I think it's very appropriate at this time during the Memorial Service to recognize him and to recognize the fact that he is - I kept thinking a new member of the Springfield Fire Department because he is sort of a reinstatement — but he's the newest spiritual addition to the Springfield Fire Department, finally filled a void we've had for a long time in need

for a Chaplain. And he's a great friend of Father Foley's. I think the only problem I'm going to have is I don't know which one of you has seniority or rank. We don't want any squabbling on the fire ground.

It's my pleasure at this time to turn over my portion of this address to someone who I think can do a lot better than I can at this time and it's Father David Farland.

FATHER DAVID FARLAND: Actually when I came this evening, I didn't know I'd be sitting up here in the most prominent seat. One of our district chiefs asked me when I came back, why I like the fire service so much. It's because there's never a time when we go out that we don't go out to help. I want to thank Chief Cassanelli for his support, and I want to thank all of you for coming this evening. And I want to say this, that our Department is a very hospitable Department. If you haven't discovered that in your stay here in Springfield, don't be afraid to visit any one of our ten stations, and you'll receive a most warm, hospitable welcome. Thank you.

[The Choral sang Swing Low, Sweet Chariot.] REVEREND STEPHEN C. FOLEY: Before delivering the Memorial Address, I must share with you a story briefly. During our parade meeting preparations, one of the Judges asked me some weeks ago to pray for his pregnant wife, who was seriously I would in the hospital and in danger of losing not only the baby, but her own life. I assured him that I would pray beginning immediately, and the next day I would offer mass in that text. He came to me very excitedly before the parade to thank me and said, "Father, your prayers work wonders. My wife is going to have triplets." The power of prayer in faith. That is a true story. I am impressed, not by myself, but by the power of prayer. And if I can do that, think of what all of you can do together here tonight as we praise God.

"In everything you do, put God first; he will direct your steps and crown your efforts with success." Once upon a time a very unusual, strange child was born, so strange, in fact, that his parents decided to call him Odd, O-D-D. As you might well imagine, there followed for Odd a lifetime of taunting and jokes, most of which were very unpleasant and some of which were absolutely painful.

When the time finally came for Odd to answer his last alarm, he was so tired and frustrated that he said to his wife, "Simply on my tombstone, engrave the date of my birth and the date of my death, nothing else." Odd's wife did as she was instructed. And to this very day, whenever people view his gravestone they remark, Isn't that Odd?

Some years ago, an enthusiastic, young fellow graduated from the very highly respected Massachusetts Fire Fighting Academy with the highest of honors. Soon after his assignment to a busy company in a large metropolitan fire department, he was labelled as "different." He did things by the book.

One day a medical call came in, a girl had been bitten by a large, poisonous snake in a housing complex. Arriving on the scene, the company was greeted by an anxious relative who informed them that the girl was in the bedroom of a tenth floor apartment. Going up the elevator together, they noticed that the rookie was dressed in full turn-out gear on a hot summer day, carrying a CO2 extinguisher in one hand and the familiar flathead/halligan combination in the other. Opening the bedroom door, they were greeted by the frightening sight of a snake preparing to strike out at anyone who dared enter. "Now what do we do," said a very anxious Captain?

Enter the rookie. Very cautiously opening the door, he immediately discharged the CO2 extinguisher, freezing the snake long enough to finish it off with the flathead, where in time, the others were able to render effective and successful medical assistance to the victim. The moral of the story: Even a rookie, or the new kid on the block, has

something to offer. Isn't that odd!!!

We stand today at the threshold of a new era for the Fire Service of New England. And many have much to offer. Stephen R. Covey, one of the most inspired motivational writers of our day, often refers to the value of synergy. You know what this means: The whole is greater than the sum of its parts. For instance, if you put two pieces of wood together, they will hold much more than the total of the weight each one could hold separately.

Dr. Robert H. Schuller, one of America's most influential and popular preachers, says that we don't need a head-strong approach to problems, which he calls"head-lock," nor do we need the adversarial approach, which he calls"grid-lock." What we need is "inter-lock," where both the Association and the Division join hands together for the future good, not only of the Association, not only of the Division, but for that of the entire New England Fire Service. Isn't that odd!!!

To continue the process, we must lead this joint venture into the new millennium, and I mean lead. We need leadership, not management. A true leader can always manage, but far too many managers cannot lead. Form follows function, and management follows leadership. Isn't that odd?

Likewise, don't be afraid of mutual differences. As Stephen Covey again states, "The essence of synergy is to value differences." Isn't that odd?

How about the ancient Ethiopian proverb, "When spider webs unite, they can tie up a lion." Isn't that odd? Heraclitus, the famous Greek philosopher, who by the way, believed that fire was the underlying substance of the Earth, and I think today he might be right, taught, "Opposition brings together, and from discord comes perfect harmony." Isn't that odd?

To place all of this into the hands of God, as well we should, let us refer to the Old Testament book of Jeremiah, Chapter 29, Verse 11: "I know well the plans I have in mind for you. Plans for your welfare, not for calamity. Plans to give you a future full of hope."

We began with a quotation from Proverbs, and it is fitting that we should end in like fashion. Proverbs 16:3, printed on the back of your bulletin as a reminder, "Entrust your works to the Lord, and your plans will succeed." Isn't that odd?





CHIEF RICHARD K. WEHTER, RETIRED [Hingham, Massachusetts] The Annual Report of the Secretary for the Fiscal Year June 1, 1997 through May 31, 1998.

To the Officers and Members of the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Incorporated, I herewith submit the report of the Secretary for the Fiscal Year ending May 31, 1998.

The Officers, Directors, and Committee members have held several meetings throughout the year in preparation for the conference. Full Board meetings were held on September 12, 1997, November 7, 1997, February 13, 1998, and May 8, 1998. These meetings were held at the Sheraton Springfield Hotel in Springfield, MA. Several subcommittee meetings were also held throughout the year, including several by the Parade Committee and four on the joint conference. The New England Division had three representatives at most of these meetings as well as the New England Fire Equipment Exhibitors Association. The Mechanics Association did not show an interest in joining us this year.

Testimonials and Memorial services were

attended by various officers and directors of the Association throughout the year.

The day-to-day business of the Association was handled by the President and Secretary/Treasurer, and all correspondence was answered or directed to the appropriate committee. The Secretary edited and prepared the Red Book for printing, prepared all conference forms, advertisements and the conference pocket program on the computer. All mailings were prepared by the Secretary with help as may be required. This year Honorary Life members were assessed a \$10.00 postage and printing fee per vote of the last Annual Meeting. Two members were afforded an exemption and the mailing revealed notification of members deceased in previous years. This has helped to update our database. The conference and exhibitors mailing included an application to join which yielded ten new members. Our membership has dropped by 30 members since the last annual report.

During the past year, the Association welcomed 81 new members, mourned the loss of 28 members, dropped 54 members for nonpayment of dues, 3 members resigned, and 3 members were dropped as their address is unknown. Twelve members were accorded Honorary Life status. Membership statistics as of 6/23/98 are:

This year's receipts exceeded expenses primarily due to the increase in exhibit space sales for the current conference. With the increase in income there will also be a substantial increase in expenses, especially with the added expenses of an additional building at the Eastern States Expo site and all the other associated costs. This year Honorary Life members were assessed a \$10.00 fee to cover printing and postage costs. This has also revealed some deaths we were not aware of and has helped bring our data base up to date.

This Board is committed to ensure a budget balance that will provide us for a conference default. At this time we do not have those resources which should be \$85,000.00 to \$100,000.00 in reserve funds. After all the conference receivables and expenses are determined, which will be sometime in October or November, based on past history, our balance will be far less than the year end balance noted here today.

In reality during the past fiscal year, we went as low as \$58,000.00, which is not much money for the size enterprise we have developed into. It has not been the Association's policy to accumulate large sums of money, in fact, over the past many years we have subsidized many conference expenses. During this and last year's conference, we have eliminated some of this in order to help bring up our reserves by making the conference self sufficient. As our conference grows, our income grows and so does our expenses. Exhibit fees for this year were previously established the same as last year. However, next year they will increase to help insure a more reasonable income and hopefully the start of a much more needed reserve fund.

All checks received by the corporation are photocopied and filed. All monies are deposited on a daily basis in the supersaver account, with minimum balances maintained in the checking account to ensure

the maximum receipt of interest.

All financial records of the corporation are reviewed or subject to a full audit, and receipts exceed \$100,000.00 by an outside accountant on an annual basis. His findings and a copy of all the expense and receipt records have been given to the audit committee for review. All members of the Audit Committee receive periodic updates on the financial conditions of the Association which ensures continuity and the ability to question any and all expenditures.

At the recommendation of the 1994 Annual Meeting, the Treasurer continues to be bonded for the

sum of \$200,000.00.

It has been an honor and pleasure to serve as your Secretary/Treasurer these past six years, and I hope to do so for many more. Thank you.

President Thurston decided that he would appoint a subcommittee to sit down with the New England Division Executive Board on neutral ground and iron it out, pound it out. Chief Howard from New Hampshire, the Director from New Hampshire, and myself, President Thurston, and Dick Wehter met with the Executive Board from New England Division in Concord, New Hampshire

Fire Academy.

The first meeting was less than pleasant. It was downright nasty at times. And when we walked out of there, we didn't think we would ever get this thing resolved. About a month or two after that, we scheduled another meeting. Cooler heads prevailed at this one. We were able to come up with some draft language, that was put together. We fine tuned it on Thursday evening before this conference started. We have come up with a three year contract from '97 through '99. And I'm just going to briefly give you a little bit of what it's all about.

Basically what it says is the New England Association will run the conference. The New England Division will assist and supply manpower. The New England Division will attend all the New England Association Board of Director meetings. They will have three people at those meetings. They will have input into the process. They will also have one person on each of our subcommittees for playing purposes. They will receive compensation. From 1997 they'll receive \$2,500. For this year's conference they will receive

\$5,000. For the 1999 conference they will receive \$10,000.

There are a few conditions on these dollar figures. I don't think they're anything we can't get over. Obviously if the conference doesn't make an adequate amount of money, we're not going to be able to pay the New England Division, as we have committed to them, and the language in this contract spells that out. I'm not going to get into it in detail. I think everybody that was involved is satisfied with the agreement. It may not be a perfect agreement, but I believe it's workable for the next three years. I think everybody is happy it's over with. And respectfully submitted. Thank you.

That is the change, and it's supported by the Board of Directors.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: You've heard the

reading of the bylaw change.

FROM THE FLOOR: As the former Chairman of the Exhibit Committee for 14 years, I recommend that this body pass that bylaw, because from the time I had the exhibits, I took over in 1974 before some of you guys were born. Anyway, it grew under my term. It grew to a point that it was getting bigger all the time, and now it's grown to a big business and definitely needs somebody who stays there and knows the procedure, and Charlie has done a wonderful job, so I recommend they vote this bylaw in.

CHIEF HOWARD SWANSON, RETIRED: [Plainville, CT] I second that.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Motion made and seconded that we change the bylaw to read as stated for the benefit of the organization. This Board, I know, and Mr. Baston and Carl Winslow went over these bylaws and scrutinized them real well. And let's face it, we can't do things that great grandpa used to do years ago. We're moving onward and upward. We've got to change things for the better of the Association. Any other discussion?

All those in favor of the bylaw change will manifest by saying Aye?

[Aye]

Those opposed? So done.

Any other new business? Yes, sir.

CHIEF DENNIS NEWMAN: [Sandwich, MA] Regarding the hospitality suite in Louisville, is a motion necessary for the picking up of the costs? I don't know.

CHIEF WEHTER: Last year there was discussion about this, and it was agreed that between the vendor donations, there would be enough to cover the expenses at the conference. However, if the expenses went beyond, the Association would make a contribution.

CHIEF NEWMAN: Do we need to expand that to include this year as well, or are we all set?

CHIEF WEHTER: That would be for the coming year. We assume they've had enough money. We didn't receive any requests for any money from the last conference.

CHIEF JOHN WOOD: [Hartford, VT] I wasn't aware of this until just recently, so you may end up — I'll check the books for the last year's hospitality room, and I may end up forwarding a bill, not knowing that this motion had passed. So I will look that over. And if it is, fine, then it will be taken care of this year. If you plan on doing the same thing, then I'll keep a running tally on that.

This year we do have a bigger room, for those of you that don't know. It's a 2400 square foot room we got in anticipation of Chief Dipoli's successful election, so the cost may be more.

CHIEF JOHN J. FLAHERTÝ: [West Springfield, MA] We're not paying for the room. We just put money

towards the refreshments.

CHIEF WOOD: It's not the total

hospitality?

CHIEF FLAHERTY: Well, the hospitality expenses are one thing. I guess I misunderstood that. What was the motion last year, maybe I should be clear on that?

CHIEF WEHTER: It must be in the Red Book.

CHIEF WOOD: I thought this was total expenses of the hospitality room and then whatever that expense was, if it was above and beyond what the vendors had sponsored, then it would be a split.

CHIEF FLAHERTY: Normally they donated \$500. I think the year before it was \$750. They needed that much because they didn't have that much activity. So it's in that neighborhood, five hundred something dollars. It's not a half of the whole cost of the hospitality room.

CĤIEF WOOD: I guess I misunderstood. Am I

the only one that understood it that way?

PRESIDENT THURSTON: I think that was just for the soda and cookies they were talking about.

[Laughter]

Any other discussion?

CHIEF DENNIS NEWMAN: [Sandwich, MA] I talked to several other Chiefs yesterday at lunch time and some suggestions, for what it's worth, if possible, to involve the State Fire Marshalls from the different states, as well as the training academies for a demonstrations and/or training subjects for the education portion of our conference. I've talked to a couple of the State, and they were very much interested in being involved in that process. I haven't been involved with the Training Committee, so I don't know what's going on there, but I'm offering the suggestion. I think it might be very advantageous for us and expand the involvement for some of our peers.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Thank you. Anybody else want to elaborate on that? You were just asking a

question.

CHIEF NEWMAN: I'm actually willing to help out.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: You're offering that as a suggestion?

CHIEF NEWMAN: Yes, I'd be happy to help out with it as well.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: If you could forward that to the Board, I'm sure they will look at it and weigh it and go from there, and they'll be in touch with you. Is that satisfactory? John, go ahead.

CHIEF FLAHERTY: I want to ask Mr. Wood, is

anybody driving to the conference?

CHIEF OTIS WYATT: [Narragansett, RI] I'm

going to be taking a motor home.

CHIEF FLAHERTY: We're going to have a lot left over here, and it's the will of this party that they donate that, with the scotch, soda — would you put soda in there, please? Save me a trip of taking it back to the — would that be acceptable?

CHIEF WOOD: Certainly to me.

CHIEF FLAHERTY: I mean there's quite a bit.
PRESIDENT THURSTON: The only thing we've got to do now is find out who is going with a motor home that will take it. Right?

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: [Lincoln, RI] Mr. President, I'd like to ask John Flaherty a question, would it be legal for Otie to be a rum runner with his van?

[Laughter]

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Probably not the first time. You made that motion, John?

CHIEF FLAHERTY: Yes.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Seconded by Mr. Baston. We'll get it there somehow as long as somebody is going. Check with John before you leave.

All those in favor?

[Aye]

Those opposed?

Mr. Hall.

CHIEF CHARLES HALL: [Merrimack, NH] In lieu of the discussion with trying to remember back and find what happened last year, I'd offer a motion that the Association split with the New England Division any overruns on the liquid refreshments and things at the conference in Louisville. And I believe that's something in the way we had it a year ago. Does that sound right?

CHIEF FLAHERTY: According to this, if you just want to go open discussion? Somebody made a motion to donate a \$1,000, I think it was Chief Mooney, no, Stanley. And I guess part of the discussion was that the year before, there really wasn't any money

needed. And going back to what you said, that if there was that, you would come back and just tell us what it was. It would be 500. If it wasn't for the hospitality room, according to the donation that it might be required for the liquid refreshments there. We are going to be donating quite a bit. But I'm sure if you brought something back to the body and said that you had a bill, because if Bob gets elected down there, we surely would want to make sure that we're hospitable to the rest of the country, and there might be some extra funds needed. But I think if you bring it back to the Board of Directors, and that's something that we can take up at a Directors meeting.

FROM THE FLOOR: Bob is going to be

elected. You've got to think positive.

CHIEF FLAHERTY: That's right. Bob is going to be elected down there. We're going to have a good party down there, and I'm sure that the Association would want to make his party a New England style party.

FROM THE FLOOR: Would it be appropriate for the motion to read that the Association support the level that the Directors accepted? Anything that might

be needed for the hospitality room in Louisville?

CHIEF FLAHERTY: Yes, that would be fine. FROM THE FLOOR: That's my motion.

CHIEF FREDERICK STANLEY: [Hope Valley, RI] I second the motion.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: All those in favor?

All those opposed?

Any other new business?

CHIEF WYATT: Yes, I'd just like to ask a question of either Chief Flaherty generally, we just had a recent motion to increase the salary for the Secretary/Treasurer of \$1,500 this year and next year. Was there any consideration given to the Chair of the Exhibit Committee?

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Yes, there was.

CHIEF WYATT: Should there be a motion to include that, or how do you want to do it?

CHIEF FLAHERTY: Mr. President?

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Yes. Mr. Flaherty, do you want to handle that?

CHIEF JOHN J. FLAHERTY: [West Springfield, MA] The compensation for the Exhibit Chairman is taken up by the Directors, and they afforded the Exhibit Chairman the same consideration. They gave \$1,500 for the next two years.

CHIEF WYATT: On his behalf, I thank you. PRESIDENT THURSTON: Does that answer it? CHIEF WYATT: Yes, that answered it. PRESIDENT THURSTON: Thank you. Yes, sir. ASSISTANT CHIEF JAMES M. TRAINOR:

[Waterbury, CT] I'd just like to remind all the members that the election is coming up very soon, and you will be getting ballots in the mail. Please read the instructions on the ballots and be careful on how you do the ballots, because I know last year several ballots were rejected because they weren't properly done.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Any other announcements under new business?

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: [Lincoln, RI] Mr. President, I just have one to bring up and that has to do with the visit to Rhode Island for the site committee; if they've actually come up with an actual date on that. I believe the members from Rhode Island have questioned me in the room earlier on this. Do you have an actual date on that? And if you do, we'd like you to get in touch with myself or Don Campbell, because we will be inviting you down as our guest for the day. So we would like to come up with some kind of date for the site committee to give us advanced notice so we can set up things for you.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: We haven't at this time, but we will within the next week or so. The President's date book is upstairs.

CHIEF SYLVESTER: I would appreciate a date so I can get back to the committee and let them know what's going on.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: The incoming president will take care of that and get back to whoever he has to.

Any other new business?

CHIEF OTIS WYATT, RETIRED: [Narragansett, RI] Speaking as the historian or part of the Historian Committee, Mert Dyer, who also serves on that committee with me, he and I have been discussing for some couple of years now what might be an appropriate insignia to incorporate into a Chief's uniform, dress blue uniform for retired Chiefs.

In the course of doing this, we've had a suggestion come forward of something like a wreath with a gold "R" that would attach similar to your service stripes or a patch. To do something like this, number one, I feel personally, and I think Mert agrees with me, that we would hope that we could get the entire country to go in one direction, so we don't find Connecticut doing one thing for retired Chiefs, Maine doing something different, Florida doing something yet different.

To do this, we can get an embroidery program that you would give to someone who has these embroidery machines that can make them, and we could get that really licensed to be New England Association license corporation type thing. And then any royalties that might come from that would earn income of a sort to the organization. The initial expense would be for whatever it cost for this program, \$100, \$150, whatever, to get that done, and the people would buy the patches as necessary. And if we could ever get all of New England to walk in the same direction at the same time over a Retired Fire Chief's insignia, then maybe we could ask the Division to carry the same information to the International and try to get it to be accepted as a national program.

There is some reluctance on the part of Retired Chiefs to wear their dress blues when they may be in the company of the same guy whose got the same uniform which says he's Chief, because the badges don't really say Retired Chief, and they're not readable if

they are.

I'd just like to ask Mert if he would just address what he found out and what he told me this morning when we met at the conference center, just to pass it on and make a recommendation to the Board of Directors that they consider this matter and decide if it's a project that they want to go in or not.

I think that it does, number one, put our name forward in the country, number two, it would get us all unified in the same direction, number three it might be a small money making proposition, if we wanted to try it. I would offer it to the Board for their consideration after Mert's word.

CHIEF MERTON DYER, RETIRED: [Peterborough, NH] This is a prototype of what I had in mind. It isn't exactly the right size, and I'm not sure I like

the "R." I pinned it on my own jacket. I was thinking of the right-hand sleeve. I think this would give you the recognition. As Otie said, I have the same feeling when you go to an organizational meeting or something with the local Chief, there should be some way to designate between the two.

I've been told if it hasn't been already copyrighted, we might be able to copyright it. And there's no charge or a very minimal charge to copyright. To have somebody design a computer program to do this would be about \$150 to \$165, in that range, and I think I'd like to ask the Board of Directors to consider it. And if the group has some feedback about their feeling for it, I think it's something we can get the Division involved in and possibly next year approach the International. I think I'd like to see it, as Otie said, to go worldwide. I hope you'll support that.

CHIEF ROBERT DIPOLI: [Needham, MA] Would it be more appropriate to put "RE" period to make it more easily recognized as retired than just an "R"?

CHIEF DYER: Well I think a larger "R" would be better. In doing the program, you get proofs of it and you can work it out. There's a reduction, about a 60 percent, 40 percent reduction, which gets it down into the proper size. That's something to be considered. This is just a general idea until we can see exactly what it looks like. The material I used is certainly not the right material. It wouldn't sow well.

CHIEF PETER LAMB: [Lisbon Falls, ME] If the cost is only going to be \$200, I think we can afford to move on this and maybe start the rest of the country in the same direction. I make a motion for \$200, but not to exceed \$200.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Motion made that we proceed with the retired patch and insignia or get it embroidered and not to spend over \$200 is on the floor. Is there a second to that?

FROM THE FLOOR: Could I just ask a question? Does that mean that the Retired Chiefs have to wear a uniform? I know in our area I don't see them wear them down there. It's just a question.

CHIEF DYER: I think, John, the answer to that question, the reason you don't see them wearing it is because they're uncomfortable wearing their uniform

next to that particular person. This is a way of letting a retiree wear his uniform and not impose on

the acting Chief's role.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Can I make a suggestion, sir? To charge the Board of Directors with looking into that and making a decision that we don't – if it goes beyond \$ $2\overline{0}0$ , it's going to escalate. We can nip it in the bud and charge them with looking into that and give us a little more time. This is kind of a spur of a moment thing, and the Board hasn't had a chance to devour it.

CHIEF LAMB: It seems to me, Mr. President, Otie and Mr. Dyer have been looking into it, and they've been talking to vendors already. They know that the cost is going to be right around \$200. Out of the respect for the retired Chiefs out there, I think we deserve to spend that kind of money.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Motion is on the floor

then.

FROM THE FLOOR: I second the motion. PRESIDENT THURSTON: Second the motion. Now it's for discussion.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: [Lincoln, RI] Mr. President, I just want to inform the members out here, in the military we're supposed to be quasi military. In the military, when you retire after honorable service, you're allowed to wear your uniform at any formal function. And I see no reason why a Retired Chief, who served his department for the many years he served, should not be allowed to wear a uniform. This goes for any city or town.

They buy their uniform. They earn the right to wear the uniform. I believe that a patch for the Retired Chief wearing a dress blue uniform to a function like this here should be an order at all times. I put 26 years in the military. I retired. I have that right to wear my uniform. I earn that right. And I think these members here, retired, earn that right to wear their uniform, no matter where it's from, what city and town, and I would support that

motion and second it.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Chief Flaherty. CHIEF JOHN J. FLAHERTY: [West Springfield, MA] I'd like to make an amendment to Chief Lamb's motion, an amendment would be that the body appropriate \$200 to do just that, but just to get feedback. We

don't have everybody here to get feedback from the Associations, all the New England Associations. I'm sure that we also bring back the past Chiefs and just them, in turn, come to their director of the various states, and that they look at it, and we have feedback.

But with this motion, I move forward and just spend up to \$200 in doing just that. It would be done in very short order. I'm sure within six months we would have all the input that needed to make that decision. I would like to make that a formal motion.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: That's an amendment, John?

CHIEF FLAHERTY: Yes.

JOHN G. WOOD, JR.: [Hartford, VT] I'll second the motion for the amendment. Just to speak to that, I think that perhaps what we need to do is have the Board get the feedback and take a look at exactly the design that you want. The design we have at the moment is a conceptual drawing. We don't know exactly what that's going to look like. So if we could have somebody looking at, making sure that what you get for a design is going to be acceptable to the group or the Board, I think that's kind of where John is coming from, and I certainly second that motion.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: First we'll vote on the amended motion.

CHIEF WYATT: Under remarks, I just wanted to pass on to several Chiefs here, many of you said let's be honest. There are Chiefs that are Chiefs today that don't want to wear their dress blues, don't kid yourself. You don't see all of them wearing dress blues. Retired people, it's not that they want to wear dress blues, but we received a notification from you. We received the same thing from the International, please attend the Memorial Service in dress blues, if at all possible.

Yesterday you had a one of the largest Memorial Services we've had. A number of retired people could have been there in dress blues, but they are uncomfortable walking down the street when there's another Chief that says the same thing. They say that town can't make up their mind who is Chief; that was the insignia to show that they are. And what Frank addressed, as a military person, is probably a 100,000 lieutenant commanders in the country, and they're all

entitled to wear their uniform. And everybody knows he's a Lieutenant commander in the Navy or Coast Guard or whatever.

We know we've got 30,000 fire departments, and everyone of them has got at least one Retired Chief. That's 60,000 Retired Chiefs in this country, but not all of them have dress blues. And if we're going to take part and make ourselves a large, visible audience, which is what you requested for yesterday, which I understand is requested also tonight at the banquet, the International requests the same thing, I thought it might be an appropriate direction to go; not because I want to wear my blues. Let's be honest, three quarters of the Chiefs that are retired couldn't get into their blues if they had to.

[Laughter]

That goes for you guys that are still Chiefs.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Chief Flaherty made an amendment to the motion. We'll vote on that first. It was that the Board of Directors to spend up to \$200. Seconded by Chief Hall. We'll vote on that one first. Anymore discussion manifest by saying Aye.

[Aye]

Those opposed?

So done.

The original motion was that we spend \$200 to look into and design a patch, see what it's going to cost us for the retirees. All those in favor?

[Aye]

Those opposed say nay?

Now, moving right along. Any other new business?

Father Foley, you're late.

REVEREND STEPHEN C. FOLEY: [West Hartford, CT] Yes, I know, and I wanted to explain that.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: I've heard them all.

[Laughter]

REVEREND FOLEY: Chief Flaherty, I'm glad to see you've come up and prayed for all of us while I was gone. I appreciate that very much. And, secondly, I was out getting the music, as I was reminded, that late this afternoon by the Secretary/Treasurer, that I had to play the piano tonight. That's where I was. I wanted to render and account for myself.

Secondly, if I may, one of the motivating

factors behind our new patch was so that anyone could wear their uniform, retired or active, because all it says on there is New England Fire Chiefs. It covers everything. God bless you all. I'm serious. That's not a joke. I'm serious.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: I know you're serious.

REVEREND FOLEY: One of the things we discussed, if I'm not mistaken. So please get yourself a patch and wear it.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: They're only four

bucks.

REVEREND FOLEY: Let's put it up to five and put a dollar in the Chaplain's Fund.

[Laughter]

PREŠIDENT THURSTON: Any other new business?

CHIEF FREDERICK STANLEY: [Hope Valley, RI] Again, reminding everybody, when you get your ballots, we approve the ballots Fridays. We approve the ballots, the New England Division. They should be coming out shortly. When you get your ballots, please vote for the bylaw changes. The bylaw change has been changed to a new system so we don't have the problem like we did last year. We worked hard on them.

Everything right now is in pretty good shape. In the past it takes a two-third's vote on the International bylaw change. If you remember last time, we lost by six-tenths of a point. We wanted the bylaw change in the past. We had 66, but we couldn't get the other .6 to do it.

Check your ballots, make sure you sign the ballots where you're supposed to sign it. Please put them in the envelope. It's very discouraging to find out whether any people voted or not. Last year one of the Chiefs in my state didn't put his ballot in the envelope. But make sure you put your ballot in the envelope, sign the envelope, doing what you're supposed to do, and get back to us. Do what you're expected to do. Get it in on time, but please vote for the bylaw change.

CHIEF WYATT: And the dues increase. PRESIDENT THURSTON: Any other new business?

CHIEF TIMOTHY WALL: [Wallingford, CT] Just an announcement, passing on that John Buckman, Chief from Indiana, is a candidate for Second Vice President

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Anybody else?
There being no other new business, we're on to the presentation of the President's gift by Chief Richard Baston.

CHIEF RICHARD BASTON: [North Yarmouth, ME] On behalf of the Association, we'd like to present you with the President's ring.

PRESIDENT THURSTON: Thank you.

[Applause]

[Standing ovation]

PRESIDENT THURSTON: My President's message is going to be short and sweet. This is the end of my career in this capacity. I've enjoyed being here. I've enjoyed coming up through the ranks as the Director and then finally as Second Vice, First Vice, and finally the President. I've enjoyed it. I've enjoyed meeting the people. I've probably made some enemies. I hope I've made some friends, but that's life.

I've had an excellent Board to work with this year. I feel I have been privileged to work with that Board. They were super. They spoke their own peace. It wasn't a one-sided thing because Joe blow voted for this, Joe blow says, well, if I don't vote for him, he'll be mad at me. They voted individually for the best of the organization. This organization can only grow and grow and grow.

We're all one. We're going to be one. We're looking for the same goal, and we're going to accomplish it. You'll always remember, Mr. James Grote always said, "Remember, united you stand, divided you fall." And work with the knowledge of power that this conference brought this year, we can't go anywhere but up. Thank you.

[Applause]

CĤÎEF BASTON: I notice my name is in small print, so it's going to be very short. It's an honor to be elected as President to this seat. I have a very good Board to work with, and I don't see that with clarity on one side and Sylvester on the other how I can go wrong.

[Laughter] Thank you. [Applause]

PRÉSIDENT THURSTON: Now I'll entertain a

motion.

FROM THE FLOOR: We move to adjourn. PRESIDENT THURSTON: Thank you, gentlemen. (Meeting adjourned at 4:30 p.m.)

One person who has been keeping Sid in tow and in touch with everything, as we work together in Vermont, is his own Fire Chief from Waterbury Center. I'm very pleased and privileged to introduce Bob Jones, who is here, and his wife Betty. Bob and Betty.

I'd like to introduce our Chief who is going to make the presentation of two wonderful awards that the New England Association give annually. We have two young people who are going to be the winners of two excellent scholarship awards. And making the presentation of those awards tonight is our own President Thurston, Sid.

PRÊSIDENT SIDNEY THURSTON: [Waterbury Center, VT] I'd like to announce that the two, and we would like to have them come forward to receive their awards. Lisanne Coutu, who is the daughter of Chief Coutu of Lincoln Rhode Island. Is Lisanne here? Come right up here.

The second scholarship winner is Derick Fors, the grandson of Chief Fitzgerald in Ashby, MA.

I'd like to present you with this plaque, Lisanne. The New England Association of Fire Chiefs was organized on July 12, 1922 for the purpose of promoting the education and training needs of the Fire Service in New England. Since that time, many members have served with dedication and distinction. Chief James L. Grote, Chester, Connecticut, was one of those Chiefs. Chief Grote was an active member for over 80 years, and he was the Chief and Fire Marshal in the Chester Fire Department, Connecticut, for 46 years, the fire Marshal for an additional 24 years, until his death at the age of 100.

Thank you.

[Lisanne Coutu received the plaque and award.]

[Applause]

Derick, this is a great scholarship. You are deservingly of it. Thank you very much.

[Derick Fors received the plaque and award.]

[Applause]

DÉPUTY CHIEF DAVISON: Thank you, Sid, and congratulations to two of these wonderful young people. This kind of thing, as a long time educator myself in the State of Vermont, I appreciate kids like this who are coming to our Association and being helped by you folks and others.

This evening you have, I think, a very special person coming into the hall. Representative Danny Gore began his campaign for Governor of the State of Vermont in 1962. After 34 years of having votes recorded under scatter, Danny decided to take the advice of the late great Senator, George D. Egan. And George D. Egan and his colleagues list advice in the United States Senate on the Vietnam War, "When in a hopeless campaign, declare victory and go home," that has been Danny's token.

On Tuesday, November 8, 1994, at noon, on the steps of our Great Granites State House in Montpelier, Danny Gore declared victory, and he served as Governor for seven minutes, resigned, and went home to Avery's Gore. Now Danny is spending his remaining years writing the history of Avery's Gore and speaking as the Good Will Emissary for rural Vermont, hoping to convince our future historians that like Richard Nixon,

after he resigned, he's a winner, not a loser.

It's one of my great privileges tonight to introduce Representative Danny Gore, former seven minute Governor of the State of the Vermont, good will emissary for Mertyle, Vermont, and still a loser. Danny Gore.

[Applause]

[Guest Speaker, Humorist, Danny Gore, From the Northeast Kingdom of Vermont]

[Laughter and applause]

DEPUTY CHIEF DAVISON: Thank you so much, Representative Danny Gore. We love him in Vermont.

We now would like to have the swearing in ceremony of the new officers that have just come into our two Associations, and we're going to begin with President Baston and Sid Thurston with the New England Association of Fire Chiefs. Would you raise your right hand, Richard, repeat after me.

[Past President Sidney Thurston swore in President Richard Baston.]

DEPUTY CHIEF DAVISON: If we can have the Directors of New England Association please rise at this time. The Chief will swore in his new Directors and the other officers.

[President Richard Baston swore in the officers and Directors.]

Congratulations new officers.

[Applause]

DÉPUTY CHIEF DAVISON: The swearing in of the officers and Directors of the New England Division of the International Association of Fire Chiefs, the officers, and their Vice Presidents, by our honored guest this evening, Chief Richard Marinucci. Richard.

CHIEF RICHARD MARINUCCI, PRESIDENT, IAFC: Thank you. After sitting through all this stuff so far tonight, when I go to the next Division conference, for them to have a better time, they're going to have to do something illegal. I want to make a few remarks, but I see we have a stenographer, and I'm not sure I do want to say anything.

[Laughter]

I first make some acknowledgments to the old and new Board Directors of the New England Division and the New England Association. I think what you've done is truly commendable. I have travelled a bit to some Divisions and sections, and you have a great turnout.

You have a great thing going right here, and I would implore you to continue working in a cooperative fashion for the benefit of the whole New England area. Because I think you can only be a little bit better each year as you continue to go on, and I say that from my observation of travelling around a bit.

Since I've been here, it's been a pretty good deal for me. I've had a really great time. I thank everybody for your tremendous hospitality. I've had a chance to see some old friends. I don't mean that about age because Bob's left the room. But I've met some new friends that ultimately will carry me for a very, very long time. It's been a great learning experience for me. I've learned a lot of things about your Association, the New England area. Some of them are pretty neat that I've learned. I've learned that next time I'm going to run a golf outing because I need a new driver. It was so slick the way that worked. I was surprised it never left the podium. It was unbelievable, but I learned from that. I've got something going for me.

I came here and I thought this is pretty good. They set me up with this team. They gave me three great golfers. I never even had to take the clubs out of my bag. We had a score, and I find out we didn't need to carry a score card. It didn't really matter. So I know next year I don't need to, and one of them was in on it, had me hooked the whole way. "Keep trying. We've got a chance at this thing." But I do appreciate the lessons that you've given me. I'm hoping very much to be able to carry those on when I do

travel a bit.

There are some neat things you do, and I've been to a couple of your functions, and I say this with all the sincerity. You're honoring our country is to be commended. You do the National Anthem and Pledge of Allegiance at every morning, and I think that's really great. When you come from where I'm from, when they get done playing the National Anthem, they usually play the Canadian version, then they say, let's go and they drop the puck. It's really good to do that here. Of course I do come from the Stanley Cup Champion. I didn't mean to say that. If you haven't heard yet, it's two years in a row right now, but it's pretty good. It's really been fun. I say this as much as I can, we'll work on some of these things as we go along

a little bit better.

Just a couple of things I learned as I travel around, and it's kind of fun, except for there's two problems, one, you have to stay awake, and you have to exercise bladder control. But I'm learning as I go along. I know what he is talking about when he talked about that warmth.

[Laughter]

The hardest thing I do is the Congressional Fire Service Institute, and many of you have been down to that dinner. I think it lasts for about two days. And they bring you in at some God awful hour, because you're President, and sit there and pretend you're having fun for about an hour, then they take you in and set you up, and then you listen to politician after politician tell other politicians how great they are. And I've pretty much heard that speech, ten or eleven of them I've been to, and they just had the report from the previous year, so now we've got eleven years worth of reports. And I get to listen to Kurt Weldon. Now Kurt has become a good friend of mine. Kurt is still not really sure what state I'm from. I've been introduced six times by Kurt Weldon and in six different states. "Here is my good friend, Rich Marinucci, from Illinois. Did you get a new job? I didn't know. Why didn't you tell me?" Next week I'm from Minnesota, the next week I'm from Indiana, whatever. I'm moving around quite a bit.

But I've learned with politicians that once they get on a role, you don't really want to stop them. Has anyone seen Animal House? You're all old enough to see Animal House and John Bellucci, who was in it, and near the end, after they were in big trouble and they were all going to the moat, he got up and gave this big inspirational speech, and he's talking about, "What are you guys, a bunch of weenies?" And we can't do this. And he says, "Did we quit when the Germans bombed Pearl Harbor?"

[Laughter]

And two other guys said, "Don't stop him now. He's on a roll."

[Laughter]

So you learn that with some people and you just don't stop them. But truly, I can't say it enough that it's been great for me to be here. And another great thing that I get to do is I get to install the

officers for the Associations as I go, and I take that very seriously. I said a couple of them I was serious about, but this part I'm really serious about.

So right now I'd like to call up the Officers of the New England Division, first, incoming President, Chief David Sylvaria. Please come up and line up behind me. First Vice President Richard McDonough, Second Vice President Ed Pollard, Secretary/Treasurer John Wood, and International Director Roger Bradley. And also there's a few state Vice Presidents in attendance here, and I think a couple of them are new so they have to swear allegiance to the Association also, Russ Lacaillade from Rhode Island; is that right, Rhode Island?

FROM THE FLOOR: You're on a roll, we don't want to change it.

[Laughter]

CHIEF MARINUCCI: George Landry from the great State of New Hampshire. And I think those are the only two elected State Representatives, is that correct, that were elected this year? And also I'd like Nick Russo to come up, mostly because he's my good friend, and also because he's the State Vice President from Massachusetts. Nick, if you'd come up here also.

And while Nick is making his way up here, I'll just make a couple of quick comments. First of all, even though he's not in attendance, I again compliment the fine job Dave Bibber did representing you on the IAFC Board. It was a tremendous commitment, and I'm sure Roger is going to find out it takes a lot of energy and sometimes you're not really sure what it takes, and you learn a little bit more of appreciation after you've walked in somebody's shoes a little bit.

And also to Bob Dipoli, who has become my friend. He's actually travelled more than I have this year trying to get elected, and I wish him the best of luck, and certainly he's happy to be home because people can actually understand him now.

[Laughter]

CHIEF MARINUCCI: I'm going to get serious in just one second, but what we were talking about earlier. We went down South, and it's so hard when you're from north of Mason Dickson. You're saying come on, spit it out. What's the hold up, because they talk so slow down there. It's unbelievable. Did you ever talk to those people? If they ever had to go to New

York City to order a deli sandwich, they'd never be able to do it.

[Laughter]

CHIEF MARINUCCI: Anyway, as we get ready to do this, I would like to have my very good friend, Bob Counts, to come up and join me as I administer the oath. [Chief Jenkins sang America The Beautiful accompanied by Reverend Foley on the piano.]



# BYLAWS NEW ENGLAND ASSOCIATION OF FIRE CHIEFS, INC.

#### As amended 06/29/98

#### ARTICLE I

- Section 1. This organization shall be known as the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Incorporated.
  - Section 2. The purpose for which the corporation is formed are as follows:
- A. To operate as a non-profit corporation; to encourage and cooperate in the development of new techniques, equipment and practices; to promote more effective organizations and functions of the Firefighting Service, with a view toward greater protection of life and property from the dangers of fire and other hazards.
- B. To aid in the dissemination of information among the Fire Chiefs of New England concerning: newly developed equipment and procedures for fighting fires and carrying out the other functions of the fire service; special hazards and problems presented by the development of new industrial and scientific processes and equipment; disasters caused by natural or human origin; practices in particular areas in the administration of Fire Departments; other matters affecting and concerning the fire service.
- C. To provide the means for: an exchange of ideas between its members; conducting of conferences between the members and with those having specialized knowledge on particular matters effecting the fire service; and the study of matters by its committees.
- D. To provide facilities and operate testing grounds for the display, demonstration and testing of equipment required and techniques of operation used in the fire service.
- E. To cooperate with the manufacturers and dealers in equipment used in the fire service with a view toward the disemination of information to the fire service on the various devices available, and the development of better and more standardized equipment.
- F. To represent the interests of those in the profession of firefighting before legislative and other bodies considering matters in which they are concerned.
- G. To make charitable donations, including memorial and sickness remembrances, to members and their families, and other persons and communities who suffer financial hardships and losses through death, sickness, injury, conflagrations, and catastrophies.
- H. To receive gifts, and bequests, raise such monies and own such real property as is necessary for the advancement of the foregoing purposes.

#### **ARTICLE II**

Section 1. Whenever required to effectuate the meaning or intent here of, the singular shall include the plural, the masculine shall include the feminine, and vice-versa.

#### **ARTICLE III - THE OFFICERS**

Section 1. The officers of the corporation shall consist of a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer and a Director from each of the six New England States. All officers shall hold their office

for one year or until their successors have been elected. The offices of president, first vice president, second vice president will be on a rotation basis from the six New England States (Maine, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, New Hamp-shire, Connecticut, and Vermont). The President, the First Vice President, Second Vice President and Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected by ballot at the Annual Meeting. A member shall be an active member in accordance with Article VII Section 1a when elected to office, except the Secretary/Treasurer may be an Honorary Life Member.

A candidate for election as a Director must be an active member in accordance with Article VII Section 1a and a resident of the particular state which said Director will represent. He shall be nominated and elected by the members of that state.

All Active and honorary Life Members shall be eligible to vote for all elective officers.

#### ARTICLE IV - THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall consist of officers as provided by Article I and the past President who will serve as a member of the Board for one year. The exhibit chairperson shall be a non-voting member of the Board of Directors. The Board shall meet at such a time and place as may be designated by the president. The actual expenses of the board, which includes travel at a mileage set by the Board of Directors each year, shall be paid by the corporation. Each member of the board shall have one vote, the holding of more than one office notwithstanding.

Section 2. The Past President, the First Vice President, and the Second Vice President shall constitute the Auditing Committee. The Auditing Committee will see that the books have been audited by an outside auditing firm each year before the annual meeting.

#### **ARTICLE V - DUTIES**

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the corporation, and the Board of Directors and shall be the official representative and spokesman of the Association. He shall call special meetings of the Board of Directors when so requested by the majority of the Board of Directors or whenever he deems such a meeting is necessary, provided that a minimum of a three day notice of said meetingshall be given and the reasons therefor. The President shall appoint all committees. All committee members shall be active members in accordance with Article VII Section 1a at the time of appointment, except that the Exhibit Committee Chairman may be an Honorary Life Member. He shall perform such other duties as may be incidental to the office.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the First Vice President to perform the duties of the President during his absence. He shall assist the President in conducting the business and policies of the Association and perform such other duties as prescribed by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall assist the President and First Vice President to perform the duties of their office and in the absence of the President and the First Vice President, assume all the duties and responsibilities of the President.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Secretary/Treasurer to keep a complete record of the proceedings of special and annual meetings of the corporation, the meetings of the Board of Directors; and the standing committees, of which he shall be an ex-officio member; to receive and answer all communications pertaining to the corporation; cause to be prepared a full

report of the proceedings of each annual meeting, which shall be printed and one or more copies, mailed by him to each member of the corporation. He shall receive all communications, contributed papers on topics, etc., designed to be presented to the meeting. He shall collect all monies due the corporation. The Secretary/Treasurer shall have the custody of the funds of the corporation; he shall keep a true account of all monies received and disbursed; pay all bills and at the Annual Meeting of the corporation and before all regular and special meetings make a full and correct report of the same. He shall also employ such assistance as he may need for the collection of dues at the annual meeting and report the proceedings of the same and other such expenditures for clerical assistance at other times as may be approved by the Board of Directors. He shall execute a bond to the corporation in the sum of One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000.00) Dollars to be approved by the Board of Directors, the expense of procuring the same to be borne by the corporation. The consultant fee of the Secretary/Treasurer to be fixed annually at the meeting of the corporation and a pay schedule will bedetermined by the Board of Directors. He shall also perform such other duties as shall be assigned to him by the President and the Board of Directors. He or any other officer shall not assume an individual indebtedness exceeding One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars without the approval of the Board of Directors. He shall be sworn to the faithful performance of his duties upon taking office. The Secretary/Treasurer shall prepare for adoption by the Board of Directors a list of members eligible for Honorary Life Membership.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to transact all the business of the corporation during the time intervening between the annual meetings. They shall have the full power to expunge from the minutes before printing, anything which is objectionable to the corporation or its members. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occurring by death or otherwise during the time from one annual meeting to another and the replacement shall be chosen from the state involved after conferring with the last President of the NEAFC from that state; and may vote by two-thirds of the total number of Directors to remove any officer for cause. A quorum of five (5) Directors shall be required to transact any business. The Board of Directors shall have the power to make charitable donations, including memorial and sickness remembrances to members and their families, and other persons and communities, who suffer financial losses and hardships through death, sickness, injury, conflagration and catastrophes. The Board of Directors shall meet at least quarterly at a time, place, and date set by the President.

Section 6. The clerk of the corporation shall be the director from Massachusetts. The clerk shall perform the duties required under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for corporations.

#### **ARTICLE VI - ANNUAL MEETING**

Section 1. The annual meeting of the corporation shall be held each year during the month of June in conjunction with the annual conference, at such date and place designated by the Board of Directors, notification of the site to be announced to the members of the corporation at the annual meeting. Proposals of sites for the annual meeting/conference shall be forwarded to the secretary not less than five days prior to the start of the annual meeting/conference by a member of the association or a company or corporation in business for this purpose. Proposals shall describe the features of the site, amenities and services to be provided and the cost that would be applicable for the current year that the proposal was presented. The cost information is for comparison purposes only. All site proposals shall be investigated by a site committee as appointed by the President. Proposed sites must be at a fully sprinklered facility and in compliance with state fire codes. This committee shall submit all information relative to the proposals to the secretary for disposition as provided above.

- Section 2. A special meeting of the corporation may be called by the Board of Directors upon at least ten (10) days notice by mail to the members, said notice stating the time, place and purpose of said special meeting.
- Section 3. The exhibit hall and the apparatus display shall at all times be under the sole control of the Exhibit Committee under such rules as the Board of Directors may may adopt.
- Section 4. A registration fee shall be charged every member registering at the annual meeting, the amount to be determined by the Board of Directors. A registration fee shall be charged every non-member registering at the annual meeting, the amount to be determined by the Board of Directors. Entrance to theexhibit hall or educational sessions will require a registration badge or a day pass.
- Section 5. The Board of Directors shall have full power to levy an assessment and collect from the members an amount sufficient to cover the entire expense of the annual meeting.
- Section 6. All proposed changes in the By-Laws and/or resolution to be presented at the annual meeting of the corporation shall be forwarded to the Secretary not less than sixty (60) days prior to the date of such meeting. All proposals shall be sent to each member by mail, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the meeting. All proposals shall be posted in the vicinity of the registration area. A special meeting of the corporation shall be held on the first full day of the annual meeting/conference at which time the proposals shall be read. The proposals shall be voted on the last full day of the annual meeting/conference. A 2/3 vote of the members present and entitled to vote and voting shall be necessary for adoption. The membership by majority vote may request a secret ballot.
- Section 7. A portion of the Annual Conference shall be set apart for the holding of a memorial service in the memory of departed members at an appropriate time and setting as designated by the Association Chaplins and approved by the Board of Directors.
- Section 8. Nomination and election of officers, shall be by secret ballot on the last full day of the annual meeting/conference. All officers elected will be installed at the annual banquet which shall be held on the evening of the last full day of the annual meeting/conference and shall swear to the following oath of office: "I, (name) hereby swear that I will support the Constitution and By-laws and at all times bear allegiance to the goals and purposes of the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Inc. I further swear to perform the duties and responsibilities of my office to the best of my ability and at the end of my term of office, I will deliver to my successor all records of said office, so help me God."
- Section 9. Reports of all committees will be presented on the last day of the annual meeting/conference. The Secretary shall prior to the next annual meeting/conference arrange for the distribution to all members the activities of the annual meeting/conference and meeting of the Board of Directors.

#### **ARTICLE VII - MEMBERSHIP**

Section 1. The membership shall consist of:

#### A. Active Members:

- (1) The Chief of the Fire Department of a regularly organized public fire department;
- (2) Chief of a private Fire Department that provides municipal service;

- (3) Chief of an industrial Fire Department;
- (4) State Fire Marshal:
- (5) Full time employed Fire Commissioners;
- (6) Fire Directors;

#### **B.** Associate Members:

- (1) City or Town Officials, Fire Commissioners, Assistant or Deputy Chiefs or members of fire departments, individuals and individuals representing firms and corporations interested in the protection of life and property against fire.
- (2) Associate members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership in the corporation except the right to vote and as otherwise provided in these By-Laws.

### C. Honorary Life Members:

(1) Honorary Life Members shall be entitled to vote on all matters. Honorary Life Members shall be entitled to all privileges of an active member except as otherwise provided in these By-Laws. Honorary Life Members shall not be required to pay annual dues, however, the Board of Directors may assess Honorary Life Members a fee to cover mailing costs. Honorary Life Membership may be conferred upon active members upon their retirement from office, provided they have been active members of the corporation or its predecessor, The New England Association of Fire Chiefs for a period of five years immediately preceding the date of their retirement, and provided further that they are not identified with fire protection - from a commercial standpoint. Honorary Life Membership will be withdrawn in the event the member becomes identified with fire protection from a commercial standpoint, but may be reinstated by making application to the corporation and receiving a positivevote at an annual meeting.

#### D. Life Membership:

- (1) Individuals, firms and corporations interested in protection of life and property against fire, shall be eligible for life membership upon payment of the fee established in the fee schedule. The Board of Directors may assess Life Members a fee to cover mailing cost.
- (2) Life Members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership in the corporation except the right to vote and as otherwise provided in these By-Laws.
- Section 2. No member who is in arrears for dues and assessments shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of the corporation, and any member who is in arrears on June 1st shall receive a second notice and if still in the arrears on August 1st he shall be dropped from membership.
- Section 3. Dues and Fees Schedule: Dues and fees for Active, Associate, Honorary Life, and Life Members shall be set by the Board of Directors and voted on by the membership at the next annual meeting.
- Section 4. Application for all classes of membership shall be received by the Secretary/Treasurer. The proposed member has to be sponsored by a member in good standing with the corporation. The Secretary/Treasurer shall after investigation approve or disapprove the application except as otherwise provided in these By-Laws. If a question of eligibility arises, a decision to approve or disapprove shall be determined by the Board of Directors.

Section 5. The Secretary/Treasurer shall not register or give a badge or extend any courtesies of the annual meeting to any member whose dues and assessments are not paid to date in full.

Section 6. No member shall be expelled from the membership by vote of less than a majority of all members of the corporation, nor by a vote of less than three-fourths (3/4) of the members present and voting on such expulsion.

#### ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS OF BY-LAWS

Section 1. This corporation shall have full power at a meeting called for that purpose, to alter, amend or repeal these By-Laws, but the same shall not be done except by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members present and entitled to vote at said meeting. The membership by majority vote can request a secret ballot. However, no such proposed amendment shall be considered that has not been read and posted as provided in Article VI, Section 6.

#### **ARTICLE IX - RULES OF ORDER**

Section 1. The presiding officer shall preserve order and decorum. All questions of order shall be decided by him, subject to appeal by any member to the parliamentarian.

Section 2. In a decision of any question coming before the annual meeting for which no provisions are made in the By-Laws, the presiding officer shall be governed by the rules laid down in Robert's Rules of Order.

Section 3. Every member, when he speaks or offers a motion, shall rise in his place, properly identify himself, and respectfully address the presiding officer and when finished shall resume his seat. He shall confine himself to the question under debate, avoid all improper personal references and indecorous language.

Section 4. When two or more members shall rise to speak at the same time, the presiding officer shall decide who shall have the floor.

Section 5. A member called to order by the presiding officer shall immediately cease speaking on the question before the house, and shall not resume his remarks until the question is settled.


