


PRESIDENT ROBERT J. NUNES: Ladies and gentlemen, we'll say the pledge of allegiance to the flag of America.

I feel a profound respect for what you do and how you serve the whole community and the way you do it. I know that Springfield itself and the second minister of this church back in the 1600s suffered the loss of this parsonage and his life by fire in 1674, I believe. And I have a vivid memory as a six-year-old, being roused out of my house in Boston at night at about two in the morning. My parents are blind and my older brother, my older sister, and a firefighter with his arm around me, calming me down and keeping me company. I thank you all for that and I thank you for your presence here today and for the friends of those people not here physically but whom we honor.

of the New England Fire Chiefs Association, I welcome you to the 72d Annual Memorial Service. We're gathered here this evening to honor those fire chiefs who have gone to their eternal rewards. Thank you for assisting them.

CHIEF GARY G. CASSANELLI: Welcome everyone and thank you, Reverend Fournier, for inviting us into the beautiful Old First I think that this Memorial Service is a time for reflection. If we think about all those individuals who have gone before us in the fire service, that passage should inspire us here today to continue the work for which they dedicated their lives. On behalf of all the members of the Springfield Fire Department, I would like to take this opportunity to dedicate this Memorial Service to the memory of Springfield Firefighter James |Daniel Tetro, who was tragically killed on his way to work on Thanksgiving Day 1993. James' dream in life was to become a Springfield firefighter. He realized that dream and was an inspiration to us all. He's sadly missed by all.

To him whose power now at work in us can do immeasurably more than we can ask or imagine -- to him glory in the church and in Christ Jesus through all generations, world without end. Amen.


May God add his blessing to our understanding of his holy word.

You might title my remarks this afternoon and the reason I brought notes on a serious vein is I threw away the sermon because it was much longer than the heat of the day would call for. And at 2:30 this afternoon, I put together a few thoughts in outline form for something that has been bothering me for a long time, something that is very much on your minds as chief officers as well. What I am about to tell you is a very true story. I won't tell you where it took place or who the characters are that are involved. But as you listen to this tale, which we are going to call A Tale of Two Cities, please understand that I approach it not from the viewpoint of the IAFC, not from the viewpoint of the National Fire Organization, not from the viewpoint of the New England Fire Chiefs, not from the viewpoint of the NFA, not from the viewpoint of health and safety, even though all of these are paramount considerations, but the remarks I share with you this afternoon come from the vision of faith and from the courage of conviction which all of us must have in these difficult and trying times of the fire service. Time in which the Fire Chief gets to use a police cruiser when the cops are no longer needed.

And the Tale of Two Cities unfolds thus. It was a weak Chief and a strong Chief



and in the week Chief's department the city manager said, "Chief, we're going to lay off 16 men and close the firehouse."

"Yes, sir," said the Chief, "yes, sir." Case closed. Case closed. He didn't stand up for the Fire Department and sold it down the river. He didn't even make an effort or an attempt.

But then there was a strong Chief.
And both these cities, by the way, were similar in size, population. And at the present time, the strong Chief said, when the mayor called him in, "Chief your overtime is much too high and there's no money left in the budget. You're going to drop down your minimum strength from 30 to 20 tomorrow."

And the Chief said, "No, I'm not. You might, but I'm not."

Now, this Chief was a man of faith. And whatever else you bring to your job, you've got to bring faith. I don't care whether you are Catholic, Protestant or Jew, you have to bring faith to that job in this day and age. And then I'll share with you a few scriptural selections that this strong Chief undoubtedly used as a backdrop for the battle that he launched and won. And in a minute or two I'll tell you how finely he won that battle. He took his Bible and he went to Mark, The Gospel of Mark, Chapter 11 and he read the following: I solemnly assure you, whoever says to this Mountain, be lifted up and thrown into the sea, and has no doubt but so believes it will happen, I give you my word if you are ready to believe, that what you ask for in prayer will be done to you, so it shall be done.


Maybe he read also in the Book of Ephesians, what we read as your scriptural selection today and from which I take the following excerpt:

And of course, in today's gospel from the gospel of Mark, as we are in the year of Mark: "Where is your faith? Why are you so afraid?"

Now, here's the conclusion briefly to that story, one department is presently in turmoil. Fighting a terrible battle amongst themselves with the politicians with the Chief, the department worked diligently, labored tirelessly, and they built in their case.

And guess what happened -- and again I emphasize that this is a true story -- starting tomorrow morning, the strong Chief is going to have 27 new firefighters in the fire academy and his strength is going to go up to 35 from 30 instead of 20. He has faith and he practiced what he preached. "I'll stand up for my men," he said, "and God will be my guard." It can be done.

The weak Chief said to the City Manager, "Well, I'm sorry."

To his department, "I might have stood behind you men, but I was afraid what the manager would say to me. He might have gotten mad."

Again, a true story. I won't tell you where. It was in the United States of America, that's all I will tell you, not pointing the finger at anybody, that's not my style, it's not for me.







To the Officers and Members of the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Incorporated, I herewith submit the Annual Report of the Secretary for the fiscal year ending May 31, 1994.

The Officers, Directors, and committee members held several meetings throughout the year in preparation for the conference. Full board meetings were held in August, October, January, March, and May. The meetings were held in both Marlborough and Springfield. The March meeting was a special meeting called to deal with complaints concerning the Red Book ad promoter at the East/West Concert Productions, Inc. and Mr. Roger Schrock, its Vice President.


After fully investigating the situation and having previously warned East/West about misrepresentation of our Association, it was voted to cancel the contract between the parties and to retain any legal services that may be required. East/West did not fight the decision and agreed to cease the campaign.

The membership needs to decide if it wishes to pursue other avenues of fund-raising or increase Association activity costs if it becomes necessary. The Association does have an attorney on retainer should pending legal action against East/West is required.


Testimonials and Memorials were attended to by various officers and directors of the Association.



For the second year in a row the Association is proud to host the New England Firefighter Fitness Combat Challenge as part of its conference. 



This is becoming such a big event that the ARA is going to request next year and we'll have probably a run-off of just Massachusetts teams and then have another day for the rest of the states. 



there were still tanks in Afghanistan. So I would submit to you this evening that the values that Mr. Jefferson and Mr. Madison displayed so readily just 200 years ago are the values that you fully subscribe to as evidence of the fact that you take the time in your respective communities to serve with distinction and to serve with real commitment.

We appreciate that against the domestic threats that we have today. And there's a simple truth and that is that it's the domestic problem that confronts this nation as never before. America's position in the world, in large measure because of the commitment that people like you have made for many years, is not challenged. Sure, there are a series of hot spots that pop up, but there isn't anybody who would dream we would witness the end of Marxism in just this four-and-a-half year period. But as Dickens said, it can be the best of times and the worst of times.

And let me hearken back to those values I spoke of just a couple of moments ago. You might think of this tonight that one out of three children in America today is born out of wedlock. We might measure the thought that the AIDS epidemic rampages around this nation and we might consider that very close to 17 percent of the children in high schools across this nation will never earn a diploma. So as Dickens phrased that term appropriately: It's the best of times and indeed it is the worst of times.

But I would submit that the values that you have embraced over many years in your local communities and the endeavor that you undertake to provide for the security of the people that you indeed work for, and in the sincere manner in which you confront the public every day, there's a special lesson for all of us.

I picked up the Springfield morning paper over the last three days and I thought what a great job you had done, what a great job you had done in suggesting to the people that you find your service to be entirely

So my point in short measure is that while our problems across the globe have shrunk considerably, there's a simple truth that our problems at home have grown quite measurably and we have this tendency in this nation to believe that somehow Washington, D.C. is the center of our lives or that Boston, Mass here in this state is at the center of our lives. You all know by the jobs that you do and the families you have raised and the successes you have brought that the great things that happen in America every single day don't happen in Washington, D.C. They happen right here in settings like this with people like you with our families and our friends and our churches and our synagogues and in our schools.

I've always been proud of the relationship that I've had with the firefighters. In fact to leave the mayor's office and still have the support of the Fire Department is no small measure of success, I can tell you that. But to be able to hold onto that support for many years I'd like to think is ample testimony to the fact that I've tried to honor the good work that you do every single day. And while we have our ups and downs in service, I can measure one group by its success and that's the respective fire departments of this region.

When Chief Nunes and Chief Cassanelli extended this invitation to me on a Monday night, knowing I would be going back to Washington this afternoon or this morning, I decided there was no place I'd rather be than offering congratulations to you because indeed of a very grateful United States of America that you are serving and I thank you all very, very much.



New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Inc.

BYLAWS As amended 06/20/94

ARTICLE I

- Section 1. This organization shall be known as the New England Association of Fire Chiefs , Incorporated.
 - Section 2. The purpose for which the corporation is formed are as follows:
- A. To operate as a nonprofit corporation; to encourage and cooperate in the development of new techniques, equipment and practices; to promote more effective organizations and functions of the Firefighting Service, with a view toward greater protection of life and property from the dangers of fire and other hazards.
- B. To aid in the dissemination of information among Fire Chiefs of New England concerning: newly developed equipment and procedures for fighting fires and carrying out the other functions of the fire service; special hazards and problems presented by the development of new industrial and scientific processes and equipment; disasters caused by natural or human origin; practices in particular areas in the administration of Fire Departments; other matters affecting and concerning the fire service.
- C. To provide the means for: an exchange of ideas between its members; conducting of conferences between the members and with those having specialized knowledge on particular matters effecting the fire service; and the study of matters by its committees.
- D. To provide facilities and operate testing grounds for the display, demonstration and testing of equipment required and techniques of operation used in the fire service.
- E. To cooperate with the manufacturers and dealers in equipment used in the fire service with a view toward the dissemination of information to the fire service on the various devices available, and the development of better and more standardized equipment.
- F. To represent the interests of those in the profession of firefighting before legislative and other bodies considering matters in which they are concerned.
- G. To make charitable donations, including memorial and sickness remembrances, to members and their families, and other persons and communities who suffer financial hardships and losses through death, sickness, injury, conflagrations, and catastrophes.
- H. To receive gifts, and bequests, raise such monies and own such real property as is necessary for the advancement of the foregoing purposes.

Section 1. Whenever required to effectuate the meaning or intent here of, the singular shall include the plural, the meaculine shall include the feminine, and vice-versa.

ARTICLE III - THE OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of the corporation shall consist of a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer and a Director from each of the six New England States. All officers shall hold their office for one year or until their successors have been elected. The offices of President, First Vice President, Second Vice President will be on a rotation basis from the six New England States (Maine, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Connecticut, and Vermont). The President, the First Vice President, Second Vice President and Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected by ballot at the Annual Meeting. A member shall be an active member in accordance with Article VII Section 1a when elected to office.

A candidate for election as a Director must be an active member in accordance with Article VII Section 1a and a resident of the particular state which said Director will represent. He shall be nominated and elected by the members of that state.

All active and honorary Life Members shall be eligible to vote for all elective officers.

ARTICLE IV - THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall consist of officers as provided by Article I and the past President who will serve as a member of the Board for one year. The exhibit chairperson shall be a non-voting member of the Board of Directors. The Board shall meet at such a time and place as may be designated by the president. The actual expenses of the board, which includes travel at a mileage set by the Board of Directors each year, shall be paid by the corporation. Each member of the board shall have one vote, the holding of more than one office notwithstanding.

Section 2. The Past President, the First Vice President, and the Second Vice President shall constitute the Auditing Committee. The Auditing Committee will see that the books have been audited by an outside auditing firm each year before the annual meeting.

ARTICLE V - DUTIES

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the corporation, and the Board of Directors and shall be the official representative and spokesman of the Association. He shall call special meetings of the Board of Directors when so requested by the majority of the Board of Directors or whenever he deems such a meeting is necessary, provided that a ten day notice of said meeting shall be given and the reasons therefor. The President shall appoint all committees. All committee members shall be active members in accordance with Article VII Section 1a at the time of appointment. He shall perform such other duties as may be incidental to the office.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the First Vice President to perform the duties of the President during his absence. He shall assist the President in conduction the business and policies of the Association and perform such other duties as prescribed by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall assist the President and First Vice President to perform the duties of their office and in the absence of the President and the First Vice President, assume all the duties and responsibilities of the President.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Secretary/Treasurer to keep a complete record of the proceedings of special and annual meetings of the corporation, the meetings of the Board of Directors; and the standing committees, of which he shall be an ex-officio member; to receive and answer all communications pertaining to the corporation; cause to be prepared a full report of the proceedings of each annual meeting, which shall be printed and one or more copies, mailed by him to each member of the corporation. He shall receive all communications, contributed papers on topics, etc., designed to be presented to the meeting. He shall collect all monies due the corporation. The Secretary/Treasurer shall have the custody of the funds of the corporation; he shall keep a true account of all monies received and disbursed; pay all bills and at the regular and special meetings make a full and correct report of the same. He shall also employ such assistance as he may need for the collection of dues at the annual meeting and report the proceedings of the same and other such expenditures for clerical assistance at other times as may be approved by the Board of Directors. He shall execute a bond to the corporation in the sum of One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000.00) Dollars to be approved by the Board of Directors, the expense of procuring the same to be borne by the corporation. The consultant fee of the Secretary/Treasurer to be fixed annually at the meeting of the corporation and a pay schedule will be determined by the Board of Directors.

He shall also perform such other duties as shall be assigned to him by the President and the Board of Directors. He or any other officer shall not assume an individual indebtedness exceeding One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars without the approval of the Board of Directors. He shall be sworn to the faithful performance of his duties upon taking office. The Secretary/Treasurer shall prepare for adoption by the Board of Directors a list of members eligible for Honorary Life Membership.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to transact all the business of the corporation during the time intervening between the annual meetings. They shall have the full power to expunge from the minutes before printing, anything which is objectionable to the corporation or its members. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occurring by death or otherwise during the time form one annual meeting to another and the replacement shall be chosen from the state involved after conferring with the last President of the NEAFC from that state; and may vote by two-thirds of the total number of Directors to remove any officer for cause. A quorum of five (5) Directors shall be required to transact any business. The Board of Directors shall have the power to make charitable donations, including memorial and sickness remembrances to members and their families, and other persons and communities, who suffer financial losses and hardships through death, sickness, injury, conflagration and catastrophes. The Board of Directors shall meet at least quarterly at a time, place, and date set by the President.

Section 6. The clerk of the corporation shall be the director from Massachusetts. The clerk shall perform the duties under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for corporations.

- Section 1. The annual meeting of the corporation shall be held each year during the month of June in conjunction with the annual conference, at such date and place designated by the Board of Directors, notification of the site to be announced to the members of the corporation at the annual meeting. Proposals of sites for the annual meeting/conference shall be forwarded to the secretary not less than five days prior to the association or a company or corporation in business for this purpose. Proposals shall describe the features of the site, amenities and services to be provided and the cost that would be applicable for the current year that the proposal was presented. The cost information is for comparison purposes only. All site proposals shall be investigated by a site committee as appointed by the President. Proposed sites must be at a fully sprinklered facility and in compliance with state fire codes. This committee shall submit all information relative to the proposals to the secretary for disposition as provided above.
- Section 2. A special meeting of the corporation may be called by the Board of Directors upon at least ten (10) days notice by mail to the members, said notice stating the time, place and purpose of said special meeting.
- Section 3. The exhibit hall and the apparatus display shall at all times be under the sole control of the Exhibit Committee under such rules as the Board of Directors may adopt.
- Section 4. A registration fee shall be charged every person registering at the annual meeting, the amount to be determined by the Board of Directors. Entrance to the exhibit hall or educational sessions will require a registration badge.
- Section 5. The Board of Directors shall have full power to levy an assessment and collect from the members an amount sufficient to cover the entire expense of the annual meeting.
- Section 6. All proposed changes in the By-Laws and/or resolution to be presented at the annual meeting of the corporation shall be forwarded to the Secretary not less than sixty (60) days prior to the date of such meeting. All proposals shall be sent to each member by mail, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the meeting. All proposals shall be posted in the vicinity of the registration area. A special meeting of the corporation shall be voted on the let full day of the annual meeting/conference at which time the proposals shall be read. The proposals shall be voted on the last full day of the annual meeting/conference. A 2/3 vote of the members present and entitled to vote and voting shall be necessary for adoption. The membership by majority vote may request a secret ballot.
- Section 7. A portion of the Annual Conference shall be set spart for the holding of a memorial service in the memory of departed members at an appropriate time and setting as designated by the Association Chaplains and approved by the Board of Directors.
- Section 8. Nomination and election of officers, shall be by secret ballot on the last full day of the annual meeting/conference. All officers elected will be installed at the annual banquet which shall be held on the evening of the last full day of the annual meeting/conference and shall swear to the following oath of office: "I, (name) hereby swear that I will support the constitution and By-laws and at all times bear allegiance to the goals and purposes of the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Inc. I further swear to perform the duties and

responsibilities of my office to the best of my ability and at the end of my term of office, I will deliver to my successor all records of said office, so help me God."

Section 9. Reports of all committees will be presented on the last day of the annual meeting/conference. The Secretary shall prior to the next annual meeting/conference arrange for the distribution to all members the activities of the annual meeting/conference and meeting of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VII - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The membership shall consist of:

A. Active Members:

- (1) The Chief of the Fire Department of a regularly organized public fire department;
- (2) Chief of a private Fire Department that provides municipal service;
- (3) Chief of an industrial Fire Department;
- (4) State Fire Marshal;
- (5) Full time employed Fire Commissioners;
- (6) Fire Directors:

B. Associate Members:

- (1) City or Town Officials, Fire Commissioners, Assistant or Deputy Chiefs or members of fire departments, individuals and individuals representing firms and corporations interested in the protection of life and property against fire.
- (2) Associate members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership in the corporation except the right to vote and as otherwise provided in these By-Laws.

C. Honorary Life Members:

1

(1) Honorary Life Members shall be entitled to vote on all matters. Honorary Life members shall be entitled to all privileges of an active member except as otherwise provided in these By-Laws. Honorary Life Members shall not be required to pay annual dues, however, the Board of Directors may assess Honorary Life Members a fee to cover mailing costs. Honorary Life Membership may be conferred upon active members upon their retirement from office, provided they have been active members of the corporation or its predecessor, The New England Association of Fire Chiefs for a period of five years immediately preceding the date of their retirement, and provided further that they are not identified with fire protection - from a commercial standpoint.

Honorary Life Membership will be withdrawn in the event the member becomes identified with fire protection from a commercial standpoint, but may be reinstated by making application to the corporation and receiving a positive vote at an annual meeting.

D. Life Membership:

- (1) Individuals, firms and corporations interested in protection of life and property against fire, shall be eligible for life membership upon payment of the fee established in the fee schedule. The Board of Directors may assess Life Members a fee to cover mailing costs.
- (2) Life Members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership in the corporation except the right to vote and as otherwise provided in these By-Laws.
- Section 2. No member who is in arrears for dues and assessments shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of the corporation, and any member who is in arrears on June 1st shall receive a second notice and if still in the arrears on August 1st he shall be dropped from membership.
- Section 3. Dues and Fees Schedule: Dues and fees for Active, Associate, Honorary Life, and Life Members shall be set by the Board of Directors and voted on by the membership at the next annual meeting.
- Section 4. Application for all classes of membership shall be received by the Secretary/Treasurer. The proposed member has to be sponsored by a member in good standing with the corporation. The Secretary/Treasurer shall after investigation approve or disapprove the application except as otherwise provided in these By-Laws. If a question of eligibility arises, a decision to approve or disapprove shall be determined by the Board of Directors.
- Section 5. The Secretary/Treasurer shall not register or give a badge or extend any courtesies of the annual meeting to any member whose dues and assessments are not paid to date in full.
- Section 6. No member shall be expelled from the membership by a vote of less than a majority of all members of the corporation, nor by a vote of less than three-fourths (3/4) of the members present and voting on such expulsion.

ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS OF BY-LAWS

Section 1. This corporation shall have full power at a meeting called for that purpose, to alter, amend or repeal these By-Laws, but the same shall not be done except by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members present and entitled to vote at said meeting. The membership by majority vote can request a secret ballot. However, no such proposed amendment shall be considered that has not been read and posted as provided in Article IV, Section 6.

ARTICLE IX - RULES OF ORDER

- Section 1. The presiding officer shall preserve order and decorum. All questions of order shall be decided by him, subject to appeal by any member to the parliamentarian.
- Section 2. In a decision of any question coming before the annual meeting for which no provisions are made in the By-Laws, the presiding officer shall be governed by the rules laid down in Robert's Rules of Order.
- Section 3. Every member, when he speaks or offers a motion, shall rise in his place, properly identify himself, and respectfully address the presiding officer and when finished shall resume his seat. He shall confine himself to the question under debate, avoid all improper personal references and indecorous language.
- Section 4. When two or more members shall rise to speak at the same time, the presiding officer shall decide who shall have the floor.
- Section 5. A member called to order by the presiding officer shall immediately cease speaking on the question before the house, and shall not resume his remarks until the question is settled.
