However, I must recognize a dear friend of the Fire Service and a fire buff extraordinary, Richard Maxwell Coffey, director of the choral. Before this evening's service is over, I am certain that you will agree with me that his conducting ability and the professional performance of the Concora members is outstanding and likewise organist Larry Allen's talent at the console is second to none.

Finally, just 25 years ago on the eve of our 50th anniversary celebration, we were all shocked and saddened by the tragedy of the Vendome Hotel and the nine lives that were lost.

As we recall the deceased members of our own organization or division and the Association who died during the past year, let us also remember with due respect all who have died in our 75-year history and in particular those who have paid the extreme sacrifice by giving their lives in the line of duty. And to recognize this fact this evening, the bell will toll after each name is read for those who have died during the past year. And after Chief Wehter wishes eternal rest, then Chief Obier will ring the bell five times in honor of all those who died in the line of duty.

CHIEF GARY G. CASSANELLI:

[Springfield, MA] On behalf of the City of Springfield and the current Mayor of the City of Springfield, Michael J. Albano, I would like to welcome all the participants to this great City of Springfield. I had the pleasure of inviting everyone back in 1994 and I have this opportunity again.

I mentioned to the good father as I went by, "Nice choice, Father," and I'd like to talk a little bit that most of you who know me know I was born and raised in the City of Springfield. I'm 46 years old and I have never been inside this church. It's my first opportunity and being born and raised as a Catholic, I wouldn't be inside, normally inside a church that is not of a Catholic denomination. But I must say I'm very pleased to be here. This is an absolutely beautiful house of worship and I'm sure you all agree, absolutely gorgeous. I guess I'm sad it took this long for me to be here as a citizen of the City of Springfield but it's a beautiful, beautiful building and I just wish I hadn't taken so long.

Another note, as this is a Memorial Service, I notice in the program in Memoriam that we have the name of Chief Raymond J. Boudet, who was the former Chief of the City of Springfield. And I would like to mention that Ray was not only my first Chief as a firefighter in Springfield, he was also a good friend and neighbor. He lived very close to me and I knew him all my life. Like, my mother was his baby sitter of choice for his daughter. He was very particular about who he chose for his baby sitter and my mother passed the test for baby sitter.

When I got on the department Ray was the Chief of the department and he retired a few years later and then Chief Raymond Sullivan become Chief. I would like to mention him because I know him as well. Ray has passed away, unfortunately, and they were just extraordinary, two individuals that I worked with and worked under. Their service represents what serving under those type of people represents and I think this service is

very apropos in looking back at those people who have given their lives and dedicated so much of their lives to the Fire Service.

But I think the Chiefs, our greatest responsibility to those people, the firefighters who are serving under us, and our greatest responsibility is to see they do fill a long and healthy career without being hampered by injuries or serious threat to their personal safety. I think and I know for a fact that working with all of you and in talking with a lot of you, that is our greatest emphasis and our greatest responsibility of a Chief. I know we all take that very seriously and it is our greatest responsibility.

With that I welcome you to the City of Springfield again and thank you for coming. What can you say and maybe we shouldn't be talking about a parade, the great parade, as it's a serious moment. But it was a great parade and that's what the New England Chiefs is all about. Welcome to Springfield and enjoy the rest of the convention and the conference and hopefully I'll be talking with a lot of you in the future. Thank you very much.

REVEREND CHALK: I want to welcome everyone here tonight to the 75th Memorial Service. In looking out at the crowd, I see a larger audience than I have seen in past years and I hope it's a sign of years to come. I thank the City of Springfield for being such a gracious host and a gracious host also from the Chief here in the community and to Chaplain Foley.

In my opportunity tonight to present to you the 75th Memorial address, it was a great opportunity as it fell to my luck that this was my year. Father Foley and I discussed that very early on or I discussed it with him and I said, "It is my year. "And so we set it down and decided this had been a wonderful opportunity but in coming to the site of speaking tonight, what I would like to speak on - first of all, I'm not a long speaker so I will not be here a long amount of time so don't panic about that - but in deciding what to speak on and as I searched the Bible as a passage that was appropriate, I came upon a verse that sums up a great deal that comes out of the Book of Proverbs, Chapter 22, Verse 28 which says:" Remove not the ancient landmark, which thy fathers have

set." The landmark and great wisdom was given when Solomon wrote this. When we think about a landmark we think that each one traveled here and we mark off certain distances. We travel a highway with a mile marker and you come to an exit and it is marked. You must get off at exit such-and-such. And as we look at those marks in Colonial times there are stones. Those are all the mile markers, the landmarks that are set in place.

As was spoken of tonight of those firefighters who gave their lives years ago in that hotel in Boston or as we think of another tragic event, the Coconut Grove Supper Club that happened years ago, as we look at these landmarks in the Fire Service, those things we can point back and look at other people and say that these are things that occurred in the

service.

As we look at those mile markers and look at what was put down as an ancient landmark in a changing world we live in today, it's kind of unique. We don't live in the same world that many, many years ago some of you grew up in and as we looked at things.

I picked up a statement the other day of a revised version of Little Red Riding Hood and to give you and idea of a changing world and the changing mile markers we live in. Of course we know the story of Little Red Riding Hood. We know of Little Red Riding Hood and the grandmother and the woodchopper and the wolf and all the steps along the way.

But if it was rewritten today, here's what they would say and it would be written as

in a changing world.

In an inquest it was said that the wolf had never been advised of his rights. It says the woodcutter made no warnings before striking the fatal blow.

The Civil Liberties Union stressed the point even though the act of eating the grandma was in poor taste, the wolf was only doing his thing and didn't deserve the death penalty.

The SDS contended that it should be thought that the grandmother was over 30 and therefore couldn't be taken seriously because the wolf was trying to make love, not war.

On the basis of these considerations, it was decided there was no valid way for charges against the wolf. And the woodcutter was indicted for unaggravated assault with a deadly weapon. Several nights later, the woodcutter's cottage was burned to the ground.

One year from the date of the incident at grandma's, her cottage was made a shrine to the wolf who had bled and died there. All the village officials spoke at the dedication but it was Little Red Riding Hood who gave the most touching tribute. She said that while she had been selfishly grateful for the woodcutter's intervention, she realized in retrospect that he was overreacting. As she knelt and placed a wreath in honor of the wolf, there wasn't a dry eye in the forest.

Those are the changing landmarks in the world we live in today. But, you know, what was written down here, this verse refers back further and it refers to the Israelites back to Deuteronomy when they were told there would be landmarks that would be given to you. When you are given a piece of property landmarks are marked, sometimes a stone or a post, that this is land that is particularly marked, this is the piece of property. And the Israelites gaining this and that were marked with landmarks.

They suffered much because the Bible tells us they were often discouraged along the way as many, many times as in the Fire Service officers. We are discouraged along the way. Sometimes it's because of the character of the land that we are discouraged. It's because of the things we go to day-by-day and come from day-by-day.

But the Israelites because of that, they were better than they were before and they were gaining as the years went on. As you serve your community you gain as a Chief officer. You gain that you are improving your community, often on a day-by-day basis.

The Israelites were told this is their land and to follow their leaders as the

leaders of the Fire Service today. The Bible tells us they were not always right and they made mistakes along the way but they were still the leaders and as officers within the Fire Service today you are charged to be a leader in a position of authority. And you will make mistakes and you will make errors and as you serve you will do what is to be done. And courage and success is the ultimate goal that you are serving.

The Israelites were always warned against disobedience and God gave them very specific directions to follow. And you as the chief officer, you give direction very specific. God told the Israelites not to compromise and that can be a warning to us today that there is no compromise, no changing, there's not to be a fading away,

there's not to be a compromise.

As I read in the story of Little Red Riding Hood, we don't need to rewrite our history that way. There needs to be a powerful decision made and as I look at this Association and think of 75 years of growth in this Association, I wonder of the vision and the courage of those who 75 years ago got together and said, "Let's form an Association of Fire Chiefs." I wonder, did they think that it would last? Since there are no members living today to tell us what those original folks thought, we may read their notes, we may read their commentaries but in their minds and hearts what did they think would become? Did they project it would go for 75 years or longer? We look at the 19 members listed on our list tonight who went to their eternal reward and 25 years from now when this Association comes to its 100th anniversary there will be growth, there will be change, and the Association will become what as you lead as members of this Association to make it become. Those who have gone before us would want us to make good decisions, wise decisions to form a strong Association but as we look at the changes down the years may one thing never change in this Association, may we still continue as we do

today to have the Chaplains of the Association to open each session each day seeking God's guiding hand over this Association. I believe God has blessed this Association and made it what it is today because we have honored him and placed him in the position that we have placed him. And so may we continue to do that throughout the years.

How are we going to guide this Association and what will we do to move it forward? We need to make some courageous decisions and we need to follow some great leaders.

I picked up an article out of an old magazine and there was a statement about that that says this, "Over the desk of General Douglas MacArthur's office at his Manila office are three frames. In one was a portrait of Washington, in another one was a portrait of Lincoln, and in the third was a message which reads as follows:

"'Youth is not a time of life — it is a state of mind. It is a temper of the will, a quality of imagination, a vigor of the emotions, a predominance of courage over timidity, of the appetite for adventure over love of ease.

"'Nobody grows old by merely living a number of years: People grow old by deserting their ideals.

"'Years wrinkle the skin, but to give up enthusiasm wrinkles the soul.

"'Worry, doubt, self-distrust, fear, and despair — these are the long years that bow the head and crush the spirit.

"'Whether seventy or sixteen, there is in everyone's heart the love of wonder, the sweet amazement of the stars and starlike things and thoughts, the undaunted challenge of events, the unfailing childlike hunger for what next in the joy and game of life.

"'When the wires are all down, and the central place of your heart is covered with the snows of pessimism and the ice of cynicism, then certainly you are grown old whatever your years.

"'You are as young as your faith, as

old as your doubt. You are as young as your self-confidence and as old as your fear. You are as young as your hope, as old as your despair.

"'So long as your heart receives messages of beauty, cheer, courage and power, from the earth, from man and from the Infinite, you are young.""

May we continue in this Association to be an Association that grows and is a place where people can come and learn and grow and go out to serve our communities and our towns where we live.

Let us pray. Our heavenly Father, thank you for the privilege to open your word and to see there are landmarks that were set. Throughout your words there are landmarks to read and study and we thank you for the opportunities and I am too open and to see you have said not to remove the old landmarks. And tonight this Association continues to grow. May your hand be on it, may the blessings be on every Chief that is here tonight of firefighter as we go back to our respective communities and serve. May we serve with wisdom, may our hearts ever be young, and pray for those that have given their lives in the line of duty and pray for those who have gone on and pray for the families. Thanks for what you have given us and bless us. Amen.

Several sub-committee meetings were held also throughout the year, including several by the Parade Committee (Chaired by Chief Tom Murphy, Retired of Southington, Connecticut) which was specially formed in celebration of our 75th Anniversary. They did a tremendous job in getting 100 pieces of apparatus of all kinds and vintage to participate. The New England Division had three representatives at most of these meetings as well as the New England Fire Equipment Exhibitors Association.

In response to a letter received from the New England Fire Apparatus Maintenance Association, the Board met with two of their representives to discuss preliminary plans of their joining the conference. It was explained that we were currently evaluating a two-year trial period with the New England Division of the IAFC and would anticipate a similar plan of action with them.

Testimonials and Memorial services were attended by various officers and directors of the Association.

The day-to-day business of the Association was handled by the President and the Secretary/Treasurer and all correspondence was answered or directed to the appropriate committee. This year's receipts exceeded expenses, primarily due to the increase in exhibit space charges for the current Conference. With the increase in income there will also be an increase in expenses of at least \$25,000.00. The line item for Conference receipts will go down by approximately \$10,000.00 due to free admission this year. The only other substantial income is dues which in itself doesn't even pay the salaries. I am recommending to the membership and the Board of Directors that Honorary Life members be assessed a \$10.00 fee for the postage and printing costs. This will also establish an annual communications with each member. In recent months I have received notice of members who have died from six to 11 years ago.

The Board is committed to ensure a budget balance that will provide us a Conference default. After all the Conference receivables and expenses are determined, a financial committee will review our standing and make its recommendations. It should be noted that all of the expenses of the current Conference have been paid for by this Association.

All checks received by the corporation are photocopied and filed. All moneys are deposited on a daily basis in a super saver account, with minimum balances maintained in the checking account to ensure the maximum receipt of interest.

All financial records of the corporation are reviewed or are subject to a full audit if receipts exceed \$100,000.00 by an outside accountant on an annual basis. His findings and a copy of all the expenses and receipt records have been given to the Audit Committee for review. All members of the Audit Committee receive periodic updates on the financial conditions of the Association


At this time, I would like to have the Parade Committee, Retired Chief Tom Murphy, to make a report.





hear a Bylaw change. Chief Baston.

CHIEF RICHARD M. BASTON: [North Yarmouth, ME] Proposed change to the Bylaws. The Connecticut Fire Chiefs' Association, Incorporated, in a letter signed by Chief John Obier dated January 31, 1997, a member of the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Inc., has petitioned the Board of Directors to

change the Bylaws as they pertain to Assistant Chiefs, Deputy Chiefs, and Battalion Chiefs. The Connecticut Fire Chiefs' Association, Incorporated, would like to have the Bylaws permit Assistant Chiefs, Deputy Chiefs, and Battalion Chiefs to have the privilege of a vote in the Association without the privilege of holding office.

The Board of Directors at their meeting on January 24, 1997 voted not to support any change to the Bylaws relative to their proposal at the Annual Meeting to be

held in Springfield in June of '97.

However, as the Connecticut Fire Chiefs' Association, Incorporated has requested a Bylaw change and has met the requirements of the Bylaws for this change request, the Board of Directors requested the Bylaws Committee to develop a change, as requested by the Connecticut Fire Chiefs' Association, Incorporated, which would be voted on at the Annual Meeting to be held in Springfield in June of '97.

The Bylaw Committee has drafted the following change to Article VII, Section 1 B.

This is the change.

"Article VII - Membership.

Section 1 B. Associate Members:

(1) Assistant Chiefs, Deputy Chiefs, and Battalion Chiefs shall be entitled to vote, and to all the privileges of the membership in the corporation, except the right to hold office and as otherwise provided in the Bylaws.

(2) City or Town Officials, Fire Commissioners, or members of fire departments, individuals representing firms and corporations interested in the protection of

life and property against fire.

City or Town Officials, Fire Commissioners, or members of fire departments, individuals representing firms and corporations interested in the protection of life and property against fire shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership in the corporation, except the right to vote and as otherwise provided in these Bylaws." The current Bylaw: "Article VII - Membership. Section 1 B. Associate Members:

(1) City or Town Officials, Fire Commissioners, Assistant or Deputy Chiefs or members of fire departments, individuals representing firms and corporations interested in the protection of life and property against fire.

(2) Associate members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership in the corporation, except the right to vote and as otherwise provided in these Bylaws."

PRESIDENT JORSEY: You have heard the

proposed change to the Bylaws.

CHIEF GERARD A. CARLE, RET: [Dracut, MA] This is a recommendation from the Board on the change in the bylaw?

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Yes, this was.

The Board of Directors voted not to make a change and that was so stated in the report.

CHIEF CARLE: Thank you, I didn't

quite hear that, thank you.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: But Connecticut did resubmit the change and that's why it is coming before the membership today.

CHIEF WEHTER: It is still the same

recommendation from the Board.

CHIEF RICHARD M. BASTON: [North Yarmouth, ME] The Board recommended not to make the change.

CHIEF CARLE: So it still holds

beyond that.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Yes.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: [Lime Rock, RI] I'd have a problem with something like this. It took me 33 years to get to Chief and I probably could have been here 15 years as a Battalion Chief. I consider it an honor to come here to see my kind and vote. I would be opposed to a Bylaw such as this. I think a Chief coming in here and probably becoming a member of the organization and give them the right to vote. I would say if this Bylaw were to change, if it were to change, what wouldn't give these individuals the right next year to come in here and vote to change the Bylaw that

they could run for office so you probably would have a Battalion Chief or a Deputy Chief. I think a Chief is to come in here and wear those 5 Bugles and I think we should defeat that Bylaw.

CHIEF TIMOTHY P. TRAVERS: [Whitman, MA] I also serve as President of the Fire Chiefs Association of Massachusetts. The Fire Chiefs Association of Massachusetts does not allow anybody except the 5-Bugle Chief into their Association and we took a unanimous vote at our caucus here this afternoon to defeat this article.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Thank you. Any other comments at this time? Tom

Murphy.

CHIEF THOMAS J. MURPHY, RET.:

[Southington, CT] As a Director from Connecticut, I was here to answer questions regarding this question last January at the Board of Directors meeting. And following the suggestions and recommendations from the Bylaw Committee, I took the information back to Connecticut and we formulated the Bylaw as you currently see it. What it would do is to cross Trumpet 2, 3, and 4. Cross Trumpets would be given the right to vote, not the right to hold office. To belong to this organization you can join as a Lieutenant, Captain, or any of the line ranks. You can belong as a member, an Associate Member. You can come. Many of us have come for many, many years and you can learn the rudiments and the foundation and precepts of this organization from the grass roots up, true, and when you get to be a 5-Trumpet Chief as I was until retirement very recently, you do not have the right to vote. I feel and the contingent in Connecticut felt overwhelmingly that we were due for a change. As the turn of the century is about to change, the thinking is changing. Education and responsibility has given every officer on the line, particularly the Chief and officers, more responsibility in the chain of command and in the incident command system. This is a reflection of that change.

Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Thank you, Tom. Any other comments? Michael.

CHIEF MICHAEL D. MOONEY: [Gilford, NH] I just want to reflect on the Board of Directors meeting and that one of the biggest reasons why we were against this change is that in Massachusetts and apparently other New England states, that Deputy Chiefs and Battalion Chiefs belong to the union and I think that they could overwhelm the organization, they could take it over. And that was the reason, my main reason why I was against it. I'm not saying I have anything against juniors, I'm saying we're Fire Chiefs and I don't think a union should come in our organization, that was the main reason we were against it. I didn't realize Battalion Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs could belong in New Hampshire and other states. As you know, Massachusetts has the biggest, the biggest membership in this organization and that's the reason why we're against it.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Sidney Thurston. FIRE DIRECTOR SIDNEY F. THURSTON:

[Waterbury Center, VT] Mr. Chairman, being President of the Vermont Chiefs, at their last meeting we voted against the Bylaw change.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Thank you. Chief

Stanley.

CHIEF FREDERICK STANLEY: [Hope Valley, RI] The Rhode Island caucus voted to oppose the change and I make a motion the New England Association of Fire Chiefs oppose the Bylaw change.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Any other remarks? If not, we are going do put it to a

vote.

CHIEF MOONEY: He made a motion to

vote.

CHIEF WEHTER: There is no formal motion before the body for this Bylaw change.

CHIEF MOONEY: He just made a motion

to oppose it.

FROM THE FLOOR: I don't think you can make a negative motion.

PREŠIDENT JORSEY: You have to vote

on this Bylaw.

FROM THE FLOOR: You have to make a

positive motion to defeat.

CHIEF MOONEY: Mr. President, I move the question to vote on it.

CHIEF STANLEY: Somebody has to make

a motion. It calls for a vote.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Motion has been made to vote on this Bylaw change.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: [Lime Rock,

RI] Second.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: If there are no over questions on the petition, we will vote on the motion at this time.

CHIEF ROBERT P. WOOD: [Durham, NH]

Point of order. Can you explain the motion?

What is the yes and what is the no?

PŘESIDENT JORSEY: "Yes" is to accept the change submitted by the Connecticut delegation and "No" is to leave the Bylaw the way it is.

CHIEF WOOD: Thank you, Mr. President. PRESIDENT JORSEY: All those in favor of changing the Bylaws, please signify by saying Yes.

[Yes]

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Will you please stand up so I can just.

[Some members stood.]

And you are all voting members?

Thank you.

Those opposed to changing the Bylaws,

please stand

[Some members stood.]

The Bylaw change is defeated and it will stay the way it is.

Is there any other New Business? CHIEF TIMOTHY P. TRAVERS: [Whitman,

MA] I also served on the Education Committee and this morning after one of the educational seminars I was settling up with two of the speakers who were being cordial. I asked if there was anything else they needed or anything else they would like and one of our speakers Sue Sheehy was the Immediate Past President of the Emergency Nurses Association of Massachusetts. Apparently, there's a Karen

O'Neill whose done extensive work throughout Massachusetts and other states but most recently at Norwood Hospital in Massachusetts. She was a 37-year-old nurse who died very recently of melanoma. And Sue Sheehy asked that we give a small donation to the Karen O'Neill Endowment Scholarship Foundation in her name. That's the only thing Sue Sheehy asked from this Association and I'd like to put it forward in the motion of \$100 to be donated by this Association to Karen O'Neill Endowment Scholarship.

CHIEF RUSSELL B. LACAILLADE:

[Coventry, RI] Second the motion.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Is there any

comment on the motion?

Hearing none, I'd like to take a vote to donate \$100 to the Karen O'Neill

Foundation. All those in favor?

[Aye]

Those opposed?

So moved.

CHIEF TRAVERS: Thank you.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Any other New

**Business?** 

CHIEF WENDALL M. MANSFIELD: [Stowe, VT] I am also on the Exhibits Committee but I would like to see this Association increase the Chairman of the Exhibits Committee salary to \$5,000. If you don't believe it, try to follow him around for a few months. He's earned it.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: I will announce at our Board of Directors meeting before this as of right now his salary is \$5,000. That was done already. I didn't get time to talk to you.

CHIEF CHARLES F. MAURAIS:

[Marblehead, MA] Thank you.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: A very good job,

Charlie.

CHIEF MAURAIS: Thank you.

[Applause]

Linda will be happy.

CHIEF LACAILLADE: Not to get Mike angry at me for saying that, but with everything Charlie does, is \$2,000 really

appropriate. I'd like to see — he's been doing it for 10 years and he does a super job — I certainly think we have enough money to kick it up to 7 that I think is a more reasonable amount of money. I would like to make a motion to you to increase it to \$7,000 and not 5.

FROM THE FLOOR: I second that.
PRESIDENT JORSEY: Don't you think
the Board of Directors, that it should go to
the Board of Directors and let them do it?

CHIEF LACAILLADE: If that's the way you've set the salary in the past, I wasn't aware of that.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Charlie's salary came to the Board of Directors.

CHIEF LACAILLADE: How if I recommend my motion to recommend it to you?

PRESIDENT JORSEY: We will see to that at the first meeting.

CHIEF LACAÏLLADE: Thank you. CHIEF FREDERICK STANLEY: [Hope

Valley, RI] I would like to appropriate \$1,000 for the hospitality suite in Dallas.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: That was a motion? CHIEF STANLEY: Yes.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: [Lime Rock,

RI] Second the motion.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Any comments on the motion?.

CHIEF MOONEY: I would recommend we not vote to donate \$1,000 to the hospitality room in Dallas for the simple reason of what was told to us at the New England Division meeting yesterday that they do not donate money to their hospitality room because vendors pay for it, they don't pay for it and they end up by kicking in the rest. My recommendation is to let the vendors pay whatever they have to pay and if you have to pay come back to us, we'll be glad to split it with you. I can't see kicking in now when we don't know what the expenses are.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: We discussed it with the Board of Directors and if you don't have enough money, come back to us and at the first Board of Directors meeting we'll discuss

CHIEF STANLEY: I'll withdraw my motion as that's the better way.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: While we are talking about the International Association of Fire Chiefs, we do have Chief Bob DiPoli and Chief Luther Fincher here from the International who will be running for Second Vice President. Please stand up and be recognized

[Applause]
And I wish you both the best.
Any other New Business?
CHIEF JOHN P. JENKINS: [West]

Barnstable, MAl I think it was a little embarrassing earlier to note that when the motion was put forward with respect to the Secretary/ Treasurer's salary and Mike's comment about the fact that the Board of Directors hadn't discussed it. It's probably not in order to do a Bylaw change but I would make a motion that the body recommend to the Board of Directors that they annually come in to this meeting with a statement as to what the Secretary/Treasurer's current salary is as well as any other current salaries and a recommendation to the body as to what we should do at the meeting so a figure can be either voted up or voted down or increased or decreased, whatever the body thinks. But I think the Board of Directors must come in annually with a recommendation and I would so move.

CHIEF GERARD A. CARLE, RET: [Dracut, MA] Second.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: The Board of Directors report at the Annual Meeting of the salary of the Secretary/Treasurer and the Exhibit Committee Chairman so it could be looked at at the Annual Meeting so it can be amended or leave it the same.

CHIEF LAWRENCE LAMSON, RET: [Hamilton, MA] I think anything such as salary expenses like that should go through the Board of Directors first, that's what we have them for.

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Thank you for your

comment. The motion was made by Chief Jenkins and there was a second by Gerry Carle. I would like to have a vote on that, please. All those in favor?

[Ave]

Those opposed?

So moved.

Any other New Business?

CHIEF GERARD A. CARLE, RET: [Dracut,

MA] Hearing none, I move to adjourn.

FIRE DIRECTOR SIDNEY THURSTON:

[Waterbury Center, VT] For an outstanding job this past year and in your tenure as President, and all the growing pains and all that sort of stuff, the organization would like to present you with this ring. Wear it proudly as it is well-earned and if you have to use it on anybody, go ahead.

[Laughter]

PRESIDENT JORSEY: Thank you very

much.

[President Jorsey put the ring on and showed it to the members.]

[Standing ovation]

PRESIDENT JORSEY: I thank you all.

At this time, I'd like to say thank you to Secretary/Treasurer Chief Wehter for his outstanding job. It's hard to believe what has to be done to make this thing work. Our communications went very well. This year we were on the phone practically all the time and that's how the phone bill gets so big.

Thank you, Dick.

And Charlie on the Exhibit Committee, I would like to thank you, you really took off —



PRESIDENT JORSEY: The New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Incorporated, 1997 Conference and Exposition, June 27th - July 2d, 1997, Springfield, Mass. The Chief James L. Grote Scholarship Award. The New England Association of Fire Chiefs was organized on July 12, 1922 for the purpose of promoting the education and training needs of the Fire Service in New England. CHIEF JORSEY: It's a pleasure. CHIEF HEALEY: I'm sure the young

lady gets that because it's \$750.

The time has come to introduce the guest speaker for this evening, Judge Kevin Kennedy, who comes from Colchester, Connecticut. Judge Kennedy has been a volunteer firefighter for 23 years in the Colchester-Hayward Fire Department and he is still active. He has served as an EMT for 21 years and an Emergency Medical Services instructor. For 19 years, Kevin has also worked as the 9-1-1 dispatcher for four years.

Kevin's education includes a Bachelor's degree in economics and business; a Master's of Business Administration in finance and accounting; a Doctor of Law; a Master's of Law in taxation.

In addition to his judicial capacity, Kevin has been on the faculty of the Connecticut Police Academy for 12 years; and a Director of the Narcotics Information and Enforcement Officers Association.

Kevin travels throughout the U.S. lecturing to fire, police, and EMS personnel as well as on public safety, and legal consulting on an individual basis. I've been

to several of Kevin's seminars and he is well worth listening to. Kevin Kennedy

[Applause]

JÜDGE KEVIN KENNEDY: Thank you. For those that have heard me speak before, this is going to have a lot less substance than usual and a lot more fluff because this is not a classroom sitting. For those of you who haven't heard me speak before, let's put it this way, you're warned.

[Laughter]

It's a little on the dicey side. I won't come out and blatantly use four-letter words unless I have to and if you are not getting the joke, then I will use the four-letter words but I will stay on the fringes as best I can.

Tonight's get together is very, very special because it is the 75th but more than that and I don't know why the 75th is special, what's wrong with the 73d or 78th? There is nothing special about a 75th that we have to give the diamond attribute. There is something more special and it is a marriage of sorts. As a Judge I have officiated at many weddings and as Father Foley and Reverend Chalk will tell you, we just officiate, we just officiate, we are just the witnesses of the wedding taking place. I'm just the civil person and these folks are representing God and I'm representing a constitution. Who am I?

[Laughter]

My Constitution is governed by nine old farts down in Washington —

[Laughter]

— and who knows what they are feeling this week, depending on what they had for breakfast anyway.

[Laughter]

And when I have to witness a wedding, I have to give them a pep talk. That's kind of my job, I have to give them a pep talk because I am bringing together two people from diverse backgrounds and give them a push into the pond and say "Go." That's what we are doing tonight, we're doing that tonight because we're uniting two organizations to

take off and do further projects as one. And there might be some hard feelings from the past but, more importantly, there has to be a recognition. You have to look at yourself in the mirror and recognize there are past very, very diverse backgrounds and even the geography involved is huge. Think about what you have working for you right now. Even before I get there, we have two organizations right now and possibly even the mechanics group coming in at a future date, so instead of this being a marriage this may become a menage a trois pretty soon —

[Laughter].

— and this might be interesting and you might want to hold a camera if it really gets good — and if there is going to be that union or a menage a trois, in order to be a full union you have to give a blank to give a blank. That's terrible and you can't just sit back and wait to have it come back at you. You have to give something up and there has to be a compromise. And there will be compromise as there is in any marriage.

When you are giving someone the marriage pep talk, it is not like leaving the cap off the toothpaste. That really ticks you off, there are much more substantial issues that have to be worked out with the people in this room and they are going to be worked out by the people in this room. But if they are not going to be worked out, everyone in this room is going to fail. It's pretty simple. And if you want to get ahead, you will find a way to work together.

Look at your backgrounds, all the way from Calais, Maine to Fairfield, Connecticut, wow! You might as well be foreigners. All the way from Burlington, Vermont to Newport, Rhode Island and that might as well be Mars too. Because if you have driven to any place you will see the needs of New England are crazy. By "crazy" I mean very, very diverse. You can go up to where there are trees and bunny rabbits in New Hampshire and Maine and then go into Fairfield County in Connecticut where there are no trees or down in New Haven

where you don't get out of your car.

[Laughter]

You drive through very quickly and even if you get flat tires you keep driving.

[Laughter]

But there is this huge new territory, Bridgeport —

[Laughter]

— you better lock the doors right now and take attendance because everything else that I have to say is going to revolve around the people in this room. We are so used to and so geared to helping all the other people in public safety, and that's what we do, we train and help other people. Tonight we had better learn how to help ourselves. And if you gave me the exclusive right of a territory the size of New England, and I don't care what it's for, I don't care if you gave me the right to sell photocopy machines, my pants would be damp —

[Laughter]

She liked that.

[Laughter]

 because having an exclusive right over that much territory is a powerful tool.

Imagine the clout these two groups put together will have when it comes to talking with vendors for vendors space, negotiating with hotels for hotel contracts. Working out the logistics and that whole idea of one plus one equals three is synergy and you can make a synergistic effect by working out your differences. And that's what we call compromise. And if we can do that, a lot of this other stuff will fall into place.

Getting back to marriage, if we're going to have a marriage and if the third group comes in — and I also want you to respect your vendors. That should not be discounted as they are very much a part of the synergistic process because they are the background of your Conference and they are going to and I don't want to, say, dictate the terms because I don't want any one member of the partnership or the union to be the dictator of the terms. But they are going to

be certainly one component that goes into the formula that dictates what's going to be the end product.

And if maybe some of the input that I heard while walking around on the beautiful floor the last couple of days is maybe Saturday, Sunday time, O.K., instead of Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, maybe Friday, Saturday, Sunday, Monday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday, maybe something else, but these are things that should be considered because to just give your vendors a deaf ear is to cut off your nose to spite your face. It's going to hurt. If you have a marriage, you have a commitment.

I'm going to run two columns and I am going to compare them and the difference between unified and segregated. By being unified in a marriage, you have a commitment. If all you are after was sex, well, yeah, I guess you can form a contract and I guess you can buy it somewhere.

Chief Cassanelli certainly gave me some addresses here in Springfield.

[Laughter]

Something tells me a fifth alarm is not a fire, it's over by the police station off Pearl Street by the fire station.

[Laughter]

And if you form a contract for sex, I suppose why buy a cow when there is a prostitute on every corner? But the person then becomes a prostitute whereas there is a commitment and the person is a spouse and the reciprocity is the mutuality in the marriage, whereas there is no reciprocity in the service with a prostitute because it is just for service and it is done. And if that is what you want to form between the two organizations, well, go for it, just as long as you know that going in you can do that. You can contractually arrange between two or three organizations or the vendors group. You can arrange for whatever you want, knowing full well when it's done, it's done. Just like sex with a prostitute. When it's done, it's done. But when you want that lasting commitment, then be prepared to enter into a marriage with each other. And if your prepared to enter into a marriage with each other, then be prepared to make the compromises from the get-go. Even in the best of marriages they sometimes fall apart. And that's where the Constitution -Idon't know if you can get a divorce now, but you can get a divorce and it just gets messy and expensive. We've all heard the horror stories of getting a divorce so if we have the two fire associations, maybe three organizations, maybe the vendors, and if you want to later disentangle because you find you are in each others' pockets too much, then it becomes a very expensive proposition to undo that. It becomes very difficult and then you have to find, just like in a contract, you have to find grounds for a divorce or annulment.

I didn't know until this morning that the church, for divorce, up until the 12th Century, and that included if your spouse went into the priesthood, that would be grounds. I could buy that, that's winner of those manmade laws and I'll probably get it on both sides of the table here.

But if you were marrying someone 75 years old and marginally wealthy, wouldn't it be prudent to have a prenuptial agreement? Especially in this day and age. Whose that blond bimbo who married that rich oil man? What's her name — whatever. Yeah, she married him for nothing more than a few million.

And this is a 75-year-old organization that is markedly wealthy and before it enters into any wedding vows with any other organization or any other group or any vendors association, you might want to consider a prenuptial agreement. Not to say that anybody who enters into a prenuptial agreement has already doomed their marriage for divorce. It's just to lay out the ground rules as to what might happen or will happen should the situation end up in a divorce. It's better that you get it all spelled out in advance so there are no hurt feelings later

because otherwise you might find yourself taken over a barrel because somebody married you for your money. And that's a mutuality arrangement too because that works both ways. Because each of you has something that the other doesn't have and that's exposure and membership lists. All those things are important.

Today is your honeymoon. Well, that makes tonight, well, you know what, and the today is your honeymoon.

Oh, that reminds me about the golfers. I'm not a golfer. You know the difference between a G shot and a golf ball, most men will look for 10 minutes at a golf ball and if today is the honeymoon, tonight is the rest of the story.

[Laughter].

And what you do with it from here is very, very important. What do you want to do with it? Do you want to sit around and talk about it or do you want to start dealing? And dealing is when you start getting down to the real issues, not like leaving the cap off the toothpaste. You are getting down to the real thing, the things that matter. And I am not saying you have to have a position of strength. This has nothing to do with clout because if either party enters a marriage from the position of strength or clout or thinks they do, it's wrong, that's very wrong and they're in for a world of surprise when that happens. Because neither party has to have clout doesn't mean that both parties have to have equal strength because that would be absurd. None of us have equal strength nor should be. That's why a car luckily has only one steering wheel. Thank God for that. If you ever want to have a real experiment with your partner or co-worker or anyone, make a piece of paper and call this the control card and whoever is in control of the control card is in control that day. Pawn it off on the other person and see what they had. They would probably freak out. It's the instant command. It's dumping a load on someone who doesn't want to take it. You hand them the

football and say "Run." Try giving your spouse, who is not used to balancing the checkbook, the checkbook to balance.

Now I have to make a distinction before I go any further and that's the difference between knowledge and wisdom. Knowledge is just collecting a number of facts. Facts are just crap we learned, just crap from our surroundings? We're bombarded with crap all day long and the best way to put it, the way Mark Twain gave it to me, that is when a cat jumps up on a hot stove and jumps off, that's knowledge. But when he refuses to jump up on a cold stove, now, that's wisdom.

[Laughter]

Because he learned. Now, that's education.

And now we have to get into the membership in this room. No offense, folks, but you're old, you're real old.

[Laughter]

I mean some of you are real old.

[Laughter].

I was sitting next to some guys this morning, and I won't tell you which class because you know who they are. But, shit, I was going to put a mirror in front of your mouth to see if there was air still coming out.

[Laughter]

And that's got to stop. We have to start bringing in because if you don't bring in the next generation, what are we going to be left with? You can't end a sentence with a preposition. What are we going to be left? We are going to be left? Some of these people. No shit.

I was walking up the aisles of the trade show and I thought there was going to be a Beltone for hearing aids because if you look around, there is a hearing aid for every table in this room. Some people have stereos on but it depends because you look around at the average age in this room and it's got to stop because if you don't start bringing up this next generation, you think they can bring themselves up, and I am just making the distinction between knowledge and wisdom. It doesn't necessarily mean if you are old you're

necessarily smart because there are a lot of dumb bastards.

[Laughter]

And invariably I'm behind them on the highway. But I also don't want you to think when a young shit goes to school he is smart because as my friend Mark Twain said, "Don't let schooling get in front of your education." Because there is more to schooling than hanging around the classroom. And there is more to job training than doing it. I want you to draw the distinction between what you are bringing into the next generation. This is your 75th. I don't even care what you are going to be on your 100th. I probably won't be there. But where are you going to be on your 80th, that's more important to make. How many in this room plan on being here for the 80th? It's tough and it's very realistic that we might see a 20 percent turn over in the next five or 10 years because of the average age in this room. And are we preparing the next generation?

Now, I also know a lot of people in this room and in the class this morning that are Retired Chiefs and are actively involved in this stuff. How do we pass down to the next generation and that's the control card and things like that I told you, but most of all it goes to just delegate, give it away to somebody who is going to do it. Find the do-ers and give it to them. If you are too old, stand aside. I'm not saying you have to, you know, go away, go to Florida and if you are that old, well, how do you know if you are that old if you are on the back 9 and the clubhouse is in sight and you are there?

[Laughter]
And you are going to have to decide for yourself when it's time to step aside because lessening up on the reins I know because this is what I do. I unfortunately take the reins away from a lot of people and from their personal decision whether or not it is institutionalization or taking their driver's license away or making a personal decision and it's tough, tough stuff and I don't take it

lightly and I don't joke about it lightly. But it is far more important I would much rather take the keys away and the driver's license away than go out and hurt somebody. Nobody wants to take the keys away because if you have an elderly parent nobody wants to be the parent and take the keys away from them but you all know it has to be done but nobody has the guts to go and take the keys away because you know dad is too old and blind and doesn't have the reflexes any more. And we have the same thing in our Departments and in our organizations. And now we're trying to take organizations that don't pass down energized leadership and we're trying to marry them together and we are starting in a position of weakness. And I started with a position of strength and now we are to weakness.

I don't want anybody to go into marriage with a position of weakness. I want you to look in the mirror before you enter into a marriage with a couple of other organizations or vendors group or whatever you plan on doing. I am not telling you what to do. I am telling you to do it with your eyes wide open with full knowledge and ready to go.

This morning I heard a lecture on focusing for about the millionth time and each person presents it a different way but each time it makes sense. Each one of us has to take the time to focus. You can call it reflexion, you can call it meditation, you can call it anything you want, but it's focusing on what our personal goals are and what the goals of the group are, whether your individual Fire Department or this organization or any other organization you belong to. And my definition is convergent pathways. Convergent on what they have to converge on, a point or a thing, but what are we converging on? What should we be thinking about tonight? What are we planning for? Where are we going?

Well, I don't want you to say, "Next year's Conference," that's the definite wrong answer. I don't want you to plan next year's Conference tonight because I don't give a crap about last year's or next year's Conference because having next year's Conference is not our purpose in life. Let's not lose sight of our purpose. Our purpose is to serve our population, our customers, our taxpayers who need us for public safety, fire, and EMS and become probably a greater component of fire than fire is a component of fire. We have a patient population and taxpayers and buildings and all kinds of things that need to be protected. Those are what we should be focusing on and how are we going to do that. Worrying about planning about next year's Conference isn't going to help us get there.

I need you to take a look at some of that in a point that was made in this morning's talk. In this morning's talk, the speaker from Overland, Kansas, I forgot his name already, and he asked to name some leaders in history and of course some of the old people around, they said Roosevelt, oh, yeah, Teddy. No, no, the other one.

[Laughter]

And in order to get to have a perspective, now I teach perspective. This way I put a coffee cup you right there and I put a coin next to it. It's very simple. And in order to teach perspective, there are only two things in the world. There is stuff which is the stuff of the coin and our view of stuff, how we perceive it. The people on this side of the room might be able to see that coin better or differently than the people on this side of the room, who may not be able to see it at all. So these people may be able to identify that coin and these people may not. It doesn't make these people any smarter or any stupider or maybe it is coincidence or maybe it is not coincidence. The difference between this group of people and this group of people is the perspective. The stuff hasn't changed. The coffee cup has not changed and the coin hasn't changed. The only thing that makes these people different is their view of life. The best way to make these people change their perspective is to have them walk

over here and they will be as smart as these people. All we have to do is just change our perspective sometimes because we don't have to change the stuff. Nor will some of the stuff ever change. Some of the stuff is immovable and we are not going to change it. But if we can just change your view of it a little bit we'll now become as smart as these people over here and then we can see their way. And if you see somebody's point of view, it makes compromise and reasoning a hell of a lot easier.

I stole a great line from George Carlin. Some people see the glass half empty and some see the glass as half full. I see the glass as just too big. Nobody ever thought of

that possibility.

And it's that kind of third way of thinking about a new way of viewing a problem. It's not weird or unique, it's just a different way. We're so used to thinking one way, but with our blinders off and seeing a different way. Great. How did you do it? I don't know. Shake up the status quo. Question everything because if any of you have ever sat on one of my three-hour talks, you know one of my expressions is, "Because we've always done it that way, goddamn it," and that I write on the blackboard. And if you ask a question of the higher-ups in your Department and they answer you by saying, "Because we've always done it that way, goddamn it," and that means we're going to continue to do it that way. That's not reasoning. I want my answers reasoned. I deserve to have them reasoned. My public, my patient population in back of the ambulance deserves a better answer because if we took you to the old reasons we'd be putting car fires out with acoustic lines. And we need some people to not surprise up and comers with their new ideas and bring them up. And that's where the word pathways, for those taking notes and I can see you are rapidly taking notes. The pathways is my kind of route of exchange. How do you get this stuff that you learned in the last three or four days down on the bay floor? Don't tell me you

send it to a training committee because if you ever want to bury something you send it to a committee. It will never come back alive. You'll have a chart and then you send it to a review committee, the finance committee, and everybody gets his hands on it. Pretty soon you will not be able to recognize it. You may have learned a lot of things in the last three days or two-and-a-half days — I can't count.

So wrapping it up, you've got the chance, you've got, you, everybody in this room, has the chance to put together a huge synergy for New England. If you screw it up, God help you because there is nobody who can screw it up except the people in this room because, like I said, if you gave me an exclusive right, imagine how many vendors want to talk to you if you are the only show in town, if you have the only show east of Syracuse, imagine how much they want to talk to you, imagine how well you can do with them, imagine how well you can do with each other. I don't care if you are selling watermelons, I don't care what you are doing, but imagine if you are buying a fire truck and I think you have some buying power now and I think it will work to everyone's benefit. I think the vendors would like it. They don't want to be like roadies in a dog-and-pony show. I feel sorry for vendors who have to throw out literature that is just wasted in five minutes.

But I also want you to be good draw and have good shows because you had a beautiful facility in these last few days. And you can start to put that kind of muscle together now. You've got now, you've got the whole package and one plus one does equal three because the synergy does work both ways. The marriage is working. There is that mutuality and everything is clicking and now you are firing on all cylinders. That's great because now, now is where the big kicker comes in because if you've got that kind of horsepower, now you can do what I learned in Delaware. I was doing the Delaware Fire Conference and I was teaching or speaking in a

room like this and in the room also next to me in the hotel was Senator Biden. You remember Senator Joe Biden from the Clarence Thomas confirmation hearings. And Senator Biden and Senator North from Delaware, and keep in mind Delaware is the smallest state, and Senator Biden made a point to come and stand right at my doorway where I was speaking. Now, I wanted to meet him and he wanted to speak with me and we started to bandy some ideas back and forth. And he throws a huge party at his house for the firefighters, a huge party for all firefighters because he has a huge estate. Keep in mind it is a small state and only one county has a career Department in the whole state out of three counties.

And Senator Biden said to me in no uncertain terms, there are three parties: Democrats, Republicans and firefighters and if you don't kiss the firefighter's ass, you don't have a chance. Now, that's clout because if you get blessed at the county chiefs meeting and your name gets passed around by three county chiefs, when Senator Biden comes up for election every six years he's in because in the whole State of Delaware everybody is a firefighter or is related to one and every state gets two senators because of population.

Now, wouldn't it be great in New Hampshire, Vermont or Maine that you can have three parties: Democrats, Republicans, and firefighters? If we ever get down to two parties, Democrats and firefighters, at least you can expand your horizon a little bit.

[Laughter]

I better keep that quiet. But we are,

everybody in this room is.

With that out of the way, the only thing left is like Nike says, "Just do it." And here's my challenge to you. It's pretty simple. Five days from now or four days from now set your goals. I'm going to give you a chance to get home and go get through the 4th of July weekend, five days, I'll give you a week from today to set your goals. Have them up and running within 45 days. Don't send it

off to a committee, just do it. You're better off taking your chances than sitting on your hands.

I'm not saying that you are to come here to just enjoy yourself. You should, you should have a little time to enjoy and have a couple of drinks and play golf, whatever. But your municipalities sent you here, you are sent here to learn from. That's who you work for and that's who I work for. We bust our 20 asses when they bust theirs. And that's our whole goal. Let's not lose sight of that. Our. We are to preserve life and property, in that order.

145,000 feet of floor space filled in the last couple of days, wow! But even if you have done all these terrific things it doesn't mean shit unless you can put it to use so get out there and use it. Be proud of the 75th. I'm not saying don't be proud and pat each other on the back. Enjoy your honeymoon but work at this marriage because it is a marriage and it is going to require work unless of course you opt not to make it a marriage. If you want out and all you want is the mere sex of the prostitute, by all means enter into a contractual operation so you know what you are getting into from the get-go. If you want that mutuality, that good dependency, good dependency, go for it but work at it and be prepared to work. Work at it.

Thank you. If I offended anybody I'm


sorry my language is rough.

#### REPORT OF THE ORGANIZATION MEETING

By Secretary J.W. O'Hearn

Boston, Mass., July 12, 1922

Thirty-eight men interested in fire departments, consisting of Chiefs, ex-Chiefs, and manufacturers of fire department equipment, met this afternoon at the office of The Gamewell Fire Alarm Telegraph Company, 200 Devonshire Street, Boston, to discuss the advisability of forming an organization to include all persons interested in fire departments with the purpose in view of discussing, planning and adopting fire fighting methods and standards.

The meeting was called to order at 1.45 P.M. by Chief John P. Doyle of Wellesley who briefly outlined what was expected and the purpose of the meeting.

Ex-Chief Reuben Weekes of Providence, Rhode Island, was nominated for temporary chairman but declined to serve as such. Chief John P. Hoyle was then nominated and elected temporary Chairman.

Chief John W. O'Hearn of Watertown, Massachusetts, was nominated and elected Temporary Secretary.

Chief John F. Leonard of Belmont moved that the association be now organized as a permanent association to be known as the New England Association of Fire Chiefs. After some slight discussion as to name best suited Chief Leonard's motion was unanimously adopted.

Chief John P. Doyle then read Constitution and By-Laws which he had prepared. Some discussion arose as to reading each section at a time or reading them as a whole. It was decided to read them as a whole first and then discuss articles should anyone so desire. Chief Barard of Artic, Rhode Island, moved to adopt constitution and By-Laws as read with the following amendment made on motion of Chief Stanton: Article 3, Section 4, of the constitution struck out, Section 1 of the By-Laws add at the end of the last line "in advance". Motion to adopt was carried unanimously.

Chief Tracey of Woburn moved that we proceed to the election of officers. Carried.

Chief Leonard of Belmont moved that the present acting officers be made permanent.

Carried.

Chief Pierce of Arlington, Massachusetts, nominated Chief Howard Stanton of Norwich, Connecticut, for First Vice-President. Chief Stanton declined same.

Mr. F.M. Tiffany nominated Chief John Moran of Hartford, Connecticut, and he was elected First Vice-President.

Chief Patrick Hurley of Holyoke, Massachusetts, was elected Second-Vice President.

The following were elected State Vice-Presidents:

Chief Charles French, Manchester, New Hampshire.

Chief Daniel E. Johnson, Bridgeport, Connecticut.

Chief Carl D. Stockwell, Burlington, Vermont.

Chief Almus D. Butler, Portland, Maine.

Chief A.G. Cote, Woonsocket, Rhode Island.

In addition to the President and Secretary by virtue of office the following were elected to the Board of Directors:

Ex-Chief Reuben D. Weekes, Providence, Rhode Island, three years.

Ex-Chief Peter E. Walsh, Boston, Massachusetts, two years.

Chief James E. Smith, Nashua, New Hampshire, one year.

On July 17 Director Reuben D. Weekes wrote President Doyle that it was impossible for him to serve as a Director and tendered his resignation which was accepted. Chief George L. Johnson of Waltham was elected to the vacancy.

Chief David A. Decourcey of Winchester, Massachusetts, was elected Sergeant-at-Arms.

Moved by Chief Johnson that the office of Secretary and Treasurer be combined for the time being and it was so voted.

Meeting adjourned at 3.10 P.M. after which all retired to the roof of the building where a group photograph was taken.

#### Secretary O'Hearn continuing:

On June 1, 1923, Director Peter E. Walsh of Boston, Massachusetts, because of private business found it impossible to continue as a Director of the Association.

President Doyle advanced Director James E. Smith of Nashua, New Hampshire, who was serving the one year term, to the vacancy in the two year term caused by the resignation of Director Walsh.

Chief Daniel E. Johnson of Bridgeport, Connecticut, was appointed to the vacancy in the one year term caused by the advancement of Chief Smith.

Mr. President and Members: It may be of interest to the members of the Association to know how many paid members we have to June 15, the date on which I closed my books. We have by States the following number:

This makes a total of 119 members.

It appears to me that the Association should have some fixed date for closing the books. For this reason I took it upon myself to close the books June 15 in order to make a report to this convention.

In connection with the membership fee I desire at this time to make the following motion: That all persons eligible for membership in the Association who have paid at least one assessment of \$3.00 between July 12, 1922, the date of organization, to and including June 1, 1923 be and are hereby considered as having paid dues in advance to June 1, 1924. The motion was accepted.

# BYLAWS NEW ENGLAND ASSOCIATION OF FIRE CHIEFS, INC.

#### As amended 06/25/96

#### **ARTICLE I**

- Section 1. This organization shall be known as the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Incorporated.
- Section 2. The purpose for which the corporation is formed are as follows:
- A. To operate as a non-profit corporation; to encourage and cooperate in the development of new techniques, equipment and practices; to promote more effective organizations and functions of the Firefighting Service, with a view toward greater protection of life and property from the dangers of fire and other hazards
- B. To aid in the dissemination of information among the Fire Chiefs of New England concerning: newly developed equipment and procedures for fighting fires and carrying out the other functions of the fire service; special hazards and problems presented by the development of new industrial and scientific processes and equipment; disasters caused by natural or human origin; practices in particular areas in the administration of Fire Departments; other matters affecting and concerning the fire service.
- C. To provide the means for: an exchange of ideas between its members; conducting of conferences between the members and with those having specialized knowledge on particular matters effecting the fire service; and the study of matters by its committees.
- D. To provide facilities and operate testing grounds for the display, demonstration and testing of equipment required and techniques of operation used in the fire service.
- E. To cooperate with the manufacturers and dealers in equipment used in the fire service with a view toward the dissemination of information to the fire service on the various devices available, and the development of better and more standardized equipment.
- F. To represent the interests of those in the profession of firefighting before legislative and other bodies considering matters in which they are concerned.

- G. To make charitable donations, including memorial and sickness remembrances, to members and their families, and other persons and communities who suffer financial hardships and losses through death, sickness, injury, conflagrations, and catastrophes.
- H. To receive gifts, and bequests, raise such monies and own such real property as is necessary for the advancement of the foregoing purposes.

#### ARTICLE II

Section 1. Whenever required to effectuate the meaning or intent here of, the singular shall include the plural, the masculine shall include the feminine, and vice-versa.

#### **ARTICLE III - THE OFFICERS**

Section 1. The officers of the corporation shall consist of a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer and a Director from each of the six New England States. All officers shall hold their office for one year or until their successors have been elected. The offices of president, first vice president, second vice president will be on a rotation basis from the six New England States (Maine, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Connecticut, and Vermont). The President, the First Vice President, Second Vice President and Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected by ballot at the Annual Meeting. A member shall be an active member in accordance with Article VII Section 1a when elected to office, except the Secretary/Treasurer may be an Honorary Life Member.

A candidate for election as a Director must be an active member in accordance with Article VII Section 1 a and a resident of the particular state which said Director will represent. He shall be nominated and elected by the members of that state.

All Active and honorary Life Members shall be eligible to vote for all elective officers.

#### ARTICLE IV - THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall consist of officers as provided by Article I and the past President who will serve as a member of the Board for one year. The exhibit chairperson shall be a non-voting member of the Board of Directors. The Board shall meet at such a time

and place as may be designated by the president. The actual expenses of the board, which includes travel at a mileage set by the Board of Directors each year, shall be paid by the corporation. Each member of the board shall have one vote, the holding of more than one office notwithstanding.

Section 2. The Past President, the First Vice President, and the Second Vice President shall constitute the Auditing Committee. The Auditing Committee will see that the books have been audited by an outside auditing firm each year before the annual meeting.

#### **ARTICLE V - DUTIES**

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the corporation, and the Board of Directors and shall be the official representative and spokesman of the Association. He shall call special meetings of the Board of Directors when so requested by the majority of the Board of Directors or whenever he deems such a meeting is necessary, provided that a minimum of a three day notice of said meeting shall be given and the reasons therefor. The President shall appoint all committees. All committee members shall be active members in accordance with Article VII Section 1a at the time of appointment. He shall perform such other duties as may be incidental to the office.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the First Vice President to perform the duties of the President during his absence. He shall assist the President in conducting the business and policies of the Association and perform such other duties as prescribed by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall assist the President and First Vice President to perform the duties of their office and in the absence of the President and the First Vice President, assume all the duties and responsibilities of the President.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Secretary/Treasurer to keep a complete record of the proceedings of special and annual meetings of the corporation, the meetings of the Board of Directors; and the standing committees, of which he shall be an ex-officio member; to receive and answer all communications pertaining to the corporation; cause to be prepared a full report of the proceedings of each annual meeting, which shall be printed and one or more copies, mailed by him to each member of the corporation. He shall receive all communications, contributed papers on topics, etc., designed to be presented to the meeting. He shall collect all monies due the corporation. The Secretary/Treasurer shall have the custody of the funds of the corporation; he shall keep a true account of all monies received and disbursed; pay all bills and at the Annual Meeting of the corporation and before all regular and special meetings

make a full and correct report of the same. He shall also employ such assistance as he may need for the collection of dues at the annual meeting and report the proceedings of the same and other such expenditures for clerical assistance at other times as may be approved by the Board of Directors. He shall execute a bond to the corporation in the sum of One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000.00) Dollars to be approved by the Board of Directors, the expense of procuring the same to be borne by the corporation. The consultant fee of the Secretary/Treasurer to be fixed annually at the meeting of the corporation and a pay schedule will be determined by the Board of Directors. He shall also perform such other duties as shall be assigned to him by the President and the Board of Directors. He or any other officer shall not assume an individual indebtedness exceeding One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars without the approval of the Board of Directors. He shall be sworn to the faithful performance of his duties upon taking office. The Secretary/Treasurer shall prepare for adoption by the Board of Directors a list of members eligible for Honorary Life Membership.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to transact all the business of the corporation during the time intervening between the annual meetings. They shall have the full power to expunge from the minutes before printing, anything which is objectionable to the corporation or its members. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occurring by death or otherwise during the time from one annual meeting to another and the replacement shall be chosen from the state involved after conferring with the last President of the NEAFC from that state; and may vote by two- thirds of the total number of Directors to remove any officer for cause. A quorum of five (5) Directors shall be required to transact any business. The Board of Directors shall have the power to make charitable donations, including memorial and sickness remembrances to members and their families, and other persons and communities, who suffer financial losses and hardships through death. sickness, injury, conflagration and catastrophes. The Board of Directors shall meet at least quarterly at a time, place, and date set by the President.

Section 6. The clerk of the corporation shall be the director from Massachusetts. The clerk shall perform the duties required under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for corporations.

#### **ARTICLE VI - ANNUAL MEETING**

Section 1. The annual meeting of the corporation shall be held each year during the month of June in conjunction with the annual conference, at such date and place designated by the Board of Directors, notification of the site to be announced to the members of the corporation at the

annual meeting. Proposals of sites for the annual meeting/conference shall be forwarded to the secretary not less than five days prior to the start of the annual meeting/conference by a member of the association or a company or corporation in business for this purpose. Proposals shall describe the features of the site, amenities and services to be provided and the cost that would be applicable for the current year that the proposal was presented. The cost information is for comparison purposes only. All site proposals shall be investigated by a site committee as appointed by the President. Proposed sites must be at a fully sprinklered facility and in compliance with state fire codes. This committee shall submit all information relative to the proposals to the secretary for disposition as provided above.

Section 2. A special meeting of the corporation may be called by the Board of Directors upon at least ten (10) days notice by mail to the members, said notice stating the time, place and purpose of said special meeting.

Section 3. The exhibit hall and the apparatus display shall at all times be under the sole control of the Exhibit Committee under such rules as the Board of Directors may adopt.

Section 4. A registration fee shall be charged every member registering at the annual meeting, the amount to be determined by the Board of Directors. A registration fee shall be charged every non-member registering at the annual meeting, the amount to be determined by the Board of Directors. Entrance to the exhibit hall or educational sessions will require a registration badge or a day pass.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall have full power to levy an assessment and collect from the members an amount sufficient to cover the entire expense of the annual meeting.

Section 6. All proposed changes in the By-Laws and/or resolution to be presented at the annual meeting of the corporation shall be forwarded to the Secretary not less than sixty (60) days prior to the date of such meeting. All proposals shall be sent to each member by mail, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the meeting. All proposals shall be posted in the vicinity of the registration area. A special meeting of the corporation shall be held on the first full day of the annual meeting/conference at which time the proposals shall be read. The proposals shall be voted on the last full day of the annual meeting/conference. A 2/3 vote of the members present and entitled to vote and voting shall be necessary for adoption. The membership by majority vote may request a secret ballot.

Section 7. A portion of the Annual Conference shall be set apart for

the holding of a memorial service in the memory of departed members at an appropriate time and setting as designated by the Association Chaplins and approved by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. Nomination and election of officers, shall be by secret ballot on the last full day of the annual meeting/conference. All officers elected will be installed at the annual banquet which shall be held on the evening of the last full day of the annual meeting/conference and shall swear to the following oath of office: "I, (name) hereby swear that I will support the Constitution and By-laws and at all times bear allegiance to the goals and purposes of the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Inc. I further swear to perform the duties and responsibilities of my office to the best of my ability and at the end of my term of office, I will deliver to my successor all records of said office, so help me God."

Section 9. Reports of all committees will be presented on the last day of the annual meeting/conference. The Secretary shall prior to the next annual meeting/conference arrange for the distribution to all members the activities of the annual meeting/conference and meeting of the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE VII - MEMBERSHIP

#### Section 1. The membership shall consist of:

#### A. Active Members:

- (1) The Chief of the Fire Department of a regularly organized public fire department;
- (2) Chief of a private Fire Department that provides municipal service;
- (3) Chief of an industrial Fire Department;
- (4) State Fire Marshal;
- (5) Full time employed Fire Commissioners;
- (6) Fire Directors;

#### B. Associate Members:

(1) City or Town Officials, Fire Commissioners, Assistant or Deputy Chiefs or members of fire departments, individuals and individuals representing firms and corporations interested in the protection of life and property against fire.

(2) Associate members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership in the corporation except the right to vote and as otherwise provided in these By-Laws.

#### C. Honorary Life Members:

(1) Honorary Life Members shall be entitled to vote on all matters. Honorary Life Members shall be entitled to all privileges of an active member except as otherwise provided in these By-Laws. Honorary Life Members shall not be required to pay annual dues, however, the Board of Directors may assess Honorary Life Members a fee to cover mailing costs. Honorary Life Membership may be conferred upon active members upon their retirement from office, provided they have been active members of the corporation or its predecessor, The New England Association of Fire Chiefs for a period of five years immediately preceding the date of their retirement, and provided further that they are not identified with fire protection - from a commercial standpoint. Honorary Life Membership will be withdrawn in the event the member becomes identified with fire protection from a commercial standpoint, but may be reinstated by making application to the corporation and receiving a positive vote at an annual meeting.

#### D. Life Membership:

- (1) Individuals, firms and corporations interested in protection of life and property against fire, shall be eligible for life membership upon payment of the fee established in the fee schedule. The Board of Directors may assess Life Members a fee to cover mailing cost.
- (2) Life Members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership in the corporation except the right to vote and as otherwise provided in these By-Laws.
- Section 2. No member who is in arrears for dues and assessments shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of the corporation, and any member who is in arrears on June 1st shall receive a second notice and if still in the arrears on August 1st he shall be dropped from membership.
- Section 3. Dues and Fees Schedule: Dues and fees for Active, Associate, Honorary Life, and Life Members shall be set by the Board of Directors and voted on by the membership at the next annual meeting.
- Section 4. Application for all classes of membership shall be received by the Secretary/Treasurer. The proposed member has to be

sponsored by a member in good standing with the corporation. The Secretary/Treasurer shall after investigation approve or disapprove the application except as otherwise provided in these By-Laws. If a question of eligibility arises, a decision to approve or disapprove shall be determined by the Board of Directors.

Section 5. The Secretary/Treasurer shall not register or give a badge or extend any courtesies of the annual meeting to any member whose dues and assessments are not paid to date in full.

Section 6. No member shall be expelled from the membership by vote of less than a majority of all members of the corporation, nor by a vote of less than three-fourths (3/4) of the members present and voting on such expulsion.

#### **ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS OF BY-LAWS**

Section 1. This corporation shall have full power at a meeting called for that purpose, to alter, amend or repeal these By-Laws, but the same shall not be done except by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members present and entitled to vote at said meeting. The membership by majority vote can request a secret ballot. However, no such proposed amendment shall be considered that has not been read and posted as provided in Article VI. Section 6.

#### **ARTICLE IX - RULES OF ORDER**

Section 1. The presiding officer shall preserve order and decorum. All questions of order shall be decided by him, subject to appeal by any member to the parliamentarian.

Section 2. In a decision of any question coming before the annual meeting for which no provisions are made in the By-Laws, the presiding officer shall be governed by the rules laid down in Robert's Rules of Order.

Section 3. Every member, when he speaks or offers a motion, shall rise in his place, properly identify himself, and respectfully address the presiding officer and when finished shall resume his seat. He shall confine himself to the question under debate, avoid all improper personal references and indecorous language.

Section 4. When two or more members shall rise to speak at the same time, the presiding officer shall decide who shall have the floor.


Section 5. A member called to order by the presiding officer shall immediately cease speaking on the question before the house, and shall not resume his remarks until the question is settled.


