

We now share God's power to bring new life out of death.


We pray in the name of Jesus of Nazareth who came that we might have life, life in all of its abundance.

REVEREND STEPHAN C. FOLEY: Reverend Clergy, Mr. President, Officers and Directors of the New England Fire Chiefs Association, Chief James Cardinal Grote, Dean of the Fire Service, lovely ladies, members, friends, and guests.

The story is told of the Irishman who died in Boston. He had several friends and among them was my uncle and two of his close affiliates.

And being good members of Southie, they decided to honor him in proper fashion.

On their way to pay their respects, and as many of you may recall, we used to pay our respects right in the person's own home, right in his own parlor. And as in the case of many cities and in South Boston, and in certain areas there are blocks upon blocks that are very similar.

And leaving a bit early, as they did to pay their respects, they thought it best to stop at the corner tap for a little inspiration.

They went in and the bartender said to the first one, "What will you have?"

He said, "I'll have 3 Feathers."

And to the second one: "What will you have?"

"I'll have Four Roses."

And to my uncle he said, "What will you have?"

"I'll have five martinis."

(Laughter)

That went on for two or three times. As you can well imagine, their sense of direction was somewhat diminished when they left and they went down the block aways. As sometimes things happen, instead of going into the home of the deceased, they went to the home next door.

They ascended the steps and walked into the parlor. The lights were low. Kneeling down in front of what they thought was the coffin, and which actually was the piano, they decided to say a prayer or two.

And after they had prayed a bit, one of them turned to my uncle and said, "I don't really know who your friend was but he certainly had a beautiful set of teeth."

(Laughter)

This evening, we come to discuss not a beautiful set of teeth but rather a beautiful heritage, for I wish to speak to you for a few moments this evening about the wonderful heritage of the Fire Service.

One very cold morning this past winter at about 0400 I was summoned to a second alarm fire in a large tenement. While still some distance from the fire scene and despite the early hour of the day, nonetheless I could see a large column of smoke in the distance. This, together with the reports that were coming across the radio, immediately made me realize that it was a serious fire in progress and several people were trapped in the building.

As I arrived on the scene, it was immediately apparent that feverish efforts were underway at rescue. In addition to the aerial and tower ladders, ground ladders had been thrown in every possible way, in the alley, in the courtyard, in the rear, on the sides, and in the front. In fact, there were so many ladders thrown that I thought I was actually in Boston — and that, by the way, is meant to be a compliment. We all know that nobody can throw ladders like they do in Boston and that's what I thought as I pulled up: I think I am in Boston.

But despite that, it was easy to see what was going on. Reductions in manpower had not resulted in reductions in effort or dedication.

While all this was going on by ladder outside, the same feverish efforts were going on inside at rescue work with an intensive interior attack. Some were brought out unconscious and not breathing and revived.


The bottom line was that no one was seriously injured and not one life was lost. Of course, several firefighters were injured but we all know that doesn't count.

As I got back in my car to return to quarters, I said to myself: Certainly, at least on this unusual occasion, the news media will give proper recognition to the Fire Service. I was to be very disappointed. The only thing that appeared in the paper that evening or the next day was a picture of a cat who had jumped from the third floor window of the tenement just as the photographer arrived on the scene. That was the entire story of those unheralded heroes.

It's little wonder then why we become so often discouraged because I need not tell you that as you go up the ranks, the challenges increase with each step. And the further you get towards the top, the more difficult it becomes to, as Harry Truman would say, pass the buck.

When we listen to those names such as we have heard read here this evening, those that have gone on before us, and not meaning to offend anyone, but I can't help but think of how much a person like Leo McCabe not only did for his own department and state, but for this organization as well, and how much we profited by the dedication of people like that, which brings us again to another aspect of the Fire Service. It is not all to be found on the fire ground.

But no matter which aspect of the Fire Service you consider, there will always be one common element and that part of your lives is very much like mine and like Pastor Hood's, because it is the ministerial aspect, and isn't that wonderful. Because the Scripture says, "Whatsoever you do to the least of my brothers you do to me." And no one need tell you that the better part of your efforts are so frequently expended on the underprivileged, on the poor, and on the needy. And just as in our case, your efforts are not always appreciated.

Just as it is not easy for any clergyman to give six or seven sermons on any weekend and give them well, so it is not easy for you to give your best from 8:00 in the morning until 4:00 at night, and then perhaps go out to answer a second alarm or a fatality at 2:00 or 3:00 in the morning, especially when you are constantly hounded by the media who, as I have mentioned, so very rarely give us the credit we deserve.

So this evening, while our primary purpose is to honor the memory of those who have gone on before us, especially in the past year but also as long as this organization has been in existence, I think it very important for us to dwell on that notion of ministry.

You cannot be successful in the Fire Service, whether you are paid or a volunteer, if you do not have a keen sense of ministry. Those of you who are chief officers, which I presume are most of you, cannot be successful in your occupation unless you realize that the higher you go in rank, the more is required of your ministry.

We have that same situation in the church. In fact, the Pope called himself the servant of the servants of God. And so it is with you who are our Chiefs. You cannot overlook the importance of service. That is why I have thought, over the years, that the greatest title we have given to our employment, to our exercise, to whatever we do, the real title is Fire Service.

And so this evening, as we conclude this memorial service, while we honor so many we love so well, let us also remember the example they have given us and strive to honor their memory by truly being ministers to others.

(Applause)

CHIEF FOSS: That concludes the service, except for two or three announcements that we have.







That was before taking his next to last position, before this, which was as Administrative Assistant to the Chief of the Houston Fire Department.

He also has attended various colleges and has a degree in Fire Technology from Oklahoma State University and a doctorate in Fire Administration from the same university.

It is a pleasure for me to present at this time, the Fire Marshal for the State of New Hampshire, Dr. Thomas Dawson.

FIRE MARSHAL DR. THOMAS DAWSON: Thank you, Chief Dyer, Mr. President, honored guests at the head table, and participants of this annual event.

My wife Cathy and I are pleased and most honored to be here tonight.

Over the past twelve years, I have had the good fortune or misfortune, to have held three distinctly different types of positions in three different organizations. Tonight, I would like to talk with you about these three organizations and then make a few comments or observations about each.

The organizations which I will be talking about are the Associate Degree of Fire Protection Program housed in the Vo-Tech College in Laconia, New Hampshire; the Houston Fire Department in Houston, Texas; and finally, the Office of the State Fire Marshal in Concord, New Hampshire.

In 1970, a Fire Science Program was started in New Hampshire. In 1972, I was hired and came in and modified the program and made it into a Fire Protection Technology Curriculum and started offering classes statewide in five different locations of the state, mainly serving in-service firefighters.

During the seventies, a large group of firefighters went through this program. In fact, in 1975, we had our largest enrollment of over 200 participants and many who started the program finished it. The Fire Protection Program also offered seminars featuring nationally-recognized textbook authors such as Francis Brannigan; Emmanuel Freed; William Clark; Don Favorall; and others. Maybe Fire Chiefs here this evening attended one or more of these spring conferences, these seminars held up in Laconia. We drew from all over New England.

The Fire Protection Program also developed a large 16-millimeter film library and when I left in 1978, the program had over 80 films and averaged two films loaned each day.

Now for the observations. Education and training are the backbone of a profession. The New Hampshire Fire Chief's support of both education and training demonstrated a true desire to lift the professional stature of the Fire Service in New Hampshire.

Also, I learned during my six and one-half years as the Professor and Administrator of that Program, that we live in a democratic country. The people ultimately control government and the government's programs. If the Fire Service wants good state-level programs, educational programs, training programs, and so forth for their profession, then the Fire Service, headed by the Fire Chief, must ask for and demand excellence and it will be received.

Other special-interest groups have done this, including the Police Departments.

Now, let's turn our attention to Houston, Texas. Houston is this nation's fourth largest city. It recently bypassed or surpassed the City of Philadelphia. It was settled in 1836. In Houston proper, they have a population of 1.7 million people. There are over 3 million people in Harris County, the county that surrounds the City of Houston. Houston is comprised of 556 square miles and contains high-rise clusters. They have one downtown business district, but they also have several other clusters of high-rise buildings in the city.

The 50-mile long Houston Ship Canal, makes Houston one of the largest seaports in the United States. It is also the home of the Johnson Space Center.

Now, let me ask you a question. What was the first word spoken from the moon? Any Houstonian will know the answer to this question.

"Houston, Houston, the Eagle has landed."

The Fire Department contains 3400 men and two women. It has 74 fire stations and a budget of \$127 million. 34 ambulances make an average of 220 calls each day. Flak jackets are a standard issue for all ambulance drivers and attendants.

The fire apparatus responds to 110 calls per day, with about 10 to 15 working fires where apparatus is committed and lines are laid. 10 to 15 working fires each day.

The size of the Fire Department can be imagined by looking at the budget and the specific accounts. The gasoline accounts, 'for example, of the Houston Fire Department is a million dollars. The electric account, paying for utilities, the electric utilities is \$950,000. Remember, they have got 85 buildings, 74 of which are fire stations. They pay for their telephone of a half a million dollars a year.

Postage is \$9,000 a year.

And travel, we always had money left over in the travel accounts, \$36,000 per year for travel.

And with a supplies account for \$330,000.

One of my responsibilities was managing the financial resources of the Fire Department and I could identify in the budget literally hundreds of thousands of dollars of excess padding. I could move it around from account to account and utilize it for whatever needs we might have happened to have had at the time.

A few other statistics about Houston and the Fire Department. Houston averages about 50 civilian deaths per year. The annual fire loss is around \$65 million. And while I was there between 1980 and the end of 1983, three and one-half years, while I was there, two firefighters died in the line of duty. One was a District Chief

40 Lee Burbank Highway Revere, Massachusetts 02151 responding to a call one morning early and the other was a rookie fireman who fell over the tailboard.

750 firemen are injured each year or report injuries each year.

Another interesting note about the Fire Department is that they had 57 mutual aid contracts in force at the end of 1983.

Houston is unionized and Local 341 is their union.

Now some observations, two observations. The first observation is that bigger is not necessarily better. There was a tremendous amount of time and energy spent by the Chiefs and others in the Fire Department in simply surviving: surviving the city, surviving the city bureaucracy, and surviving the Fire Department bureaucracy. I myself spent a lot of energy simply keeping alive.

With so much energy focus on surviving, there is little energy left over for creativity and in my travels I have seen smaller and medium-sized Fire Departments much, much more creative than the large giant Fire Departments.

The second observation about the Houston Fire Department. The Houston Fire Department and their Fire Chiefs would not point out the problems of the Department. They would not point them out to the City Administration. They would not point them out to the public. When they were asked the question, "How are you doing?" their answer was simply, "We're fine, we can handle it, we're doing great."

When the police were asked the same question, their answer was quite a bit different. Their answer was, "We can't handle it, crime is out of control and we need more manpower, we need more equipment."

As a result, over the three and one-half years that I was there, I saw millions of dollars redistributed from the Fire Department budget to the Police Department budget.

I personally believe that a more aggressive and honest self-criticism by the Fire Department would have resulted in better financial support by the City.

Finally, let's turn our attention to the State Fire Marshal's Office in New Hampshire. The State Fire Marshal is responsible for providing direct support to local Fire Departments. Support in terms of helping Fire Departments with fire investigations, code interpretation and enforcement, plans review, organizational and administrative support, coordination of the hazardous material upon request, and support in other ways.

Also, the Fire Marshal can make rules, rules which have the effect of law. For example, previous Fire Marshals adopted the life safety code and the flammable liquids code. Those codes are still in effect and they will be revised this summer.

The office is small and it is understaffed. It includes myself; one secretary; one Deputy Fire Marshal; six Fire Investigators; and one Criminal Investigator. We need double the staff to fulfill our responsibilities as laid out in the state law.

We investigate about 350 fires a year. And of course, we are responsible for inspecting all state buildings. New Hampshire averages about 15 fire deaths a year and

so far to date as of today, we have had only 5 fire deaths so we are halfway through the year with only five fatalities.

We believe, in the office, that our state's smoke detector law has had an impact on reducing fire deaths.

Now some observations I have had. I have only been there for four months but I have seen several things. One thing that I have seen is that the Fire Marshal's Office is extremely important in providing information and technical support to local Fire Departments.

Another thing that I found is that the Fire Marshal has rule-making authority, which is extremely important in terms of setting a standard for the state for life safety and fire protection. By rule, we can adopt codes and we can adopt rules to help with a fire problem.

We are understaffed and we are overcontrolled. Our present staff however is extremely dedicated. It's a small staff with excellent men.

And finally, the New Hampshire Fire Service, potentially the strongest special interest group in the state led by the Fire Chiefs, has the sheer power to demand and receive excellence in the office that directly supports all the state's Fire Departments and that's the Office of the State Fire Marshal.

Well, Cathy and I are having a wonderful time this evening. If you are ever up our way, be sure to stop by the offices and see me. I am located in the Department of Safety in Concord, New Hampshire, and my door is always open. Thank you very much.

(Applause)

CHIEF DYER: Thank you, Tom. Now, we have reached the portion of the program where it is time to swear in the new officers for 1984 -'85. At this time, if the new President, Chief Clinton Hughes of Wethersfield, Connecticut, would come forward, Chief Charles Foss will swear him in as President for the next year.

To my own Fire Department, you know that we are only a Class 3. First off, when we work, we work against the clock most of the time. When we have a fire, we work for the Rating Bureau and we work for the insurance company to try to prove our worth, and of course the taxpayers of our Town. We can only come from such a fine department as I do as it's the only Fire Department without volunteers and we just feel it sets a goal for men in the Fire Department to look to and try to do the same thing. We don't think we are smart just because we made Class 3. We are proud of it but it gives everybody something to shoot for and my own, my family. Like I said, I have the greatest guys in the Fire Department.

I don't have to answer all the calls. I have an Assistant Chief. I got some Deputies that are super.

A couple of weeks ago — you talk about odd calls, we were kind of at a point and all of a sudden we hear the police radio say: We got a floater. We know what they mean. On June 5th, when the water went down, they called for our boat and rescue

cars for a floater in the river. It's not so bad in the river but when they call up and say: There is somebody 10 feet up in a tree, and that's where our Fire Department had to go to retrieve a body, 10 feet up in the tree.

So you can imagine the circumstances that our guys had to do. On Saturday afternoon I was busy at the garage and I am sure McCall will take real good care of that job. They do things like that. During the week when we are short of help, I knew John was available for different jobs for the Fire Service and that's a great one, taking them down 10 feet from a tree.

Like Marshal, you know, in New Hampshire, we have some people that have migrated from Connecticut up to New Hampshire recently that we are proud of and I am sure you will find them to be great as you work there in Concord.

I just have to thank, you know, back over the years, some of the people that have been so good to me and I don't want to mention them by name because I would miss some. But there is one guy that I want to come up here and say a few words. He just had his 93rd birthday.

Marshal, anytime you want to learn something in New Hampshire, I will give you his name in Chester and you can call him because he will have the answer for you.

Recently, Channel 3 wanted to interview somebody in Connecticut. He has been a voter for 50 years. And when he told them that he voted for Woodrow Wilson, they thought he was kidding. 

We will go into old business. Any unfinished business that we have to take up?

CHIEF DYER: You have the conference site for 1987.

CHIEF HUGHES: I will have the Secretary come up here and he has got the material on the site selection for three years down.

CHIEF GAUDET: Three proposals were submitted for our 1987 conference. They were the Dunfey's Hyannis Hotel; the Providence Marriott Hotel; and the Sheraton-Tara in Nashua, New Hampshire.

The total amount of people voting was 93: Dunfey's received 70 votes; the Marriott received 7; and the Sheraton-Tara received 16. So as you well can see, the Dunfey's carried the majority of votes so the 1987 conference will be here at Dunfey's, Hyannis.

CHIEF HUGHES: Thank you, Arthur.

Going into old business for unfinished business, anything to come before the meeting? Merton Dyer.

CHIEF DYER: The Officers and Directors wish to place a motion before the organization.

It is moved that Article IV, Section 1, be amended by striking out and inserting in place thereof the following amendment, which will then read:

"Section 1. The Annual Meeting of the Corporation shall be held each year during the month of June in conjunction with the Annual Conference at such date and place as the Directors and Officers three years prior thereto shall designate. All site proposals shall be investigated by the Site Committee, comprised of the Chairman of the Exhibit Committee, the Chairman of the Manufacturers Committee, and three other persons as appointed by the President."

Also, Section IV will be amended by striking out where a vote of the membership could not be conducted so as to read:

"Nothing in Section 1 shall be viewed as prohibiting the Board of Directors in case of extraordinary circumstances from changing the place of the meeting that has been duly publicized."

It is now open for discussion on the floor.

CHIEF FALLON: (Massachusetts Director, Brookline, Massachusetts) At a meeting on Monday, June 24 at 3:00 p.m. of the Massachusetts Caucus, a well-attended and spirited meeting and all that attended will attest to it, it was a unanimous decision of the Massachusetts Caucus not to change this bylaw. For various reasons and the main one being the Democratic process would be better served under the bylaw that is currently in place.

CHIEF DYER: Thank you, Chief. Chief Flanders.

CHIEF FLANDERS: I am sure there are pros and cons to this new amendment to the Bylaws and I am sure for every con someone brings up, someone else can give a pro.

I would like to state also that all of the Vermont unanimously, at our caucus, support the amendment change.

And also the Board of Directors and Officers and voting members at our last Directors Meeting, voted whole-heartedly and supported that.

So I guess that's it, I want to keep it brief.

CHIEF DYER: Any other discussion on the motion we have?

CHIEF TWEED: At the Connecticut meeting, and I was still Chairman at that time, it was unanimously voted to support the change. They felt that the Board of Directors are selected by the membership, that these people are duly recognized and will listen to their membership. They should be the one empowered to make the decision.

I strongly feel it is a good change. I know some people are opposed to it, but it can get into quite an argument, as Ernie said. You got your pros and your cons but the State of Connecticut supports the change.

CHIEF GROTE: Do we understand, and I do, that when we formed this organization, that the Board of Directors are really the governing body of this Association. So let's trust and have the confidence in them.

With the rest of the officers, the Board of Directors is a very important group of this organization or any other organization. Look into your Bylaws and you will find that's one of the old, founding principles of the organization.

CHIEF DYER: Chief Hall.

CHIEF HALL: Mr. President, I think we, as Directors, owe it to the group to point out some of the thoughts that went into the bylaw change. One of the problems, the more important ones that one realizes in a business dealing, if we put our Board of Directors, no matter who they be, in a position of having to negotiate with a hotel, knowing full well that we have no choice whatsoever, you are putting them in a deficit type of situation to start with, and that's one of the thoughts that swayed me when we talked about it at the Directors Meeting and giving them the opportunity to make an intelligent choice on the hotel and giving them a little bit of leeway to negotiate with the hotel, to come up with a good site for the conference. Thank you.

CHIEF DYER: Is there any other further discussion for this question?

FROM THE FLOOR: Is there any discussion of rotating and if there was a facility in each state for each year? If not, they would yield to whichever place was available for space. Was there any discussion of that?

CHIEF FLANDERS: I am sure there wasn't any official discussion of rotating from state to state at the Directors Meeting.

I have heard through other members and members from the Vermont delegation, that they would like to see that happen. However, that was not brought up at that meeting.

400 Warren Avenue Portland, Maine 04104 CHIEF WYATT: At the Rhode Island Meeting, of which Bob Coutu directed one of the points that came out, not that we in Rhode Island do not like to support our State and our people, but one of the great concerns of this organization is a facility that has the attractability to manufacturers and exhibitors both, to get people to attend and to get them to participate.

We agreed at that time that we would basically support Dunfey's because the Marriott cannot match it in space.

It would seem to me that it is proper to leave it with the Directors and the Officers to decide who can do what is best for the organization as a whole, rather than get into some nitty-gritty and that I am voting on something that I don't know what the hell I am talking about. I think that goes for a whole lot of other members, I think we saw that a couple of years ago when we saw the pros and cons of Dunfey and Marriott.

I think we have to do what is good for an organization on this site and therefore, we decided at the Rhode Island caucus, that we would support Dunfey's because at that time it was known as the best exhibitors and best facilities of the three that were offered.

We also, since that time, have been made aware that Newport, Rhode Island, has made some extensive additions in their area, including a conference hall and a site that may be bigger than this. We certainly would want the Directors to look at that at some time.

I think it would be our feeling that they should leave it with the Directors.

CHIEF DYER: Chief Foss was next.

CHIEF FOSS: I think one of the discussions of why we had this was and I understand that everybody would like to change, and I would like to see a change too, but it comes down to the money involved. Are we going to run the conference and break even or make a little money or are we going to run on a deficit?

I don't believe at the present time there is any other place available for us that we have the facilities that we do here. I realize that people from Maine and Vermont and New Hampshire, that it's a long trip down here, but if we go to any of the other places that we've had bids from, it costs the Association money.

If we go two years down the line when we get to Providence, it is nice down there but it costs the Association about \$6,000 to go down there is what we lost from the exhibitors and registration. There is nothing to say against Providence.

CHIEF FALLON: I may point out that at the Massachusetts caucus, all these issues were discussed in a broad range.

I may also point out that the Chairman of the Exhibit Committee was at the Massachusetts caucus.

I might also point out that it was the unanimous vote of the Massachusetts caucus to back Dunfey's for the 1987 site.

Again, the Massachusetts delegation has full and complete confidence in their Directors, including me, but they convinced me otherwise, that this was not a good idea.

As I told them, I can count and the count was in and the count was unanimous in Massachusetts not to support this.

CHIEF DYER: Chief Gaudet.

CHIEF GAUDET: I would like to make a couple of comments that when the proposals were sent out, there were twelve proposals sent out and, as you well know, only three were returned.

The Sheraton-Newport on Goat Island, I sent them a copy of a proposal and within a couple of days I received a call. They do have the facilities, in fact, I was down there this spring. They have a big exhibition hall similar to what you have here and as far as the facilities. Their response was to me: Yes, they would like to host a conference but this is their prime vacation time and we couldn't afford to go there. That was their response. So they were not submitting a proposal but they were given an opportunity to make a proposal and this is what they told us, that you can't afford to come here because this is our prime vacation time and we know that we'd have to get down here and that you wouldn't be interested.

That's the reason why they did not make a proposal. So I just wanted to make sure that the membership understood that these are not only the three that got my letters. There were twelve letters in all sent out. I received, out of the twelve that I sent out, I probably received eight replies. Some did not meet the needs and this was the reason they all wanted to know exactly some of the particulars and which I discussed with them. But the Sheraton-Newport, this is exactly what they told me.

CHIEF BERGERON: (From Lexington) I would like to know what your time limit would be if this passes, with the specific idea of knowing if the Director has an opportunity to come back to the people he represents to give them a report of what the choices are so that we can advise him of what we would like.

CHIEF DYER: I would believe that if it was going to be in the hands of the Directors, that the Secretary could send out notice much earlier in the year. The Directors and Officers meet in the fall and again in the spring. They possibly could have the report ready for the fall meeting and get back to their committees during December, January and February and March and then at the spring meeting, the Directors could possibly finalize the site. That's the way I feel it could be done. Chief Hughes.

CHIEF HUGHES: Gentlemen, some good comments have been said here and I respect all of them on both sides, but when we had a problem at the Wentworth, the Directors had to act and I think they did a real good job when they got the Providence site.

I appreciate what the Massachusetts caucus people say but on the other hand, it is almost like you are giving up your individual rights to vote on this thing. Not so because any time the body here does not like what the Directors do, they can override the Directors.

So you haven't really given anything away totally by letting the Directors do this because any time the rank and file members of this Association want to override the Board of Directors, that's their prerogative. So that still does exist, so you haven't actually given the right away.



CHIEF DYER: Those opposed?

(No)

CHIEF DYER: The Ayes have it. We will present the question to the group.

I would like to, on behalf of the President, appoint Chief Lydon, Chief Carle, Chief Aiden to act as tellers for the meeting of the vote. It will be by ballot vote.

CHIEF DYER: This will require a two-thirds vote to carry. I would suggest, Mr. President, that maybe you would like to continue the meeting until after the ballots are counted.

FROM THE FLOOR: Mr. President, I guess it seems to be a problem here and I am not supposed to be voting.

CHIEF FALLON: No problem.

CHIEF HUGHES: No problem.

FROM THE FLOOR: Not to be rude but the bylaws in this organization say that only Chiefs can vote.

FROM THE FLOOR: Maybe I shouldn't even be here.

CHIEF HUGHES: No problem of being here. Where we wind up in confusion is that in the International, a Deputy or Assistant can vote and in this organization only a Chief can vote. But it is no big problem. We know you did not do it intentionally.

The tellers will count the ballots.

What else do we have under unfinished business?

CHIEF GROTE: We come in as friends, let's leave as friends. United we stand, divided we fall.

CHIEF HUGHES: What else do we have as unfinished and old business?

CHIEF SORENSON: Why were the minutes of the seminars dropped in the book last year? Was that a vote of the meeting?

CHIEF GAUDET: Two years ago it was decided by the Board of Directors that rather than have the bill for the stenographer, which was running between \$1500 and \$2000, and the Board of Directors took this under consideration and thought that it might be more cost-effective if the sessions were taped, which they have been, and this would cut the cost of the annual program.

So what the Board of Directors decided was that the minutes would be taken and if anybody in the Association wanted that information, we would make copies of those tapes and make that available. But it was strictly on a cost-effective basis.

CHIEF SORENSON: I always thought it was quite meaningful if you didn't attend the particular seminar for some reason, you could pick it up in the minutes. Now I find the book, other than listing the officers, is not included.

CHIEF GAUDET: It is a valid point.

CHIEF HUGHES: This is the reason the Board of Directors took its action.

CHIEF SORENSON: I would like to make a motion that the Board of Directors review that again, if they would, at their next meeting, if I may.

CHIEF HUGHES: About putting the minutes of the meeting in the red book, it did come down to economics. We are getting close to \$2000 to put all the minutes of the meetings in the red book but like the secretary said, the tapes are available if anyone wants a tape of any particular meeting or anything, they are available.

But he has made a motion that the Board of Directors reconsider it. Will someone second that motion?

CHIEF MARTIN: (From Athol) Seconded.

CHIEF HUGHES: All those in favor -

CHIEF DYER: Mr. President, may I speak to the motion?

CHIEF HUGHES: Go ahead.

CHIEF DYER: As you know, I have been rather interested in the history of what's going on in the past and I have with me the 1934 red book, which was fifty years ago. It's very interesting to go back.

296 Essex Street Lawrence, Massachusetts Some of the subjects that were discussed at that time were the chemistry of fires by Chief Sanborn in Portland, Maine; the use of $1\frac{1}{2}$ -inch hose by Chief Henry Taft of Norwich, Connecticut; there was a big discussion on changing from $2\frac{1}{2}$ -inch hose to $1\frac{1}{2}$. And now, fifty years later, we are talking about 4-inch.

In the afternoon, the value of water holes for protecting rural districts. Proper care of fire alarm system by Chief Charles French of Manchester.

Another interesting program that was given that day was radio service for Fire Departments by Chief Henry Fox of Boston, Massachusetts.

In 1934, after reading through the minutes of the meetings and the discussion, Boston was one of three Fire Departments that had a radio system. The reason they had it was through the marine units and all three Fire Departments at that time that had a radio system had marine units and that's basically how they started.

Chief Fox was telling how, in the future, there would be radios that you can take into the building and things like that. These have come true and it's very interesting to go back.

I would fully support the motion to print these things so that fifty years from now somebody else can go back and look up this thing. Thank you.

CHIEF HUGHES: Yes, sir.

CHIEF HUGHES: Yes, sir.

CHIEF JENKINS: (From West Barnstable) It might make sense to still tape seminars and then convert the tapes to typing. I can see we could still save money there because, by having a stenographer present, you have got to pay the stenographer by the hour, I assume, and then the stenographer's record still has to be typed out so you still have double hours so you would still be saving money if you had the tapes and converted the tapes for the red book.

CHIEF HUGHES: Let me give you a better suggestion. If every member would sell ten raffle tickets next year — just a minute. You all sell ten raffle tickets, you don't have to do 55, do ten. We can entertain a motion here today. I could totally pay that amount. We are talking about \$2000 and Jack Tweed could tell you that we could pick it right up there without any sweat and put it right back in the red book. If someone wants to make a motion, I would assume we would do it here with the body and the Board of Directors and let the whole body vote on it. What you are talking about is probably \$2000. If somebody wants to make a motion.

FROM THE FLOOR: You have a motion on the floor.

CHIEF SORENSON: I will withdraw my motion if someone withdraws the second.

CHIEF MARTIN: I withdraw the second.

CHIEF SORENSON: I make a motion to put the material back in the red book.

CHIEF MOISE: Seconded.

CHIEF HUGHES: The motion has been made and seconded that the material from the conference sessions go back in the book.

CHIEF HUGHES: Opposed?

(No)

CHIEF HUGHES: So voted.

Seriously, there is not much profit in the conference, even this year, and really that's the place where we could pick up the difference with the money in the raffle. It's not that much of a task for any Fire Chief to get rid of ten tickets.

CHIEF GAUDET: Do you want the tapes, that's been done in the red book too, is that included in that motion?

CHIEF SORENSON: My intent was to have it as printed in the past.

FROM THE FLOOR: That includes this conference.

CHIEF HUGHES: We will transcribe the tapes and print what we have this year.

CHIEF JENKINS: I will move that the Raffle Committee and the Treasurer be asked to send out ten raffle tickets in the future.

Raffle tickets are the easiest thing in the world and those that return tickets, as Jack Tweed reported, I won't say it with a lady present.

CHIEF FALLON: Seconded.

According to the Bylaws, it is correct, the only ones entitled to vote — it is in the negative — but: Associate and life members shall be entitled to the privileges of membership in the corporation, except the right to vote as otherwise provided in these bylaws.

Now, life membership is not people like myself, Jim Brennan, and so forth, who are retired honorary members. We are still entitled to vote. Lifetime honorary members are entitled to vote.

So will you please vote again.

CHIEF CABLE: Arthur is the Treasurer-Secretary. When they have the ballots, check the cards and this way there is no question about anything. If you are going to do it, you can verify everybody.

CHIEF CARLE: The question was, I thinnk, that Jim Fallon said if it was within five votes of any way, we would have another vote. But this was a decision of the Chair.

CHIEF CREIGHTON: Can we vote by hand? Do we have to vote by ballot?

CHIEF CARLE: The ballot is two-thirds, regardless of either way, it doesn't matter.

CHIEF HUGHES: We can use the same ballots if they want a Yes or a No one.

CHIEF DYER: We have ballots.

CHIEF HUGHES: You have enough ballots? Let's get at it again.

FROM THE FLOOR: Watch who you pass them out to.

CHIEF THURSTON: (From Waterbury Center, Vermont) I would just like clarification of a point of order. Can we as a body change this as the recommendation of the fellow of having five votes? We did not vote on that, we said just maybe, okay. I am challenging the bylaw change or a point of order change in Robert's Book of Rules. It's two-thirds majority vote. You know as well as I do that in any Town Meeting or Council Meetings, it carries. I don't think the body can say: If we don't make it by five, we have to vote over. I would like a clarification of that.

CHIEF HUGHES: To the best of my ability, I think we have settled on a gentlemen's agreement here that the bylaws specifically say it was to be by ballot and it was to be a two-thirds vote. Because of a little confusion, a little misunderstanding amongst gentlemen, we agreed as gentlemen that if it was within five, we will vote over again, I think it was strictly a gentlemen's agreement and it was a good one, I think.

Jimmy said five and that was fair enough, if it went either way by five. There was no question involved if either one lost.

We did come down to one so I will rule that we are just going to vote over again.

CHIEF THURSTON: Chief Grote spoke about the Fire Service. We are not here as an organizing body to make money. This organization is for the brotherhood of firemen.

CHIEF HUGHES: Absolutely.

CHIEF THURSTON: If you go to several different sites and you break even, you have made money. We are not a money-making organization. I think we're way beyond, I think some people are way beyond the point of this. I think this outfit is swaying a lot of the votes, so on and so forth.

CHIEF FOLEY: And be more creative too.

I spoke to Mert Dyer and I spoke to Chief Moise about it and I spoke to the local clergy, Father Ryan, a very sparky fellow, who will be more than happy to have us. He told me Sunday afternoon, that he would do anything he could to help the Association.

So my thought is this morning, let's put it back where it belongs. Let's give it the setting and the atmosphere it deserves. Let us honor the memory of those who have gone on before us, without whose help in many cases, we wouldn't be where we are today.

So I propose to you, gentlemen, I can make it a motion or whatever is required, that we use one of the local churches to have our Memorial Service on Sunday evening and do it the way it should be done.

CHIEF HUGHES: Very good, Father. I don't even think it takes a motion to do this. I think we should just work it out. I am sure we are in total agreement to do what you say. We could get the timewise surmounted like we did in Providence. I am sure each and every person is in total agreement with what you say. I hope we can move forward on it.

CHIEF GAUDET: Could I make one suggestion to the body? If this now would become a factor that we would have Memorial Services at a local church, would anybody have any objection in having dinner served, say at 6:30 on Sunday night, do

Like you say, some of the rooms weren't ready. I can't understand how they can get us out of here at 11:00 and then you wind up, like you said, some of the rooms were not ready until 4:30.

I am sure that Arthur and the Committee will talk to them about that.

I agree with what you say, Jerry. Thank you.

Anything under new business? Anything else under new business to come before the bar?

Anything at all to come before the meeting, now is the time to say it.

If Father Foley, would you pray and send us on our way?

Please stand.




