





CHIEF RICHARD K. WEHTER, RETIRED: [Hingham, MA] Report of the Secretary for the Fiscal Year June 1, 2004 through May 31, 2005.

To the Officers and Members of the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Incorporated, I herewith submit the report of the Secretary for the Fiscal Year ending May 1, 2005.

The Officers, Directors, and Committee members have held several meetings throughout the year in preparation for the conference. Full Board meetings were held on September 3 and 24, 2004, November 19 and 20, 2004, February 3 and 4, 2005, and May 19 and 20, 2005. Three meetings were held at the Sheraton Springfield Hotel and one at the Holiday Inn West in Portland, Maine. Several sub-committee meetings were also held throughout the year. The Directors meeting format followed last year's pattern so that the members came in the night before the meeting, which allowed the various committees to meet face to face. The Board also held a meeting on the Thursday night to act on business of the NEAFC, which freed up more time for the Friday morning meeting. The New England Division, New England Fire Equipment Exhibitors Association, and the New England Fire Apparatus Maintenance Association were represented at these meetings. Various officers and directors of the Association throughout the year attended testimonials and Memorial services.

The President and Secretary/Treasurer handled the day-to-day business of the Association, and all correspondence was answered or directed to the appropriate committee. The Secretary edited and prepared the Red Book for printing, prepared all conference forms, tickets, and the conference pocket program. The Secretary also maintained the web site. The site has a wealth of information about the Association as well as all conference information for attendees and exhibitors. More and more exhibitors are now using the on-line registration. We look forward to the continued and expanded use of this site by all our members. The site can be accessed at

www.newenglandfirechiefs.org/. All mailings were prepared by the Secretary with help as required. This year a 24-page color brochure was produced by the Advertising Committee and mailed to all the fire departments in New England. The day pass attendees were merged into the previous year's list and 6800 trifold flyers were mailed out in May. Posters were also mailed in the June Edition of 1st Responder Newspaper. Chief Susi did an excellent job in preparing these brochures.

This year we have continued the Friday, Saturday, and Sunday format for the exhibits as it received a very favorable response again last year. The banquet will be on Saturday night in the Sheraton Hotel following the Memorial Service at the Old First Church in Court Square, Springfield. The Welcome Reception was held on Thursday night, and a barbecue will be held at the Elks Pavilion in West Springfield tonight.

Special thanks to Chief Roy and our Education Coordinator, Chief Carl Winslow, and his committee, for once again arranging our excellent educational program.

Chief Maurais and his wife Linda continue to do another fine job with the exhibit sales. We have constant communications throughout the year in an effort to promote the finest Fire/Expo we can. The Board once again voted to have portable air conditioning brought into the Young Building this year as we wait for the Eastern States to complete their capital improvement program. This item will cost slightly over \$17,000 per year on the last year of a two year contract.

Again, this year, I sold ads to help support the cost of the pocket program. Judy Marshall of the Parade Committee has again been very instrumental in getting donations to cover parade expenses. The Association notes a special thanks to all the sponsors of this year's conference. President Barton, with Board approval, reappointed Sergeant-at-Arms and Chief Anthony Jarvis of Ludlow, MA, was reappointed the Assistant Sergeant-at-Arms.

The Conference Site Committee sent out RFP's for the years 2007-2009. The Board of Directors will make their decision at this conference. The Exhibitors Association is being solicited for their opinion today.

In closing, I would like to thank all the Board members for their support and cooperation throughout the year, with special thanks to President Barton and his wife Jane for their constant communications throughout the year, 1st Vice President Roy and Education Committee Coordinator Chief Winslow, Chief Maurais, Chief John Wood, Secretary/Treasurer of the NEDIAFC, Judy Marshall, Secretary/Treasurer of the NEFEEA, all the Directors, Mr. John T. Walsh, Jr., our accountant since 1992, who has retired, and a very special thank you to my wife Sally and all my daughters for their patience and help in preparing the many mailings and conference registration packages.

It has been an honor to serve as your Secretary for these past 13 years and hope to do to for many more.

The Committee consisted of Chief Wendell Mansfield, Chief Thomas Lambert, Chief Darrel Fournier, Sidney Thurston, Chief William Weston, Chief Roger Bradley, Judy Marshall, Paul Grondalski, and Jack Morris.

July 6, 2004, our vendor list consisted of 708 listings. We deleted 78 names who had not exhibited in the past three years, leaving a total of 630. Eighty-seven new names have been added to our database for a total of 717.

August 5, 2004, thank you letters with preregistration forms were mailed to 277 exhibitors. Seventy-one vendors preregistered by that time.

On April 18, 2005, Conference packets were mailed to 689 vendors. An additional 23 were mailed out on April 15 to new vendors for a total of 712.

June 24, 2005, 167 letters were sent out as a reminder for payments, contracts, registration forms, or insurance certificates.

We have 59 new exhibitors displaying this year and 28 new exhibitors from last year that have returned to exhibit this year.

Approximately 1360 vendor name badges were printed prior to the opening of the Expo and approximately 400 badges were made during the Expo, for an approximate total of 1760.

Many thanks go to Mary Anne Flaherty, Pat and Oti Wyatt, Wendell Mansfield, Nancy Webster, Pat Parow, Diane Farrell, Lorry Jorsey, Phyllis Mansfield, Jane Barton, Eileen Trainor, Estelle Sylvester, Kathleen Tucker, and Charley Bradley for all their help with the Exhibitors Registration area for the last two days. Education Committee Report from Chief Roy.

CHIEF ALAN J. ROY: [Palmer, MA] Thank you, Mr. President. The Education Committee Report for the year 2005. I would like to recognize our Committee, Chief Tom Lambert, Chief Mike Howard, Chief Ed Webster, and Chief Tom Coulombe from the New England Association, Chief Tim Wall from the New England Division. And by the way, Tim does an extremely good job for us on the Division level. Judy Marshall and Brad Preston from the New England Fire Equipment Exhibitors Association, Jack Morris from the New England Fire Apparatus and Maintenance Association, and our Retired Chief Carl Winslow, Education Coordinator.

The Committee met at quarterly meetings to establish quality programs, topics, and speakers for this year's conference. An "Educational Grant Program" was implemented last year to financially assist State Associations of Fire Chiefs. And this year, awards included the Vermont Fire Chiefs Association, Fire Chiefs Association of Massachusetts, and the Rhode Island Fire Chiefs Association.

At the November meeting, two seminars were selected and confirmed: Chief Jack Snook — "Who you are is what they represent;" Mary Ellen Dorsett — "The Art of Influencing and Persuading."

Professional seminars were provided by the New England Fire Apparatus Maintenance Association. The New England Fire Equipment Exhibitors provided various demonstrations at the Expo center.

The Committee would like to extend our appreciation to the many individuals who have helped us throughout the year and a special thanks to the New England Fire Equipment Exhibitors Association for their donation of \$1,000 to sponsor the keynote sessions.

As Chairman, I sincerely appreciate the expertise of Carl Winslow, our Educational Coordinator, Committee Members, and individuals who joined together in assisting and planning this year's programs. Thank you. Respectfully submitted.

PRESIDENT BARTON: You've heard the report of the Education Committee. Wishes?

FROM THE FLOOR: I move we accept the report of the Education Committee as read.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Do we have a second?

CHIEF ROBERT WALLACE: [East Longmeadow, MA] Seconded.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Been moved and seconded. All those in favor?

[Aye.]

Opposed? So voted.

Advertising Committee with Chief Susi.

CHIEF RICHARD A. SUSI: [Cumberland, RI] Thank you, Mr. President. I'm pleased to report that the Advertising Committee accomplished the goals it set earlier in the year by our members. This year our goals were to once again complete and introduce the official program brochure for the 2005 Conference and Exhibition, the tri-fold day pass brochure, and create a new poster that would be heavy stocked to be distributed and posted in fire stations across New England.

First the conference brochure: That was completed and sent out by April 1, 2005. T.C.I. Press from Seekonk, MA, printed 4,000 and mailed approximately 2,500 from our mail list. Another 750 were given to the Exhibit's Chairman to be included in the vendor's packets, while the remaining were made available for distribution as needed.

The cost breakdown is as follows: Brochure printing, \$3,781; postage \$2,500; and bulk mail \$655.40. Total brochure costs \$4,436.40. We actually saved a few hundred dollars from last year. We were able to get a little bit more done on the computer, and it actually cut some of what the printer had to do.

Advertising income from ad space sold in the brochure was sold at the rate of \$1,100 per page. All available ad space was sold. Total of 11 ads were sold, for a total of \$7,898.00.

The tri-fold day pass mailing, that brochure for the day pass has been completed and mailed by May 14, which was also printed at TCI Press in Seekonk, Massachusetts. 8,000 were printed to be sent out, and that's over 6,500 on our day pass list. This was an increase of over 2,000 new attendees added to the list. Once again, we sold our sponsorship ads to the New England Fire Equipment Exhibitors Association for \$750.00. Sponsorship, I'd like to thank again Judy Marshall for again securing that. She does a lot of work for us, and we really appreciate all the work she does.

The cost breakdown for the tri-fold is as follows:

Tri-fold printing costs \$1205.29. The postage was \$1,981.08. So, the total tri-fold cost was \$3,186.37, which was up a bit because we printed more, and we had obviously mail out more to cover that extra 2,000.

The poster: This was a new ad piece this year. It was an idea to have the poster in every fire station in New England. We came up with having a poster inserted into the First Responder Newspaper, thereby, being distributed into 8,200 papers delivered to fire stations throughout New England. The printing cost for the poster, and we had 10,000 of them printed, cost \$1,675.00. The cost of insertion into the First Responder Newspaper was \$750.00, which we thought was a really good deal. And shipping — we had to ship them from our printer to their printer to insert them — was \$135.00; for a total cost of \$2,560.00.

Other advertising — advertising includes the following publications and/or web sites: First Responder New England and New York, \$2,670.00. First Responder on-line \$100.00. Firehouse.com was no charge, and Fire Apparatus magazine was a barter for booth space. Approximate cost for other advertising \$2,770.00.

Summary: Conference brochure, \$4436.40; tri-fold, \$3186.37. Totals are \$2,560.00. Other advertising — \$2,770.00; for a total expenses of \$12,952.77. And this is only the advertising that our committee was responsible for. It does not include the Red Book or anything like that.

Other advertising income: Conference brochure \$7,148.00; and the tri-fold sponsorship from the Exhibitors \$750.00, for a total income of \$7,898.00. Total net cost — I give the net cost to the New England Association of \$5,054.77.

Once again, I'd like to thank the members of the Advertising Committee for their help with obtaining the needed information in a timely manner. A special thank you will always go to my wife Holly, who is responsible for a big part of our designs and our layouts. As I said last year, she can't always make the meetings of the Guest Committee, but she definitely does her part on this committee. Respectfully submitted, Richard A. Susi.

CHIEF JOHN J. FLAHERTY, RETIRED: [West Springfield, MA] The Parade Committee, I believe we're all set. I talked to Bernie today; everything is all set to go. Because Father is here, Father Jim, he promises the weather is going to be fine. We'll hold him to that promise, because Father Larry says that you've got to watch him. But we're all set for the parade. We're just hoping for a good turnout, and we expect you back at the firehouse for some hamburgers and hot dogs after the parade. Thank you.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Thank you, John. Your wishes. CHIEF OTIS WYATT, RETIRED: I move the report be accepted as given.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Is it seconded?

CHIEF RAYMOND A. GODIN: [Turners Falls, MA] Seconded.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Moved and seconded to accept the report of the Parade Committee. All those in favor?

[Aye.]

Opposed? So voted.

Registration Committee with Chief Wehter.

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: We had 104 preregistered members for the conference, plus 56 spouse guests. Today, when I left the Expo, we were in box number 1500, so it's fair to say that we did 1500 people today at the Expo. And if the weather — and we're counting on you — holds out, I'm sure we're going to have a great weekend.

I know Charley was telling me that the exhibitors are very happy today. I saw a lot of chiefs there from my area and Massachusetts because I know a lot of chiefs from Massachusetts, and it was a good turn out for chief officers today. Thank you.

PRESIDENT BARTON: You heard the report of the Registration Committee.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: I move it be accepted as presented.

PRESIDENT BARTON. So moved. Seconded.

CHIEF JOHN E. PAROW: [Chelmsford, MA] Seconded.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Moved and seconded to accept the report of the Registration Committee. All those in favor?

[Aye.]

Opposed? So voted.

Golf Committee, Chief Barkman.

CHIEF DAVID R. BARKMAN: [West Springfield, MA] I don't have the final report on the golf yet until we go through all the numbers, but I think we did well on that. I don't think we could have asked for a better day. I think the course was in great shape. Everybody who has mentioned or talked about it was happy about it. We had 116 golfers, and it went great, so thank you.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: Question, Mr.Chairman, on the Golf Committee: Is it true that Chief Pearson from Rhode Island hit a hole-in-one?

CHIEF DAVID BARKMAN: Maybe he did, but nobody witnessed it. Let's put it that way.

[Laughter.]

PRESIDENT BARTON: You've heard the report of Chief Barkman.

CHIEF CHARLES MAURAIS, RETIRED: I make a motion to approve it as presented.

PRESIDENT BARTON: So moved.

CHIEF OTIS WYATT, RETIRED: I'll second that.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Been moved and seconded to accept the report of Chief Barkman of the Golf Committee. All those in favor?

[Aye.]

Opposed? So moved.

Site Committee Report, Chief Wehter.

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: In accordance with the Bylaws,the Board of Directors are responsible to announce the site for next year. Next year is the third year of our contract here with Springfield.

During the past year, R.F.P.'s were sent out to Boston, Providence, Springfield, and Hartford for the years 2007, 2008, with an option for 2009.

The Site Committee has met maybe a couple of times. We've reviewed the proposals. The Board of Directors, at our meeting in May, allowed the New England Fire EquipmentExhibitors Association to give their input. We were given a survey this

morning, which we will find out the results sometime later today.

The Site Committee will meet on Sunday morning and will present their findings to the Board of Directors on Sunday morning, who will make the decision on where we will go in 2007, 2008, and 2009. The two candidates are here again in Springfield and Providence. Thank you.

PRESIDENT BARTON: You've heard the report of Chief Wehter of the Site Committee.

CHIEF JOHN FLAHERTY, RETIRED: I move that the Site Committee Report be accepted as presented.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Move to be accepted as reported. CHIEF JOHN PAROW: I second the report.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Moved and seconded to accept as presented. All those in favor?

[Aye.]

Opposed? So moved.

CHIEF JOHN WOOD, JR.: [White River Junction, VT] Just so the people could talk about it a little bit, is there a chance you could, Dick, give some of the facts on the two different places, just so that the membership would know a bit about the differences between Providence and Springfield in terms of cost, if we go for either one of those, just so the membership knows?

We understand that the Board has the authority to vote this in, just a little bit to hear about the different costs for each place and what the pros and cons are.

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: I'll just give a brief overview. Some of the main areas, of course, are hotels, hotel costs. There is a fairly significant difference between Springfield and Rhode Island.

As far as exhibit space, the costs are probably within five to six thousand dollars for the exhibit space. There is a question in some minds about the amount of exhibit space that is available in Providence; obviously, we know what's available here. We've been here for nine years.

We look at some of the smaller things, like bussing. In Providence the proposal is to host at the Marriott, which is about a half a mile, mile down the street, and they're offering some type of free transportation.

Here, we have bussing. It costs us approximately \$3,900.00 to run those buses for three days. It goes from the hotel here over to the Hilton Gardens and the Best Western on Route 5 in

West Springfield. It makes the rounds first thing in the morning and then back and forth every half hour to the Expo Center.

Other areas that we looked at were security, union versus nonunion shop, parking. At the Sheraton here, the current parking is \$9.95 a day; at the Marriott in Providence, it's free outside parking. Let's see. Parking at the Expo is \$5.00 at the Eastern States. It's \$8.00 at the Rhode Island Convention Center, or if you stayed overnight the whole night there, it would be \$16.00.

And the other things were the security, cost of electricity and any extra space that was available, outside space, inside space.

Anything else you want me to say, John?

CHIEF JOHN WOOD, JR.: I'm on the Site Committee for those of you who don't know. I just thought it would be good for the membership to hear whatever the pros and cons might be. The overall package is, how does it fall out in the overall package is the main thing. The exhibit space there is around \$5,000, and the rooms are, the hotel rooms are—

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: The hotel rooms, there's a difference of about \$70.00 a night.

CHIEF JOHN WOOD, JR.: Across the Board from hotel to hotel or just the headquarters?

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: The proposed hotel for this area is the Sheraton, and the proposed hotel from Rhode Island was the Marriott. There's a \$70.00 per night difference. That's inclusive of taxes. It went from like \$112.00 to \$180.00. But the difference — we asked in the R.F.P. that they submit prices that were firm and not with built in percentage increases. The Sheraton here gave us firm prices. Rhode Island gave us percentages, anywhere from two to five percent increases. I have factored that into my matrix here.

The Rhode Island Convention did give us a \$10,000.00 concession. Was that the convention center or the convention bureau? Where is Mr. Pearson?

CHIEF STUART PEARSON, DIRECTOR: Rhode Island Convention Center.

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: They gave us a \$10.000.00 concession on their fees.

There was talk also about buildings, the number of spaces. As you know, here, over at Eastern States, we use the Better Living Center, the Young Building, and the outside space, which is known as Apple Way, Apple Valley.

The Young Building this year is completely full. We're sold out. We were sold out six, seven weeks ago, Charley, and had a waiting list. This is the biggest year we've ever had. We do have room for expansion there. There are other buildings if we wanted to go that route.

And I guess one of the big questions the Site Committee has had now and before, how far do we want to go with this? Do we ever want to downsize? Some people have said, well, we've been here for nine years. This is a long period of time. But if you look in the Red Book here in the front section, it tells you where we've been for the last 83 years. And you'll see that there were a lot of years that we spent up in New Hampshire, Wentworth By the Sea, and other places.

But as you look at each place, the Association and the Conference has grown, to the point where if we ever really wanted to go big time, we'd have to go to Boston. And, of course, if we go to Boston, that's a huge expense; not only to us, but to the people who make it all possible, our exhibitors.

So, the Board of Directors will have to make that decision, and we certainly welcome your input too. Thank you.

ASSISTANT CHIEF CRAIG E. BEAUSOLEIL: [North Smithfield, RI] I have a question. I was under the impression that we had sponsorships up over \$50,000 to offset the cost, and I hear that's coming close to a \$100,000. I don't know if that was brought forth or not. I didn't hear anything about that in the report.

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: We don't know anything about any \$50,000 sponsorship. Nothing was given in writing in the R.F.P.

CHIEF RICHARD A. SUSI: Mr. President, just to answer the question: It is true that Rhode Island had sponsorships. We thought it in the best interest in trying to compare apples with apples and oranges with oranges that we not mention things that someone could say may not happen due to the corporation changing its mind. We thought we would keep it on an even keel.

But what Chief Beausoleil says is absolutely true. It was just not put forward because we didn't feel that that would be a fair representation to say, hey, we can do it for \$50,000 or a \$100,000 less because sponsorships would come down in three years.

But I would, just while answering that question, I would like to clarify — I don't know if it was put in the R.F.P. incorrectly when Providence moved back — I'm not sure if coming back from the Marriott incorrectly or not, but the latest word I heard from the Marriott is that they were guaranteeing a flat rate for their total rooms at \$150.00 and \$154.00. I think it was \$154.00. So, I would take exception to the portrayal of the \$180.00 a night for Rhode Island; that kind of jacks it up quite a bit more.

And I think that there are others in this room that would agree that some of the information that got put out in the vendors' survey was already, in my opinion — and I will speak for myself and only myself — slanted. It's slanted very much towards Springfield. So, I just don't want to at this meeting, once again, and we haven't mentioned that, but, once again, we're showing a \$30.00 a night increase again to Rhode Island, not from what it is. And maybe the information wasn't put in the R.F.P. from Rhode Island, but that's the latest word I got.

We're not trying to pull anything, and that's why we didn't include the sponsorships. These are not sponsorships from political people, political organizations. These were corporate sponsorships that we thought might be a good idea. It's certainly something good to have in your pocket if it was going to get voted to come to Rhode Island with an even comparison, but we just didn't think it should be something that would be included in the proposal. Thank you.

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: The R.F.P. from Rhode Island, from the Marriott Hotel, listed the base price for a hotel room in 2006 at \$156.00 for 2007, 2008, they gave — it would be a fixed rate for both years, plus the taxes. And a percentage increase; then there would be another percentage increase in 2009. The base rates in 2006 was \$156.00. But we're not going there in 2006; we're going there in 2007, which reflected a percentage increase somewhere between, all hotels down there gave a percentage increase of varied between two and five percent.

CHIEF JOHN PAROW: I find it very interesting that we have a questionnaire going out to the vendors, I think that's very true. I know we're in the 11th hour for the Site Committee for the next three years up to 2009. But have we given any thought in future site committees to sending a questionnaire out to the membership and getting some input from the membership to see what they think about the whole process? Just a suggestion.

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: Jack, I think we did something like that the last time. It went out; we got about that many responses (indicating), whether or not there wasn't a big interest in it at that time —

PRESIDENT BARTON: Any other comments?

CHIEF ROBERT W. SELTZER: [Coventry, RI] First Vice President of the Rhode Island Association of Fire Chiefs. I just want to address the Board of Directors quickly and the membership to let you know that the Rhode Island Association of Fire Chiefs is 100 percent behind supporting the Expo in Providence, if it does come there.

We think we have a lot to offer. We've got Newport. We've got a lot going on downtown. I know the mayor of Providence is very supportive of this; our legislature is very supportive of this. And we know we have a lot of corporate backing as well. So, we would like to have the opportunity to show our hospitality to our New England States. Since this is the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, we would certainly like you to consider us for one of the sites. Thank you.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Chief Flaherty.

CHIEF JOHN FLAHERTY: I was on the previous Site Committee that looked at Providence, and also at that time, it was just the two, Providence and Springfield. And I went down and looked at the facilities, and the vendors also looked at the facilities and talked to the mayor at that time and the senators there. And there were all kinds of promises, you know, for financial help and whatever.

And it was funny, at a retirement party not too long after, I was told by my good friend, Frank, that the senator lost the election and the mayor was in jail.

But that has nothing to do with the beauty of Providence. Providence is a very beautiful city. I think it just comes down to, you know, what is a financial decision that this association has to make on where they should be. And that decision is based on what is financially feasible, not only for the chiefs, but of the vendors.

If you listen to Chief Wehter's report, he only has about a little over a hundred that are registered here at the hotel. But if you look at the number of room nights that we have, you'll see that most of the nights are paid by the vendors; it's paid by the vendors and the helpers of the vendors.

So, it is a very strong financial consideration to the vendors on where they go, because it's very expensive if they have to pay \$50.00 extra a night on their room. I know that the vendors are making the decision, and I know that the site —

But I feel that the Site Review Committee is there to make a financial decision in the best interest of the Association, and I think they should be allowed to do their job. Thank you.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: Mr. President and distinguished members of the Board of Directors, there's a few things I'd like to comment on, Chief Flaherty. John and I go way back and have a real close personal friendship. But what I do want to say, John, as far as the mayor goes, I certainly miss him; I'll tell you that right now. And I do want the members to know that they brought 29 charges against the mayor, and they found him innocent on 28, but he couldn't get by the Rico and that's how they got him. And I hope he gets out pretty soon. He's doing a heck of a job in the Army because they've got him at Fort Dix; he's leaving there. He's coming to Fort Devens, so maybe he'll be coming here to one of our conferences here in Springfield, Massachusetts. Thank you.

CHIEF GARY CASSANELLI: [Springfield, MA] Mr. President and Board of Directors and any fellow Chiefs, just to kind of follow-up on what John said. First of all, I'd like to thank the New England Chiefs and the Division and all the Chiefs and the Board of Directors for making a commitment to Springfield for all these many years. And I can tell you on my behalf and all the chiefs around here, we stand ready to support this conference. And we obviously want to see you come back here to Springfield and West Springfield.

One thing I will say, we have been guided — I know John and I have talked about this — by what is in the best interest of the organization, and we want to continue to see this organization grow. I don't know if it would continue to do that in Providence. I don't have an answer to that. We'll have to rely on the Site Committee and the recommendation made to the Board of Directors and the good wisdom made to Board of Directors.

But I can tell you this, I've had a lot association with West Springfield, and the Big E, I think, beside from the hotel rooms here, which are very reasonably priced, the Big E is a real jewel. And I can honestly tell you that if the organization decides to move from the Big E, you very well may not get that slot back if you decide to come back. That's not being a threat; that's just a reality. The Big E is a very popular venue; it's suited our needs extremely well. And I think it's a very difficult decision.

I don't envy the decision you have to make. I've been to Providence; I love Providence. If we could dig a trench and get water/fire up to West Springfield, Frank, we'd be digging right now. It's one of the greatest things I've ever seen. It's a terrific city, and 28 out of 29 isn't bad, Frank. But I thank you very much. I thank you for your commitment to coming here. And, again, we stand ready to make this conference as great as it can be. So with that, thank you.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Any other comments? Well, as we said earlier, we will be meeting as a Site Committee at 8:00 a.m. on Sunday. And following that, the Board of Directors will be meeting, and I'm sure if there's still questions and whatever that have to be answered, what have you, they'll be done certainly with no arbitrary decision being made until that information is obtained. And I'd leave that to my successor to make sure that happens.

Old Business.

CHIEF JOHN PAROW: I think we still need to vote on the Site Committee report.

PRESIDENT BARTON: What are your wishes on the Site Committee report?

CHIEF JOHN PAROW: It's already been seconded. We just need to vote on it.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Call for the vote. All those in favor? [Aye.]

Opposed? So voted. Thank you.

Now, we'll move on to Old Business. If not, let's go to New Business?

CHIEF THOMAS COULOMBE: Mr. President, I would make a motion that the New England Association of Fire Chiefs endorses Chief Calvin Cochran for Second Vice President of the International Association of Fire Chiefs.

FROM THE FLOOR: Seconded.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Been voted and seconded that we endorse the name of Calvin Cochran for Second Vice President of the International. All those in favor?

[Aye.]

Opposed? So voted.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: Is the floor still open under New Business, Mr. President? I move that the New England Association of Fire Chiefs make a \$1,000 donation towards his campaign.

CHIEF JOHN FLAHERTY: Seconded.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Been moved and seconded that we donate \$1,000 for his campaign. All those in favor?

[Aye.]

Opposed? So voted.

CHIEF JOHN FLAHERTY: Mr. President, I'm looking to ask the Association to make a donation. I don't know whether it should come under New Business or go Good of the Association. Maybe I'll give you the story.

Last night, you had the Opening Ceremony, and the bagpiper, if you notice, was wearing glasses. One of his bagpipers, Danny Boyle, isn't expected to live very long, and he was in tears. And I don't know if this is the place or if you want to do it later, I'd like a donation of \$250.00. I guess he's going on vacation tomorrow, and I don't think he's going to last much longer, so something from the Association.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: Let's form a motion, John. I would second that motion.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Been moved and seconded we donate the sum of \$250.00 to the bagpiper. Any further discussion?

All those in favor?

[Aye.]

Opposed? So voted.

Any other new business?

CHIEF ROBERT W. SELTZER: [Coventry, RI] The Rhode Island Caucus had a discussion earlier and in light of the fact that there's a significant amount of funds available to the Association, we'd like to suggest and make a motion that the Directors from each state be allowed as a committee to review the funding and propose a program that can be used for training and fire fighter safety, through some of that funding, to go back to the states and support the fire service. We feel there's quite a bit of funding there. And we thought that if we could get some of our money back into the states, see what the Association is doing for all of our members, maybe actually get more members involved with the organization, and support the fire service in New England.

PRESIDENT BARTON: I stand to be corrected, but I would think that would fall under our present educational grant that the various states applied for. Each state is allowed up to \$2,000 a year. It could be a total of \$12,000 for all six states. That would be my observation, and that certainly would meet under that criteria. Would you want to set up a separate one?

CHIEF ROBERT SELTZER: Yes, a separate committee. What we ask is that a separate committee be formed to and empowered to come back with a program to the Board of Directors and to the Membership to establish a better funded, and something that's more targeted towards firefighter safety in the fire service or beyond just that \$2,000 program for training.

And I don't know what that program maybe, but it seems the Organization needs to put something back into our New England states to support the fire service. Because, quite honestly, I'm a new comer for the last three years, but other than the Expo, I'm not sure this organization is reaching out to the fire service in today's environment and all that's going on in the fire service and the commitment to fire safety, etc. I think there's a lot more the organization can do.

And in light of almost \$6,000 money we have available, I'm sure some of that could go back into the supporting the New England states and supporting our firefighters' safety in general.

CHIEF TOM COULOMBE: I would take exception to that remark in the fact that we do have a \$2,000 educational grant that's available for every state and has been available for two years. The first year of the education grant, one state took advantage of that. All of us as Board of Director members knew this and brought it back to organization and still we did not get any money.

This year we have three. So, there's money out there that is available for the organization. I think I could support that if every state was using \$2,000 and then coming back and saying, you know, what we want to do more, so can we get more? But I think doing something, and we can't give away the money that is available now, is a useless committee.

CHIEF RICHARD SUSI: I think maybe a clarification should be made. I think that the request had to do with firefighter safety and training, and I think the \$2,000 grants are very specific to professional development for our members. It's 50 percent. I mean, it's a matching grant to up to \$2,000 for a professional development seminar or whatever it is that we have put together from each state.

As we just put in for the State of Rhode Island a grant for matching funds for \$2,000. But it is for professional development and has really nothing to do with firefighter safety and training, unless you consider our own professional development of our chiefs, firefighter safety and training.

I think the concept was specific in firefighter safety and

training. And being at the Caucus and not being there for the remainder of the conversation, I believe what the focus was is that there is, the Association has quite a good deal of money. And I think we've discussed this in our Board of Directors meetings and will discuss it further and will certainly discuss it further in the next year, and at least two years that I know of anyway, on where are we going? What are we taking in all this money for? Not that we shouldn't — this is a great show; it makes money. What are we going to do with it?

We've got \$691,000, and I understand, Billy, that some of that if committed for bills. I know you like to say that, and that is absolutely correct. But we say it every year, and we're going up each year an average — if you look at the past six years — we go up an average of, I think, before I looked at it, before today's figure, it was \$75,000 a year. We just had a good year, that the difference from one year to the next was \$117,000 or \$119,000; I can't remember can. That will obviously bring up the average from probably \$75,000 to probably \$80,000 or \$85,000 over those six years. We take in a lot of the money.

And I think the notion and the idea and the concept was to have the director from each state sit as a committee to decide, where is this organization going with it's funding? What are they going to do to give back to the fire service in each state in New England? They do give back in the form of a show to provide the Expo, to provide the information on all the latest equipment and the educational training with all the latest people that can give it to us and whatever we'd like to spend towards our speakers. But we're still making a lot of money, and where are we going with that? And that's the point.

Because in a few years, gentleman and ladies, we're going to have a million dollars here. It's not going to be that long.

When I started out five years ago, the bottom line was, I think, \$250,000 or so at the end of Dick's report and now it's up to \$691,000, I believe.

So, that's my comment on it. I don't think it was meant for anything Chief Coulombe to take exception or anything. I think it was something different. It wasn't professional development; that was the point.

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: I'd like to make a clarification about the available money. Yes, we do have \$690,000. \$252,000 of that is in CDs. It's a default fund in case we default on the conference, not by our own fault, but by

some act of whatever, that we have to scrub this conference and pay this hotel \$30,000. The Expo Center \$30,000, whatever, just conference cost. That's a lot of money. So, we do have that four hundred something in general fund money.

But if you go back to about the year 2000, we made about a total of \$12,000 in this conference. It's only been in the last two years that we started to make money, because we increased the exhibitors' fees, and that's because the conference has grown, and we're maxed out; right now, we're maxed out. And that's why we've gained this money.

The discussions on the grant, the educational grant money, Chief Fournier from Maine made a motion to give more than \$2,000; I think it was \$5,000. It was decided to try this thing and see what was going on, what the response was from the states. You know, as has been stated, it hasn't been that great yet. But this is a Fire Chief's conference, and we started to develop this program for the Fire Chiefs Associations and the various states.

It's not to say that we can't understand it. A few years ago we did have seminars during the year, a couple of them actually, that were open to all the members of this association.

CHIEF FREDERICK STANLEY: [Hope Valley, RI] I'd like to second the motion so we can have a discussion on it.

CHIEF WILLIAM N. WESTON: [Bellows Falls, VT] I just want to make a comment on the educational program. It is a new program, and we in Vermont have taken advantage of it from day one. It works excellent. There is a committee that runs it. There was a cap of \$2,000; they already made a comment on that. It's the existing program. It works very well, and we've used it in Vermont for educational opportunities up our way. Maybe the thing to do is expand it, as Chief Wehter was saying.

But just as an awareness thing, very few people seem to be applying for it. So, if there's an interest to get it in your state, I would encourage you to apply for it; show the need like we do in Washington, and maybe we can go from there.

But there is that program. It works excellent. We've used it in Vermont for the two years it's been in existence. It really works well. Thanks.

CHIEF JOHN FLAHERTY, RETIRED: I almost think I'm a fixture here, I'm up talking so much, Frank, almost like you. But the Board of Directors should look at what they have available in grants and that, but that should be done by the

Board of Directors. And there are various fire departments within their state giving their Board of Directors direction as to what areas they want the Board of Directors to look into as far as firefighter safety. You know, officer preparedness or what. And let the Board of Directors take a vote, and if they have the money and they can make a successful program, go ahead and do it.

I think they are absolutely right, that we're not here to bank money. We do have to have money, as Dick Wehter pointed out, for a bad conference. It's on our behalf to do that. If we have extra money and there is a need out there, I think the money should be put in a position where you can do some good for the fire service of New England. Thank you.

CHIEF TOM COULOMBE: Thank you, Mr. President, and, Chief, I agree with you wholeheartedly. That's what we're about. We're about safety of the firefighters and education for the fire chiefs here in New England. And I agree, the \$2,000 grant is a matching grant that we have here by the New England Association.

I would make a suggestion, hopefully, respectfully submit to you people that we form a subcommittee of just the Directors from each state to look into what's going on within their state.

These people here, these Directors know what's going on within their state, and let them make the decision on what we could do and further educate and make it a safer place for the firefighters and also help our fire chiefs.

CHIEF STUART D. PEARSON: [Harmony, RI] Mr. President, I'd like to make that into a motion.

PRESIDENT BARTON: It is my understanding we do have a motion on the floor for the \$2,000 that the Board of Directors would look at, a subcommittee, and have their own committee review and look it. I believe it was seconded.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: I'll second that amendment, and we vote on the amendment of the motion, I believe, the amendment first.

PRESIDENT BARTON: We have a motion and it was seconded. Now, if you'd like to make an amendment to it; that's the next step.

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: I'm not clear about what you're saying about a committee. The Bylaws of Association directed the President to appoint all committees with the approval of the Board of Directors.

CHIEF JOHN FLAHERTY: I'm going along with the Director from Rhode Island and suggesting that the President appoint the Directors of the six New England States as a committee to report back to all the Directors on the proposal.

So, that would be instead of us doing it; you do it at your meeting, your Board of Directors meeting, just have you or the Incoming President, you know, form a committee of the Directors of the New England Association, and they have a committee amongst yourselves to come back and make any recommendations to the body. Does that make sense?

So, the amendment is for instead of having the committee come from the various fire departments, have the committee come to your Board. So have a committee, but have the President appoint the committee from the Board.

CHIEF FREDERICK STANLEY: I'll withdraw my second.

FROM THE FLOOR: I'll withdraw my further motion.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Original motion and seconded has been withdrawn.

CHIEF JOHN FLAHERTY: Would you make mine the motion?

PRESIDENT BARTON: The motion now would be?

CHIEF JOHN FLAHERTY: The motion now is the Board of Directors from the six New England States to assess the need and make appropriate actions.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: I'll second it.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Moved and served. Any further discussion?

FROM THE FLOOR: Seconded.

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: I'm not sure it's the purview of the meeting to direct the President to appoint the committee. It's his prerogative to appoint the committee.

CHIEF JOHN FLAHERTY: We're suggesting it.

CHIEF RICHARD WEHTER, RETIRED: And there are only six directors. There's no problem with increasing the money. All we need is some direction and input on spending it. I'm all in favor of spending some of that money, trust me.

CHIEF JOHN FLAHERTY: Mr. President, the general consensus of the body is they'd like to see this happen. I think that you can make it happen. You know what the consensus of the body is. I don't think you need a motion to do that, so, we're not ordering you do that, but we'd be quite upset if you didn't.

But I think, John, that you're just looking next to you there, that let him worry about it.

I'm willing to withdraw the motion and just let it go with the committee taking the appropriate action. All right?

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: Mr. President, there's a motion on the floor. The motion has been made and seconded. The gentleman from West Springfield, who is somewhat of a parliamentarian, wants to withdraw his motion, but I just don't want to withdraw my second. I think we made it where the membership wants to vote on it. I don't think it's a motion that's going to cost any amount of money. What it is is just asking for you people to look into it and appoint the committee or directors to look into it.

Am I correct John, is that what you want? I think what we should do, in all fairness, it's been directed to call for a vote. I think we should at least call for a vote on the motion made by Chief Flaherty.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Well, I think we have to review what does the Bylaws say we can do and can't do; we want to research that. We are governed by certain things we can do. I think we certainly hear what the body would like to do. And I don't see why we can't try to encompass that, whether we have to do A, B, and C.

CHIEF FRANK SYLVESTER: It's simple, Mr. President. It's either a vote up and vote down one way or another. I certainly have an awful lot of respect for Mr. Flaherty as far as his knowledge on his being a parliamentarian. I certainly have enough respect for his knowledge. It's either vote up or vote down, one or the other.

CHIEF RICHARD A. SUSI: [Cumberland, RI] Aren't the key words that you're making a suggestion?

FROM THE FLOOR: I believe in most organizations, the President appoints the standing committee. But this is a special request from the membership. So, this is a special committee, if you want to look at it this way, and the President still has the authority to appoint it through the membership's asking the President to do that. So, we haven't taken anybody's power away. We've added something beyond the standing committee. I don't see where this should be a problem. I'm assuming following Roberts Rules of Order, and if it doesn't conflict with the bylaws, it shouldn't be a problem. It's just a request from the membership.

PRESIDENT BARTON: Okay, all those in favor, signify please?



I would also ask that we remember those men and women of our armed forces, with the total now being 1700 plus, who have made great sacrifices to protect our freedom and continue to serve us with great pride.

REVEREND JAMES SEYMOUR, CHAPLAIN: My friends, Lord be with you.

REVEREND LAWRENCE PROVENZANO, CHAPLAIN: In the name of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. In the days following

the attacks of September 11, we all had the chance to read the written copies of the cell phone messages sent from passengers on the planes to their spouses and families in those desperate last minutes. We also have had the opportunity to read the spiritual advice apparently given to the terrorists by one of their clerics, thoughts that should be in their minds as they approached the death they had chosen for themselves and for others. The Archbishop of Canterbury, Rhode Williams has said, as he experienced the attacks of 9/11 in St. Paul's Chapel, "The chill of September 11 lies in the contrast of those two different sets of words."

The religious words are in the cold light of day, the words of murderers, which they are saying to themselves to make a martyr's drama of a terrible crime. The nonreligious words are a testimony to what religious language should be. The triumph of gratuitous love, the affirmation of faithfulness and connectiveness, even in the face of knowing that there was nothing that could be done or salvaged.

Many of us Chaplains have found ourselves caught in that very contrast. No, not encouraging murder, but rather discovering that the language of religion, the language that we are so used to using, that language that implies a deeper understanding of God, at times is not suitable in the face of gracious love and self sacrifice that gives new expression and new meaning to religion and faith filled living.

When we stand with you on the fire ground, there is almost simultaneous translation at work. Interpreting the movements and directions of the incident commander as he or she attempts to walk the balance became of suppression of the fire and protection of firefighters. Hearing the language of rehab and recognizing the face of unconditional love and support for one another; watching the back slaps and nods and hugs that translate fear and anxiety into reassurance.

And when those times come that we must face death, the recognition that tradition, walking in uniform, muffled drums, bagpipes, are the messengers of comfort, hope, and faith.

Today, as we gather in this historic church, there is a holy melding together of religious and the nonreligious; and a recognition that as we mourn those who have gone before us, all of our actions, all of our words give expression to our oneness in God, our service to God's people, and our gratitude to those who have gone before us.

My friends, never make the mistake of thinking that we up here are the holy ones. Some of you already know that well. [Laughter.]

There are always moments like this. We have notcornered the market on selfless love, duty, honor, service. Each of us have had the tremendous privilege of watching you at work; watching you care deeply for your departments, your communities, your families. We have watched you and prayed with you as you have had to deliver the hard news to a family or members of your own departments. We have watched your faces as we have entered debriefings with your fire fighters and recognize the anguish on your face, that same anguish of a pastor struggling to support a flaw.

And, moreover, within the confines of our unique relationship of Chiefs and Chaplains, we have watched many of you quietly endure the criticism of the troops and the void of support from your towns and cities.

Although many of you will retreat from this notion, the words you say, the actions you perform, the services you provide may not be considered religious, but they are unquestionably holy. Thank you for the example that you give to all of us.

We are here today to remember those who have gone before us, those who have died in the line of duty, and those for whom the tour has ended after many years of faithful service. What we do and say here today must carry with it the remembrance of the unique holiness of each of them whom we will name, and we must honor their part in this continuing work we do.

I would like to leave you with this image of those who have gone before us. It is a story that blends religious faith and baseball, and I will be quick to add that it has nothing to do with the Red Sox or the Yankees. It is a story about a minor league team outside of St. Louis, Missouri, several decades ago.

During home games, whenever a home team player hit a fly ball into the outfield, the entire stadium would stand up and simultaneously scream at the ball, "Go on, get up, get out of here," in support of their team, and in hopes that they might conjure the ball over the fence.



BYLAWS – NEW ENGLAND ASSOCIATION OF FIRE CHIEFS, INC.

As amended 06/20/03

ARTICLE I

- **Section 1**. This organization shall be known as the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Incorporated.
- **Section 2**. The purpose for which the corporation is formed, and its mission, is as follows:
- A. To operate as a non-profit corporation; to encourage and cooperate in the development of new techniques, equipment and practices; to promote more effective organizations and functions of the Firefighting Service, with a view toward greater protection of life and property from the dangers of fire and other hazards.
- B. To aid in the dissemination of information among the Fire Chiefs of New England concerning: newly developed equipment and procedures for fighting fires and carrying out the other functions of the fire service; special hazards and problems presented by the development of new industrial and scientific processes and equipment; disasters caused by natural or human origin; practices in particular areas in the administration of Fire Departments; other matters affecting and concerning the fire service.
- C. To provide the means for: an exchange of ideas between its members; conducting of conferences between the members and with those having specialized knowledge on particular matters effecting the fire service; and the study of matters by its committees.
- D. To provide facilities and operate testing grounds for the display, demonstration and testing of equipment required and techniques of operation used in the fire service.
- E. To cooperate with the manufacturers and dealers in equipment used in the fire service with a view toward the dissemination of information to the fire service on the various devices available, and the development of better and more standardized equipment.
- F. To represent the interests of those in the profession of firefighting before legislative and other bodies considering matters in which they are concerned.
- G. To make charitable donations, including memorial and sickness remembrances, to members and their families, and other persons and communities who suffer financial hardships and losses through death, sickness, injury, conflagrations, and catastrophes.
- H. Any request for a donation to a candidate running for office must be submitted to the Board of Directors for a recommendation to the Annual Meeting at least thirty (30) days prior to said meeting.
- I. To receive gifts, and bequests, raise such monies and own such real property as is necessary for the advancement of the foregoing purposes.

ARTICLE II

Section 1. Whenever required to effectuate the meaning or intent here of, the singular shall include the plural, the masculine shall include the feminine, and vice-versa.

ARTICLE III - THE OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of the corporation shall consist of a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer and a Director from each of the six New England States. Candidates for the elected positions of President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer, and State Director, shall make their intentions known that they are a candidate for office by submitting their candidacy to the Secretary/Treasurer no less than ninety (90) days prior to the Annual Meeting for posting in the conference brochure or other mailing at least sixty (60) days prior to the annual meeting. All officers shall hold their office for one year, except the Secretary/Treasurer who shall hold office for three years or until their successors have been elected. The offices of president, first vice president, second vice president will be on a rotation basis from the six New England States (Maine, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Connecticut, and Vermont). The President, the First Vice President, Second Vice President and Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected by ballot at the Annual Meeting. A member shall be an active member in accordance with Article VII Section 1a when elected to office, except the Secretary/Treasurer may be an Honorary Life Member.

A candidate for election as a Director must be an active member in accordance with Article VII Section 1a and a resident of the particular state, which said Director, will represent. He shall be nominated and elected by the NEAFC members eligible to vote (five bugle Chief of Department (Active), and Honorary Life Chiefs) of that state. Directors shall serve for a term of three (3) years or until their successor is duly elected. The term of the Directors shall be that not more than one-third of the Directors are elected in any one year.

The State Director shall request an eligibility list of qualified voters from the Secretary/Treasurer prior to holding an election. The election of Directors will be at the respective states caucus held during the Annual Meeting/Conference with the results announced at the Annual Meeting.

All Active and honorary Life Members shall be eligible to vote for all elective offices.

ARTICLE IV - THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall consist of officers as provided by Article I and the past President who will serve as a member of the Board for one year. The exhibit chairperson shall be a non-voting member of the Board of Directors. The Board shall meet at such a time and place as may be

designated by the president. The actual expenses of the board, which includes travel at a mileage set by the Board of Directors each year, shall be paid by the corporation. Each member of the board shall have one vote, the holding of more than one office notwithstanding.

Section 2. The Past President, the First Vice President, and the Second Vice President shall constitute the Auditing Committee. The Auditing Committee will see that the books have been audited by an outside auditing firm each year before the annual meeting.

ARTICLE V - DUTIES

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the corporation, and the Board of Directors and shall be the official representative and spokesman of the Association. He shall call special meetings of the Board of Directors when so requested by the majority of the Board of Directors or whenever he deems such a meeting is necessary, provided that a minimum of a three day notice of said meeting shall be given and the reasons therefor. The President shall appoint all committees and appointees with the approval of the Board of Directors. Appointees as defined in Article X, Sections 1 and 2, may be an Honorary Life Member. He shall perform such other duties as may be incidental to the office.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the First Vice President to perform the duties of the President during his absence. He shall assist the President in conducting the business and policies of the Association and perform such other duties as prescribed by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall assist the President and First Vice President to perform the duties of their office and in the absence of the President and the First Vice President, assume all the duties and responsibilities of the President.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Secretary/Treasurer to keep a complete record of the proceedings of special and annual meetings of the corporation, the meetings of the Board of Directors; and the standing committees, of which he shall be an ex officio member; to receive and answer all communications pertaining to the corporation; cause to be prepared a full report of the proceedings of each annual meeting, which shall be printed and one or more copies, mailed by him to each member of the corporation. He shall receive all communications, contributed papers on topics, etc., designed to be presented to the meeting. He shall collect all monies due the corporation. Any committee collecting monies shall, no less than weekly, transmit said monies to the Secretary/Treasurer. The Secretary/Treasurer shall have the custody of the funds of the corporation; he shall keep a true account of all monies received and disbursed; pay all bills and at the Annual Meeting of the corporation and before all regular and special meetings make a full and correct report of the same. He shall also employ such assistance as he may need for the collection

of dues at the annual meeting and report the proceedings of the same and other such expenditures for clerical assistance at other times as may be approved by the Board of Directors. He shall execute a bond to the corporation in the sum of One million (\$1,000,000.00) dollars to be approved by the Board of Directors, the expense of procuring the same to be borne by the corporation. The consultant fee of the Secretary/Treasurer to be fixed annually at the meeting of the corporation and a pay schedule will be determined by the Board of Directors. He shall also perform such other duties as shall be assigned to him by the President and the Board of Directors. He or any other officer shall not assume an individual indebtedness exceeding One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars without the approval of the Board of Directors. He shall be sworn to the faithful performance of his duties upon taking office. The Secretary/Treasurer shall prepare for adoption by the Board of Directors a list of members eligible for Honorary Life Membership.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to transact all the business of the corporation during the time intervening between the annual meetings. They shall have the full power to expunge from the minutes before printing, anything, which is objectionable to the corporation or its members. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occurring by death or otherwise during the time from one annual meeting to another and the replacement shall be chosen from the state involved after conferring with the last President of the NEAFC from that state; and may vote by two thirds of the total number of Directors to remove any officer for cause. A quorum of five (5) Directors shall be required to transact any business. The Board of Directors shall have the power to make charitable donations, including memorial and sickness remembrances to members and their families, and other persons and communities, who suffer financial losses and hardships through death, sickness, injury, conflagration and catastrophes. The Board of Directors shall meet at least quarterly at a time, place, and date set by the President.

Section 6. The clerk of the corporation shall be the director from Massachusetts. The clerk shall perform the duties required under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for corporations.

ARTICLE VI - ANNUAL MEETING

Section 1. The annual meeting of the corporation shall be held each year in conjunction with the annual conference, at such date and place designated by the Board of Directors, notification of the site to be announced to the members of the corporation at the annual meeting. Proposals of sites for the annual meeting/conference shall be forwarded to the Secretary/Treasurer not less than sixty days prior to the start of the annual meeting/conference by a member of the association or a company or corporation in business for this purpose. Proposals shall describe the features of the site, amenities and services to be provided and the cost that would be applicable for the current year that the proposal was presented. The cost information is for comparison

purposes only. All site proposals shall be investigated by a site committee as appointed by the President. Proposed sites must be at a fully sprinklered facility and in compliance with state fire codes. This committee shall submit all information relative to the proposals to the Secretary/Treasurer for disposition as provided above.

- **Section 2.** A special meeting of the corporation may be called by the Board of Directors upon at least ten (10) days notice by mail to the members, said notice stating the time, place and purpose of said special meeting.
- **Section 3.** The exhibit hall and the apparatus display shall at all times be under the sole control of the Exhibit Committee under such rules as the Board of Directors may adopt.
- **Section 4.** A registration fee shall be charged every member registering at the annual meeting, the amount to be determined by the Board of Directors. A registration fee shall be charged every non-member registering at the annual meeting, the amount to be determined by the Board of Directors. Entrance to the exhibit hall or educational sessions will require a registration badge or a day pass.
- **Section 5.** The Board of Directors shall have full power to levy an assessment and collect from the members an amount sufficient to cover the entire expense of the annual meeting.
- **Section 6.** All proposed changes in the By Laws and/or resolution to be presented at the annual meeting of the corporation shall be forwarded to, the Secretary/Treasurer no later than February 15th. All proposals shall be sent to each member (in good standing) by mail, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the meeting. All proposals shall be posted in the vicinity of the registration area. A special meeting of the corporation shall be held on the first full day of the annual meeting/conference at which time the proposals shall be read. The proposals shall be voted on at the annual meeting/conference. A 2/3 vote of the members present and entitled to vote and voting shall be necessary for adoption. The membership by majority vote may request a secret ballot.
- **Section 7.** A portion of the Annual Conference shall be set apart for the holding of a memorial service in the memory of departed members at an appropriate time and setting as designated by the Association Chaplains and approved by the Board of Directors.
- **Section 8.** Nomination and election of officers shall be by secret ballot at the annual meeting/conference. All officers elected will be installed at the annual banquet and shall swear to the following oath of office: "I, (name) hereby swear that I will support the Constitution and By laws and at all times bear allegiance to the goals and purposes of the New England Association of Fire Chiefs, Inc. I further swear to perform the duties and responsibilities of my office to the best of my ability and at the end of my term of office, I will deliver to my successor all records of said office, so help me God."

Section 9. Reports of all committees will be presented at the annual meeting/conference. The Secretary/Treasurer shall prior to the next annual meeting/conference arrange for the distribution to all members the activities of the annual meeting/conference and meeting of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VII - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The membership shall consist of:

A. Active Members:

- (1) The Chief of the Fire Department of a regularly organized public fire department;
 - (2) Chief of a private Fire Department that provides municipal service;
 - (3) Chief of an industrial Fire Department;
 - (4) State Fire Marshal;
 - (5) Full time employed Fire Commissioners;
 - (6) Fire Directors;

B. Associate Members:

- (1) City or Town Officials, Fire Commissioners, Assistant or Deputy Chiefs or members of fire departments, individuals and individuals representing firms and corporations interested in the protection of life and property against fire.
- (2) Associate members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership in the corporation except the right to vote and as otherwise provided in these By-Laws.

C. Honorary Life Members:

(1) Honorary Life Members shall be entitled to vote on all matters. Honorary Life Members shall be entitled to all privileges of an active member except as otherwise provided in these By-Laws. Honorary Life Members shall not be required to pay annual dues; however, the Board of Directors may assess Honorary Life Members a fee to cover mailing costs. Honorary Life Membership may be conferred upon active members upon their retirement from office, provided they have been active members of the corporation or its predecessor, The New England Association of Fire Chiefs for a period of five years immediately preceding the date of their retirement, and provided further that they are not identified with fire protection from a commercial standpoint. Honorary Life membership will be withdrawn in the event the member becomes identified with fire protection from a commercial standpoint, but may be reinstated by making application to the corporation and receiving a positive vote at an annual meeting.

D. Life Membership:

- (1) Individuals, firms and corporations interested in protection of life and property against fire, shall be eligible for life membership upon payment of the fee established in the fee schedule. The Board of Directors may assess Life Members a fee to cover mailing cost.
- (2) Life Members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership in the corporation except the right to vote and as otherwise provided in these Bylaws.
- **Section 2.** No member who is in arrears for dues and assessments shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of the corporation, and any member who is in arrears on June 1st shall receive a second notice and if still in the arrears on August 1st he shall be dropped from membership.
- **Section 3.** Dues and Fees Schedule: Dues and fees for Active, Associate, Honorary Life, and Life Members shall be set by the Board of Directors and voted on by the membership at the next annual meeting.
- **Section 4.** Application for all classes of membership shall be received by the Secretary/Treasurer. The proposed member has to be sponsored by a member in good standing with the corporation. The Secretary/Treasurer shall after investigation approve or disapprove the application except as otherwise provided in these By-Laws. If a question of eligibility arises, a decision to approve or disapprove shall be determined by the Board of Directors.
- **Section 5**. The Secretary/Treasurer shall not register or give a badge or extend any courtesies of the annual meeting to any member whose dues and assessments are not paid to date in full.
- **Section 6.** No member shall be expelled from the membership by vote of less than a majority of all members of the corporation, nor by a vote of less than three fourths (3/4) of the members present and voting on such expulsion.
- E. Special Honorary Life Membership maybe conferred by approval of the Board of Directors for Associate/Vendor members.

ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS OF BY-LAWS

Section 1. This corporation shall have full power at a meeting called for that purpose, to alter, amend or repeal these By Laws, but the same shall not be done except by a vote of two thirds (2/3) of the members present and entitled to vote at said meeting. The membership by majority vote can request a secret ballot. However, no such proposed amendment shall be considered that has not been read and posted as provided in Article VI, Section 6.

ARTICLE IX - RULES OF ORDER

- **Section 1.** The presiding officer shall preserve order and decorum. All questions of order shall be decided by him, subject to appeal by any member to the parliamentarian.
- **Section 2.** In a decision of any question coming before the annual meeting for which no provisions are made in the By Laws, the presiding officer shall be governed by the rules laid down in Robert's Rules of Order.
- **Section 3.** Every member, when he speaks or offers a motion, shall rise in his place, properly identify himself, and respectfully address the presiding officer and when finished shall resume his seat. He shall confine himself to the question under debate, avoid all improper personal references and indecorous language.
- **Section 4.** When two or more members shall rise to speak at the same time, the presiding officer shall decide who shall have the floor.
- **Section 5.** A member called to order by the presiding officer shall immediately cease speaking on the question before the house, and shall not resume his remarks until the question is settled.




