morning. It requires prior notice. It can be presented at next year's conference and it can be presented in such a way that it would take effect immediately, and whatever the Bylaw change said, you could then implement next year on the 1987 conference; but I think right now there should be a motion made so that we have some direction to discuss it and somewhere to go. I think Mike Moise had a motion.

CHIEF McCABE: In our Massachusetts caucus we discussed the various ramifications and there is many other things that should be considered in addition to the cost element. I think there was some discussion whether or not we should go back to a four-day conference. I think the idea that John put forward is that what should the whole package be? Do we need all the meals tied in? Can we give ourselves more flexibility? As a result of that, I put together a motion which I would like to submit, if I could. I would like to make a motion that the President appoint a Subcommittee of Directors to investigate and develop a position paper to develop the various aspects of our Annual Conference to determine how the Association can best serve the needs of its members and the goals and objectives of the Association, the said Committee to submit their recommendations to the full Board at the Directors' meeting in October, and the full Board make the arrangements for Bylaw amendments as needed at our Conference in 1984.

CHIEF FALLON: Chief Fallon, Brookline, I second that motion.

CHIEF FOSS: You heard the motion, gentlemen, any more discussion on this before we take a vote on it?

CHIEF DYER: Mr. President, I think the motion is fine and if we are in a discussion period, I think this is the period where some people that have ideas that might be passed on to the Board of Directors for their consideration should make them, and I have a couple of ideas.

I still feel that the membership should have some choice or some activity in selecting the site. It is possible that the top two sites, the two sites receiving the two most number of votes will be the two that the Directors will consider to negotiate with. This gives the membership an opportunity to still express their view of where they might like to go.

Another thing might be considered, this conference has always been held at this time, with the exception of about 1940 when it was held in August in connection with the International. If it was held possibly the early part of June we might get off season rates. There are a couple of thoughts that I had that might be of interest to the Directors.

CHIEF FOSS: Mike.

CHIEF MOISE: Mr. President, one of the things that I think in my opinion should positively be considered in this resolution, or I will make a separate resolution for it is this, as we have a Committee formed by this motion that this Committee also positively study the feasibility of going back to a four-day conference.

Now my reasons for this are a couple fold. No. 1, I have been Program Chairman for some time. I have been on the Program Committee. It is pretty damn difficult to squash into a day and a half actually a program that's worthwhile. This is the reason, one of the prime reasons we are coming to this conference, to learn and to get an exchange of ideas. That's one reason.

Secondly, the other part of it is the fact that I think as you look around, and this particular conference there are many people out there at other hotels, and the reason very basically, is very aptly put, is economics. I feel if we can eliminate all of the meals except the banquet in the package, most people I think have no qualm about going in to get a hotdog out here or whatever it may be and also they have some qualm about rushing to get this meal and rushing to get that and rushing to get here.

So in all of this say No. 1, we extend this thing for four days, at least the feasibility of extending it for four days. There may be some reasons that I don't see right now, but the feasibility of extending it to a four-day conference; and secondly, it be, I don't know what kind of a package, your meals or whatever the hell it is, but a package that does not include the meals. The meals I believe are extremely costly and the cost of those meals will take care of the day following, the fourth day that we're looking for.

With that I will leave that, provided that can be included in this motion. If not, I will make a separate motion related to the four-day plan.

CHIEF FOSS: I believe if we go according to parliamentary law that would have to be an amendment to Leo's motion.

CHIEF MOISE: I think he was very general. I am clarifying a particular motion.

CHIEF FOSS: His motion was made and seconded, am I right, Mert? Leo's motion was made and seconded, anything now would have to be an amendment to Leo's motion?

I would be more than happy to negotiate that.

My thoughts on this, I agree with some of the thoughts that Mike had. I would personally like to see the breakfast stay into the package deal because there are a lot of workers, and you don't want to be running downtown or if we're in Providence you have to go downtown or pay for it. Sometimes the hotel is an expensive thing. Personally I'd like to see the meals eliminated except the banquet, but keep the breakfast.

As far as going to a four day, when Mike approached me on this, I canvassed the exhibitors, and I have to say it is about a split difference on all the exhibitors. Some didn't care, others felt that a day and a half exposure was enough. The exhibitors that have a great amount of equipment to set up, and there was quite a few of them out there, they said they would like another day because they do an awful lot of work setting up their booth and Sunday afternoon is mostly a setup day. Monday is the biggest day that they have the exposure and Tuesday morning also and of course you notice, Tuesday afternoon everybody starts bailing out of here, and that's the way it has been. So the exhibitors are on the fence as to whether they want to go a four-day deal here.

The other thing that I would like the directors or whoever is going to be eventually considering this issue, I don't think voting for the conference site the way it is done now is right because you go down there and they list five hotels or some hotel sends in a proposal. Nobody has gone to the hotel to know what the hell the space is. You have to have exhibit space and we're going to lose our shirts at the Marriott. I can only get about 40 booths in there and they have to be out of there for the banquet. I know it is a nice hotel for a social, but it is lousy for exhibitors, so you have got to have people that investigate the hotels and make sure that we can hold a conference the way we are used to holding it; and your exhibits are your money makers, along with the other things, but they are the money makers, and everything we made this year which is going to be a good thing, we are going to lose it in Providence. We are going to spend it. That's my thoughts on it.

CHIEF HOPKINS: Chief Edward Hopkins. We discussed this in Vermont. We discussed this at our caucus and we go along with the four day, and we also, one of the thoughts we had was to go from state to state, that each director would have it in his state. That this would give a chance to strengthen the organization. You have about 2500 Chiefs in New England, I believe, if my figures are correct, and you don't have too many here, so this would give an opportunity for many people to come and participate in the conference. It is just a thought we would like to give the directors.

CHIEF FOSS: Mike, one of the things I might bring up, would it be, where we have eliminated the Tuesday afternoon, if we had a conference Tuesday afternoon, would that help you?

CHIEF MOISE: What we did as far as the Program Committee, we established the program to go a day and the morning of Tuesday, so the afternoon of Tuesday could be totally dedicated to the exhibitors in addition to the other time; and unfortunately we had a rain out, and as Ed just pointed out, they start to break up at that time, so we were just shuffling the proverbial stuff against the tide; so I think that we have to look at this from that standpoint. I don't think that half day makes a difference.

CHIEF GAUDET: On June 13 I received the following letter, New England Association of Fire Chiefs, addressed to me.

Dear Chief Gaudet:

On May 7, 1983 an accident occurred touching the lives of many people. Jon G. Manchester, Fire Chief in the town of Tiverton, Rhode Island, was killed in a recreational accident. A great deal can be said for this man whose accomplishments since being appointed Fire Chief in June 1977 were many. Chief Manchester was a member of the International Association of Fire Chiefs, the New England Association of Fire Chiefs and the Rhode Island Association of Fire Chiefs. He was Chairman of the Newport County Fire Chiefs Organization, and had been appointed to the Ambulance Service Coordinating Board of Rhode Island by Governor J. Joseph Garrahy. Chief Manchester had also completed an arson prevention course offered by the Rhode Island Division of Fire Safety, and various seminars offered by the National Fire Protectors Association. He received the Patriotism award of the Father Joseph B. Donahue Assembly, Knights of Columbus, and was to receive the Distinguished Service Award for Unselfish Devotion from the Father J. Boehr Council, Knights of Columbus on June 16. The award was made posthumously to his wife. Recently he was working very closely with other firemen to have passed through legislation a bill which would restrict the use of unvented space heaters, a bill which could potentially save the lives of many Rhode Islanders.

Besides being the Chief of the Tiverton Fire Department, Jon was also a devoted family man, and a great provider for his wife Karen J. Manchester and son Jason G. Manchester. To continue support for Jon's family, a committee has been organized for their benefit, specifically for benefit of his son.

The purpose of the committee is to collect funds which will be put into a custodial account in care of Karen J. Manchester to be used at her discretion for the support, maintenance, health and education of Jason, or to meet any emergency such as illness or accident which may befall him.

We will appreciate greatly any support that you can provide us regarding this situation, and we know that Karen and Jason will also appreciate your kindness.

I have a personal opinion, if someone I think probably would make a motion that it would be referred to the Board of Directors, I think that the Board of Directors would do something appropriate to help this situation here.

CHIEF BURNS: Chief Burns from Middletown, so moved.

CHIEF MODANOS: Chief Modanos, seconded.

CHIEF FOSS: This is going to be referred to the directors. Gentlemen, do you have a vote on this now?

CHIEF GAUDET: Refer to the Board of Directors to determine what will be given.

CHIEF FOSS: Can we have a vote on this, gentlemen? All those in favor say aye.

CHIEF MOISE: Mr. President, going back, not to the motion but to the point that Art mentioned, that he could do what I suggested next year, has anything been done on that? I don't think so.

CHIEF GAUDET: What's that?

CHIEF MOISE: On the idea of the meals, how can that be worked out? My reason for asking is this again. Number 1, the spread of people around the different other hotels, and as you say, it is better to have them in the one hotel for a better conference, no question. The meals that we had here, I am sure there were many complaints with them. I heard them and the price was a little bit high. Now, if that, some portion, whether breakfast did go, fine, no problem, but that might reduce the overall price to attract the other people here.

CHIEF GAUDET: Let me say this. That I have to agree with Chief Moise that the meal prices to me are extravagant because they figure tax, the gratuities, everything is figured in, and like I said, even the banquet tickets were supposed to be more than 20, and I said no way. Twenty was the absolute top. They wanted 21.75 and I said: No way. If you can't serve that meal for \$20, then we might as well pack it in; but the original cost for the banquet ticket was going to be 21.75, and I said: No way.

So, you know, I know what's happening and I am just trying to relay this information to you. And when you pay \$17.50 or \$20.00 for a turkey dinner and you can go down the street and get the same thing for maybe \$10, then you know that we have got a problem and there is no way when the package is established.

See, the problem is I come down here in February with Chief Creighton and we meet with the head man of the hotel here, and at that meeting we decide what the

We spend probably a four-hour meeting and trying to get all the particulars together, and before I leave, and for what I was here in February, it becomes very difficult. You sit there and you look at these menus and you say: How can we satisfy everybody? It is very difficult. You try to satisfy the majority, hopefully, but Monday night half of that dining room was empty because people paid for that dinner and they didn't serve half the dinners up there. In fact the management said they had something like a hundred dinners that weren't served, okay? They were paid for by people who registered in this hotel.

So it is a definite problem, and if we want to, if you want me and you want the committee to negotiate what Chief Moise has suggested, I'd be more than happy to, but I think we have to get a consensus here of the people in the Association. If they want to try this next year, I would be more than happy to go with it, but just give me some direction. I'll go with it.

CHIEF CREIGHTON: Mr. Secretary, are we locked into the prices for next year at the hotel or anything?

CHIEF GAUDET: We are locked in what they call a modified plan. Now, whether we can negotiate out of the meals I don't know, but it has been established as a modified plan which includes breakfast and dinner. Whether they say — that contract has been signed for '84, so whether they say you can't do that, we may be locked in for two years; but if I can get a — if we can get out, what I'm saying is in 1986 before I make a decision, I have to sign a contract, like I say, I sign the 1986 contract within two weeks after I leave here, okay, so I'm signing the 1986 contract is due the second week in July. That's locked in. So theoretically right now the '84 — we may not be able to get out of that. I have a signed contract for '84 and '85 for Dunfey's. I have got a contract that I'll have to sign with the Providence Marriott before the 15th of July. Okay? So what I'm saying is if you want, maybe I can't do it. I'll try to get out of it here if you want that. I'll say I'll try. Whether I will be successful, I don't know. But in '86 if I haven't signed the contract, maybe if you want to go that way I would be more than happy to try and do it.

CHIEF CARLE: Mr. President, if I may ask the question, I know we signed the contract. We all do in various organizations. What are our financial responsibilities if we do sign the contract and we change our mind? Is there a monetary agreement there that you are bound to or is it just a commitment, gentlemen's agreement, by signing basically that you plan to come and they hold these dates for you? Is the organization bound to a financial loss if you don't come here?

CHIEF GAUDET: What can I say, Jerry? When we sign a contract, we have no definite prices. I just got the definite price for '84 a couple of weeks ago. We are signing a contract that we are going to hold the conference there but they will not quote a price till 12 months before.

CHIEF CARLE: I know that, Arthur.

When you sign a contract with these people you sign that you will be coming here in June of '84 and June of '85?

CHIEF GAUDET: Right.

CHIEF CARLE: Is there any money involved or monetary value involved that the organization is liable if the organization chooses to go elsewhere in the meantime?

CHIEF GAUDET: You mean change the location?

CHIEF CARLE: Yes.

CHIEF GAUDET: I don't think you can. I think once you sign a contract, you are obligated.

CHIEF CARLE: You think, but I'm trying to find out here from somebody on the board, do we have a financial commitment, responsibility, dollars the organization is bound to pay if the members decided next year that in '85 they don't want to go here? That's my question. And the only reason I'm asking the questions, various people here are discussing this and where are we? Where are we? This is why I'm asking the question.

CHIEF DYER: If I may. I just have some of them here and I went through one of them. Dunfey's Hyannis for '86 has a cancellation clause in their contract, and I think the Marriott in Burlington had a cancellation clause and it is money. At a point. Dunfey's is after definite confirmation should a total group cancellation occur within 12 weeks of arrival, a cancellation fee of one night's package plan per person would be assessed and charged to your organization.

CHIEF CARLE: So you have 90 days, 12 weeks, three months.

CHIEF DYER: In this one contract.

CHIEF CARLE: If you choose, let's say, six months ahead not to go, you have no financial loss?

CHIEF DYER: In that particular one.

CHIEF CARLE: According to what you read. Thank you.

CHIEF DYER: When we backed out of Wentworth two years ago, we had no financial obligation there. That was their problem anyway.

FROM THE FLOOR: We didn't back out of Wentworth. They backed out on you.

CHIEF CARLE: This has been brought up many times, not to belabor this, but nobody actually knew if we had a final obligation or loss or commitment we had to meet, and this apparently explains what could happen.

CHIEF MOISE: Mr. President. I would like, we are talking about Art's ability to negotiate or renegotiate the contract that is for 1984. I don't believe specifically in that contract; it states that there must be two meals or what have you. That's the point I think that we are talking about or what I was talking about. As far as a location, that's another issue. The point I'm trying to make is that probably in the form of a motion that Art should be given that prerogative, whatever the body desires.

I bought another guest ticket for Monday night because I have a friend here that lives in Hyannis, and it was \$18 for the turkey dinner, so you can see that there is big bucks involved, and I think for the good of the organization, if you do go along with Leo's motion and recommend that the committee do that, I think it would be beneficial to the organization.

CHIEF FOSS: Can we have a vote on Leo's motion? Chief Grote.

CHIEF GROTE: Mr. President, I can't sit here and digest this, and being one of your great grandfathers, no. 1, I don't know what — I was going to use a rough word. How did we get into this mess? Do you have the trust and confidence in the Directors that you elect and have faith in that they are going to be the Directors? The answer is yes, isn't it? Now, if they don't have the authority, shall we grant them the authority and leave this matter in their hands?

I have belonged to many associations in the past 71 years, not the day before yesterday, and I sit here and say: How in hell — I have to use that word, Father — we got into this mess that you don't trust those men there on the Board of Directors?

Now, wait a minute. We are going backwards instead of forwards. Let's get things straight for once and for all. If there is any personality in this, you better leave it outside. 
